Second Reading - I Corinthians 11:23-26

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

I received from the Lord what I handed on to you, namely, that the Lord Jesus on the night in which he was betrayed took the bread, and after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after the supper, he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." Every time, then, you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes! This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

There were about five thousand men. Jesus said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of fifty or so." They followed his instructions and got them all seated. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, Jesus raised his eyes to heaven, pronounced a blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to his disciples for distribution to the crowd. They all ate until they had enough. What they had left, over and above, filled twelve baskets.

Homily - Bishop Kenneth J. Povish, Bishop of Lansing

Renewal of Commitment

(Fr. Wyszynski renews his commitment to priestly service on this occasion of his 25th anniversary of ordination.)

Bishop: My brother, today we celebrate the memory of the first eucharist, at which our Lord Jesus Christ shared with his apostles and with us his call to the priestly service of his Church. Now, in the presence of your bishop, your brother priests and God's holy people, are you ready to renew your own dedication to Christ as a priest of his new covenant?

Priest: I am.

Bishop: At your ordination you accepted the responsibilities of the priesthood out of love for the Lord Jesus and his Church. Are you resolved to unite yourself more closely to Christ and to try to become more like him by joyfully sacrificing your own pleasure and ambition to bring his peace and love to your brothers and sisters?

Priest: I am.

Bishop: Are you resolved to be a faithful minister of the mysteries of God, to celebrate the eucharist and the other liturgical services with sincere devotion?

Are you resolved to imitate Jesus Christ, the head and shepherd of the Church, by teaching the Christian faith without thinking of your own profit, solely for the well-being of the people you were sent to serve?

Priest: I am.

Bishop: (Then the bishop addresses the people.)

My brothers and sisters, pray for your priests. Ask the Lord to bless them with the fullness of his love, to help them be faithful ministers of Christ the High Priest, so that they will be able to lead you to him, the fountain of your salvation.

People: Lord Jesus Christ, hear us and answer our prayer.

Bishop: Pray also for me that despite my own unworthiness I may faithfully fulfil the office of apostle which Jesus Christ has entrusted to me. Pray that I may become more like our High Priest and Good Shepherd, the Teacher and Servant of all, and so be a genuine sign of Christ's loving presence among you.

People: Lord Jesus Christ, hear us and answer our prayer.

Bishop: May the Lord in his love keep you close to him always, and may he bring all of us, his priests and people, to eternal life.

People: Amen.

Profession of Faith

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,

of all that is seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light,

true God from true God,

begotten, not made, one in Being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

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



Father Darius W. Wyszynski, the eldest of four children of the late Chester and Genevieve Wyszynski, was born March 6, 1931 in Hamtramck, Michigan. He has two brothers, Chester and Raymond, and a sister, Justine Ditta.

He attended grade schools in Detroit, and St. Bonaventure High School in Sturtevant, Wisconsin. Upon graduation from St. Francis College in Burlington, Wisconsin, he entered Christ the King Seminary in West Chicago, Illinois.

Father Wyszynski was ordained to the Holy Priesthood June 7, 1958 at St. Raymond Cathedral, Joliet, Illinois. After completing post-graduate studies in Pastoral Theology he served as associate pastor in Wyandotte, Michigan for three years.

He came to the Diocese of Lansing in 1964 and served as associate pastor in parishes in Three Rivers, Jackson, Battle Creek and Flint. In 1971 he received his first Pastorate at St. Joseph Parish, Ypsilanti, Michigan. He was appointed pastor of St. Stanislaus Kostka Parish, Jackson in 1979.

AD MULTOS ANNOS FATHER WYSZYNSKI!

"Christ the Lord, being a priest forever, according to the order of Melchisedech, offered bread and wine." This antiphon at Vespers on the feast of Corpus Christi sets the theme for the celebration of the 25th Anniversary of Ordination to the Holy Priesthood of Father Wyszynski.

For 25 years Father Wyszynski has stood at God's altar as a priest, offering the Eucharistic sacrifice. Through his annointed hands we receive the Bread of Heaven. It is therefore fitting that on the day we celebrate the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we also celebrate Father's anniversary.

The Eucharist is the support and center of our Catholic lives. The various Eucharistic devotions, the receiving of Holy Communion, and the opportunities to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass are all part of Father Wyszynski's vocation as priest, serving the people of God in this parish.

Karl Rahner beautifully summarizes the role of a priest as follows:

"The priest is not an angel sent from heaven. He is a man chosen from among men, a member of the Church, a Christian.

Remaining man and Christian, he begins to speak to you the word of God.

This word is not his own. No, he comes to you because God has told him to proclaim God's word.

Perhaps he has not entirely understood it himself. Perhaps he adulterates it. But he believes, and despite his fears he knows that he must communicate God's word to you.

For must not some one of us say something about God, about eternal life, about the majesty of grace in our sanctified being; must not some one of us speak of sin, the judgement and the mercy of God?


So my dear friends, pray for him. Carry him so that he might be able to sustain others by bringing to them the mystery of God's love revealed in Christ Jesus." "Dear Father Wyszynski, may God grant you many years of health and strength to fulfill your role of priest."



PRAYER FOR PRIESTS

O almighty eternal God, look upon the face of your son, and for the love of him who is the eternal high priest, have pity on your priests. Remember, O most compassionate God, that they are but weak and frail human beings. Stir up in them the grace of their vocation which they received at the imposition of the bishop's hands. Keep them close to you, lest the enemy prevail against them, so that they may never do anything in the slightest degree unworthy of their sublime vacation.

O Jesus, I pray for your faithful and fervent priests; for your unfaithful and tepid priests; for your priests laboring at home or abroad in distant mission fields; for your tempted priests; for your lonely and desolate priests; for your young priests; for your dying priests; for the souls of your priests in purgatory. But above all I commend to you the priests dearest to me: the priest who baptized me; the priests who absolved me from my sins; the priests who celebrate the Masses I take part in, and who give me your body and blood in holy Communion; the priests who taught and instructed me, or helped and encouraged me; all the priests to whom I am indebted in any other way, particularly Father Wyszynski...O Jesus, keep them all close to your heart, and bless them abundantly in time and eternity. Amen.

O Lord Jesus Christ, strength of those who leave all things and follow you, raise up, we beg you, the vocations which the Church needs.
