Our Parish . . . 1919 - 1969

Reverend Stanislaus Bortnowski's
Administration — 1919 - 1932

August, 1919

Bishop Michael J. Gallagher appointed Father Stanislaus Bortnowski to establish a parish in the Trombly and Moran Streets area.

August 17, 1919

First Parish meeting was held at St. Stanislaus Parish Hall, at 3:30 P.M., and "Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary" was selected as the Patroness of the new parish and the First Parish Committee chosen: Frank Koldziejaski, Stanislaus Krych, Michael Ruchowiak, John Sitko and Edward Sitkowski.

November 19, 1919

A former grocery store on Moran at Dane Street was purchased for a temporary church. Father Bortnowski blessed it and offered the First Mass therein for the new community.

December 8, 1919

The Young Ladies' Sodality is organized. The First Prefect — Miss Stanislawa Lukowiak.

December 15, 1919

The Rosary Society is organized, First President — Mrs. Mary Krystyniak.

December 19, 1919

The Sacred Heart Society is organized. First President — Mrs. Lucja Lubinski.

January, 1920

Parish site was purchased at the corner of Moran and Trombly Streets at the cost of \$14,000.00. Construction of a combination — church and school building began.

September, 1920

Felician Sisters are entrusted the care of the school. FIRST SCHOOL REGISTRATION — Enrollment was: 124 boys, 125 girls. FIRST FACULTY: Sister Mary Joachim, Principal; Sister M. Annuncia, Sister M. Columba and Sister M. Edward. FIRST PARISH ORGANIST: Sister Mary Annuncia.

May, 1921

St. Stanislaus Society Gr. 426, Polish Roman Catholic Union of America, is organized, First President — Mr. Martin Kasprzyk.

June 6, 1922

Holy Name Society is organized.

September 20, 1922

Father Bortnowski blessed the Main Altar.

1924

The Catholic Order of Foresters, Ct. 1332 is founded with John Michowski as the First Chief Ranger.

1926

A third floor was added to the building to provide more classrooms.

April, 1927

Bishop Michael J. Gallagher approved the construction of a permanent church and Rectory to cost \$130,620.18.

January 9, 1928

Father Bortnowski blessed and broke ground for the New Permanent Church and Rectory. Father Stephen Trepczyn-

ski, pastor of St. Andrew's, Detroit, preached.

April 15, 1928

The Most Reverend Michael J. Gallagher, Bishop of Detroit, blessed and laid the cornerstone for the new buildings. The Right Reverend Monsignor Anthony A. Klowo, of Orchard Lake Seminary, gave the sermon.

August 26, 1928

Bishop Michael J. Gallagher solemnly blessed the new Church.

September 2, 1928

First Solemn High Mass of Thanksgiving is offered in the new Church by the Pastor, Father Stanislaus Bortnowski.

August, 1929

The Most Reverend Joseph C. Plagens, Auxiliary Bishop of Detroit, consecrated the newly imported marble altars from Italy.

General depression struck United States. Our Parish was deeply affected and found it very difficult to meet its obligations.

February, 1932

Father John V. Raczyński, Pastor of St. Helen's Parish, Wyandotte, Mich., is appointed the new Pastor of the Parish. Father Stanislaus Bortnowski is transferred to the pastorate of All Saints Parish, Flint, Michigan.

Reverend John V. Raczyński's Administration – 1932-1952

1936

Kindergarten is added to the school.

March 29, 1936

Father John Bonkowski, pastor of St. Florian's Church, Hamtramck, Michigan, blessed three new church bells, named: Joseph, John and Sigismund.

November, 1936

"Glos Niepokalanej" or the "Immaculata", a parish monthly, first appears.

1938

National Council of Catholic Women is organized. Mrs. Theophila Piechowski – First President.

1940

Through the efforts of Father John Raczyński, Mr. C.F. Williams, of the Western & Southern Life Insurance Company, cancelled a \$54,069.66 Parish debt, accumulated during the "Depression" years. The Parish begins a refreshing dawn of new life.

March 19, 1941

Father Maximilian Kamieniecki, assistant pastor, organizes the Altar Society. Mrs. Pauline Kozlowski becomes the First President.

1943

Catholic League for Religious Assistance to Poland is organized. First President is Mrs. Agnes Olechowski.

November 26, 1944

The Parish observes its Silver Jubilee. The Most Reverend Bishop Stephen S. Woznicki offered the Solemn Pontifical High Mass of Thanksgiving. The Right Reverend Monsignor Vincent Borkowicz, Dean of Our Deanery, preached the Jubilee sermon.

The Jubilee Committee: Honorary Chairman – Father John V. Raczyński; President – Ladislaus Cendrowski; Vice-President – Peter Garvin; Secretary – Chester Sawinski; Treasurer – Father Maximilian Kamieniecki. Directors: Mrs. Monica Krause; Mrs. Eleanor Swiatkowski; Mrs. Estelle Bank.

January, 1949

Parish debt is liquidated.

June, 1949

Father John Raczyński blesses and breaks ground for the new Convent.

August 28, 1949

Father John Raczynski blesses the Cornerstone for the new Convent.

October 5, 1950

The Most Reverend Bishop Alexander M. Zaleski, Auxiliary Bishop of Detroit, dedicates the Convent. Cost of construction \$119,980.00. Sister Mary Ubalda is superior.

April 29, 1952

Father John Raczynski is transferred to the Pastorate of St. Louis The King Parish, Detroit, Michigan, by His Eminence Edward Cardinal Mooney, Archbishop of Detroit. Father Alexander A. Cendrowski, Procurator - Treasurer of SS. Cyril and Methodius Seminary, Orchard Lake, Michigan, is appointed as the third Pastor of the Parish.

**Monsignor Cendrowski's Administration
1952 - 1969**

May 3, 1952

Father Alexander A. Cendrowski is canonically installed as the new Pastor by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Vincent Borkowicz, Dean of the Central Deanery.

July, 1952

The Church is redecorated by the Vincent Mondo Studios of New Haven, Conn. All church doors are replaced.

October, 1952

The National Council of Catholic Women is reorganized and begins to sew cancer pads. Mrs. Monica Krause, President.

November, 1952

Father Alexander A. Cendrowski organizes the St. Ann's Ladies' Club - Young Mothers' Club, to promote the welfare of our school. Mrs. Eleanor Swiatkowski, First President.

1953 - THE PARISH RENOVATION PROGRAM BEGINS

July, 1953

Three new confidential offices are added to the Rectory. Winches to control the heavy electrical fixtures in the church are installed. School improvement program begins - New lavatories and plumbing - Cost \$26,000.00.

May, 1954

Auto parking and children's playground rebuilt and blacktopped. Cost \$4,500.00.

June, 1954

New aluminum windows, stone and marble sills are installed in the school. Cost \$22,000.00. Church sacristies are rebuilt, cabinets installed.

Summer, 1955


All classrooms are modernized - new electrical construction - new chalkboards - acoustical ceilings - new oak doors and steel door frames in all rooms - fire cut-off doors installed - classroom program bell system installed - fire alarm system - permanent classroom partitions installed - new stairways and aluminum rails - thermostats - plumbing for new heating system - aluminum entrance doors - Cost \$43,362.00.

Summer, 1956

SCHOOL - new terrazzo stairway and aluminum balustrade - entrance reconstructed - concrete floor and vinyl-asbestos tile - clinic and principal's office built. Fire safety doors on the first floor. Cost \$23,340.00

October 19, 1957

Parish purchases corner property on Moran and Kanter Sts. Cost \$7,339.50. New side entrance to the church constructed. Cost \$964.00. Public address system installed in the church and hall. Cost \$2,119.00. Audio-Visual Department added to the school under the auspices of the St. Ann's Ladies' Club. Interior of the Rectory remodeled. Cost \$12,287.00.

1952

March, 1958

New confessionals constructed in the church. Cost \$4,283.00. New gas heating system installed in the church and hall. Cost \$7,158.00. New Organ console purchased and solemnly blessed by the Pastor, Father Alexander A. Cendrowski. Father Joseph Kubik, of the Orchard Lake Seminary Faculty, delivered the dedicatory sermon. Cost \$3,434.00. New kitchen built and furnished in the hall. Cost \$2,089.00.

March - April, 1959

New stair enclosure and new flooring in the school. Cost \$7,752.00. New steel lockers in the school. Cost \$4,203.00.

May 22, 1960

Soldiers' Memorial Monument and garden erected and dedicated by the Pastor, Father Alexander A. Cendrowski. Cost \$2,821.00. New garage and storage building constructed on Moran Street, adjacent to the Soldiers' Memorial Garden. Cost \$6,366.00.

1961

The Parish purchases the corner property at 3500 Trombly. Cost \$8,700.00. New Fire Alarm and Sprinkling Systems installed in the school. Cost \$8,152.00.

1962

Library is added to the school under the sponsorship of the St. Ann's Ladies' Club. Parapet Walls on the School Building are rebuilt. October 30, 1962 — Holy Name Society sponsors the first "Old Timers" Party under the direction of Father George Rajewski, Assistant Pastor.

1963

External renovation of the church: Façade of the church remodeled; New front entrance; fire doors; illumination; hand rails; walks. Cost \$26,277.00. Nuns receive their first automobile on July 11, through the efforts of Miss Dolores Kaczor, organist, United Choirs and the St. Ann's Ladies' Club.

1964 — Parish Sapphire Jubilee Year

May 31, 1964. "Immaculata Plaza" is erected and dedicated to the Blessed Virgin on the Eve of the Millennium of Poland's Christianity, in which celebration the Parish took a very active part.

The Plaza was blessed and dedicated by the Right Reverend Monsignor Anthony J. Kolanczyk, Archdiocesan Consultor, who also delivered the dedicatory sermon.

October 14th. The St. Ann's Ladies' Club initiates sewing instruction for our school girls.

November 1st. The Catholic Order of Foresters Ct. 1332 celebrates "Ruby Jubilee".

November 10th. New pew kneelers are installed in the church. Cost \$4,000.00.

November 29th. Vernacular is introduced at 9:00 and 12:00 Masses. First Mass in the Vernacular facing the congregation is offered by the Pastor, Father Alexander A. Cendrowski.

December 13th. The Young Ladies' Solidarity, The Rosary Society and The Sacred Heart Society celebrate "Sapphire Jubilee".

December 13th. The Parish Committee organizes its own "Parish Goodfellows". Mr. Edward Podsiadly, First President.

1965

Parish begins preparations for the observance of Poland's Millennium of Christianity. Father Alexander A. Cendrowski is the Archdiocesan Chairman and Mr. Frank Ostrowski is the Parish Chairman.

March 23rd. The Most Reverend Archbishop John F. Dearden, Archbishop of Detroit names Father Alexander Cendrowski Archdiocesan Consultor.

April 15th. The Internal Renovation of the church begins under the direction of F.W. Prue. It is completed in July. Cost \$9,638.00.

August 11th. His Holiness Pope Paul VI elevates Father Alexander A. Cendrowski to the dignity of the Right Reverend Monsignor.

October 3rd. Father Alexander A. Cendrowski is invested with the dignity of

the Right Reverend Monsignor by the Most Reverend Henry Donnelly at the Blessed Sacrament Cathedral.

October 10th. The Parish celebrates "Monsignor's Day" with Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving and Banquet. Mr. Frank Ostrowski is the Parish chairman and Mr. Wallace Walczak, co-chairman. The Rt. Reverend Monsignor Anthony J. Kolanczyk, Pastor of the Ascension Church, Warren, Michigan, delivered the bi-lingual sermons.

1966

January 1st. The Right Reverend Monsignor Alexander A. Cendrowski proclaims "The Millennium Year" through the various News Media.

Monsignor Cendrowski is appointed by the Most Reverend Archbishop John F. Dearden as a co-ordinator of the Archdiocesan Pilgrimage to Czestochowa, Poland.

May 3rd. Governor Romney of Michigan proclaims the "Millennium Year" for the State of Michigan, and officially presents the Document to our Pastor at the ceremonies at the State Capitol, Lansing, Michigan.

April - The Polish Government declines visas to the Archbishop of Detroit and the clergy. The Priests' Conference for Polish Affairs, chaired by Monsignor Cendrowski issues a very strong protest, which reverberated throughout the world.

March 19th. Altar Society celebrates Silver Jubilee.

May - New TV Educational Program introduced in the school under the sponsorship of the St. Ann's Ladies' Club. Cost \$3,600.00.

June - New side entrance to the Rectory built. Cost \$2,435.00.

August - Front parapet walls on the school rebuilt - new roof - walks around the school and convent. Cost \$9,381.00.

September 4th

Observance of Millennium of Poland's Christianity at Cobo Hall. The observance is chaired by our Pastor, Msgr. Cendrowski. The Parish is in the limelight. Over

two hundred parishioners participated in the Observance.

September 5th. Bishop Ladislaus Rubin, Cardinal Wyszynski's Delegate, visits the Parish, offers the Holy Mass of Thanksgiving and delivers Millennium sermon. November - The St. Theresa's Societies, Gr. 486 and Gr. 488 Z.P. celebrate Ruby Jubilee.

1967

March 5th. First School Board is organized: Mr. Frank Ostrowski - President; Sister M. Henrietta - Secretary; Board members: Mrs. Martha Knoblock; Mr. Stanley Stachelski; Mr. Stanley Golab; Mr. Edward Podsiadly and Msgr. Cendrowski.

March 5th

First P.T.A. Meeting. Mr. Edward Podsiadly, First President; Mrs. Evelyn Pisula, Secretary.

July

Teachers' Lounge is built; Library remodeled; New Gas Heating System is installed in the school. Cost \$12,322.00.

New side entrance to the church and rectory is constructed. Cost \$3,600.00. The School Board, because of economic conditions, decides to discontinue the Kindergarten as of September.

September


Preparations for the Archdiocesan Synod are made under the direction of Co-pastor Norbert Kendzierski. Mr. Boleslaus Darmetko, Jr. Lay Chairman.

October

The Parish Committee, because of lack of funds and high printing cost, decides to discontinue the publishing of the "Glos Niepokalanej" or the "Immaculata".

November 15th

St. Ann's Ladies' Club observes "Crystal Jubilee"

1936

December

Final issue of the "Glos Niepokalanej" appears. A weekly Bulletin serves in its stead.

1968

Preparations are made for the Observance of Golden Jubilee. The Executive Committee is chosen: Msgr. Alexander A. Cendrowski - Chairman; William Darometko, Sr. - Executive Chairman; Stanley Golab - Treasurer; Miss Jacqueline Koscielski - Secretary; Norman Mack; John Chmielewski; Mrs. Bernice Pokorski; Mrs. Josephine Jakubowski; Miss Anne Boik, Board Members.

January

Parish Bulletin appears in New Format.

March 6th

Charles Batozynski is the First Vietnam victim.

March 17th

Parish Visitation by Archbishop John F. Dearden.

March 23rd

Archbishop John F. Dearden re-appoints Msgr. Cendrowski as Archdiocesan Consultor for a three year term.

April

The Parish votes on Synod proposals.

June

Mr. Raymond Rusch is the First Parishioner to be awarded the "St. George" Medal for Scouting at the Blessed Sacrament Cathedral.

The Parish erects new "Golden Jubilee Shrine".

September

The course in sewing is discontinued, because of lack of interest among the girls. The sewing class equipment is sold.

October 12th

Walter Golembiewski, second Vietnam Victim.

December 16th

Plans to consolidate our school with that of St. John Evangelist are discussed.

January, 1969 — Golden Jubilee Year

January 1st, Golden Jubilee Banquet Tickets go on Sale.

January 5th: The Parish Council and the School Board vote to consolidate our school with St. John Evangelist.

February 4th: Father Norbert Kendzierski, our Co-Pastor, is transferred to Mary Magdalen, Melvindale, Michigan, Father John Tyminski replaces him.

February 14th: School Boards of Immaculate Conception and St. John Evangelist agree with the Archdiocesan authorities to consolidate both schools. The facilities of the Immaculate Conception School are to be used and the school is to be known as Marian Elementary School.

March 24th

Monsignor Cendrowski, Pastor of Immaculate Conception, and Father William Kearns, Pastor of St. John Evangelist, sign the School Contract, approved by John Cardinal Dearden, Archbishop of Detroit.

March 10th

Monsignor Cendrowski offers for the first time, Mass in a Private Home — Anna Ostrowski, 3384 Trombly.

June

Mr. William Moran is engaged as First Lay Principal of the Consolidated Marian Elementary School. Mrs. Evelyn Pisula, Mr. Stanley Stachelski and Mrs. Joseph Zawrotney are elected to the New School Board.

July

New Parish Council is formed in which Women take active part.


Były czasy, że prawie każda parafia posiadała tego rodzaju pisemko i jeszcze niektóre je nadal wydają, ale to, co się dzieje obecnie z "Głosem" jest prawie nieuniknione dla wszystkich, bo problemem są nie tylko koszty, ale też brak ludzi do pisania.

Pisemko to ukazywało się w polskim i angielskim języku, a więc rola jego była pełna, zwłaszcza w parafii polonijnej. Widocznie Prałat Cendrowski liczy jeszcze na jakiś cud, kiedy zamkając "Głos" mówi "Do Widzenia."

Niech parafianie sami ocenią, co stracili. Naprawdę dużo i coś wartościowego, zwłaszcza przed złotym jubileuszem parafii, który przypada w listopadzie przyszłego roku.

Przez 32 lata "Głos" był pisemkiem życia parafialnego i dobrze je obrazował. Przez 16 lat prowadził go po benedyktyńsku prałat Cendrowski, dla którego na pewno nie była to łatwa, ale w tym wypadku jedyna decyzja.







Our School

Our school faced condemnation and closure in 1952. State and local authorities were pressing Father Cendrowski to improve the facility through total modernization and to add educational equipment, or build a new school. The fact was simply this — the old facility was sadly out-moded. These authorities had permitted a "stay of execution", because of the financial burden carried by the parish. But, this burden was liquidated late in 1949 under the previous pastor Father John Raczynski and now the authorities wanted a definite decision by the new pastor.

Although directly ordered by the Chancery to build a new school for approximately \$400,000.00, Father Cendrowski felt that he could find a way to save the school for considerably less money. Plunging into a detailed study, Father Cendrowski demonstrated that the building was basically sound and could be economically remodeled. Furthermore, he proposed a "Master Plan" which called for the construction to take place in strategic stages so that classes would not be disrupted. This plan, spread out over four years could be accomplished without loans or special assessments. The Parish Committee and Cardinal Mooney saw the superior merits of this plan and heartily endorsed the project.

In July, 1953, the First Stage of this Plan was put into effect. The Moran Construction Company under the supervision of Mr. Andrew Zaglaniczny was commissioned to do the work and architectural plans were drawn by Walter Rozycki.

Their first work assignment was to convert the makeshift auditorium into modern lavatories, and to renovate the dingy basement lavatories into well lit and ventilated janitorial supply and work shop rooms. The cost of this stage was \$26,000.00, which included substituting ceramic tile and cinder blocks for the old wood construction. New and modern laundry equipment was also installed.


During the Spring of the following year, 11,000 sq. ft., next to the school, were paved at the cost of \$4,500.00. This space provided a school playground which had been lacking. In fact, the children had been using Trombly St. as a recess hour playground much to the consternation of our neighbors.

The Summer of 1954 saw Stage Two of the Plan unfold. The 92 wood frame windows were replaced with prism glass blocks and aluminum sash, and sills of stone and marble were added. This was more than a durable improvement, because it gave a strikingly modern appearance to the school. Such improvement was costly though . . . \$22,000.00 worth.

The Third Stage in 1955 was the most ambitious and it cost almost as much as the first Two Stages. (\$43,000.00) But, it provided new Chalk Boards, a Programmed Class Room and Bell System, a Fire Alarm System, new classroom doors, two new building exits, fire cut-off doors, acoustical ceiling tile, separate heat control thermostats and new electrical wiring. In addition the front entrance was given a clean functional look with the installation of full size aluminum doors.

The Final Stage of the Master Plan, costing \$23,000.00, was completed in the Summer of 1956. The old and narrow stairway was removed and the space was used for Administrative Offices. An exceedingly modern and beautiful center stairway was constructed, using steel, terrazzo and aluminum. The airness of this staircase plus the newly decorated corridors gave the school interior a final sparkling touch of newness.

The Plan was completed on schedule and within the budget. But, the Chicago School Fire disaster of 1958 brought new fire regulations into effect. These regulations forced an additional expenditure of \$12,000.00 for more fire doors, steel lockers and the enclosure of the stairway with fire-resisting materials.

Thus, after five years we had an approved School Building. The cost of \$127,000.00 was a bargain compared to a \$400,000.00 New School Building. It takes more time, work and planning to save \$273,000.00, but our parishioners can appreciate good business sense when it saves this much money.

The value of Parish Societies also cannot be underestimated in this project. These groups, namely, St. Ann's Ladies' Club, Rosary Society, Sacred Heart Society and the Young Ladies' Sodality helped to furnish the classrooms with much needed new equipment.

Thus, on September 16, 1956, our modernized school was solemnly blessed by the Right Reverend Monsignor Vincent Borkowicz, Dean of the Central Deanery.

The history of our school improvement didn't end in 1956. In 1960 a School Library was organized under the auspices of the St. Ann's Ladies' Club. This fine group also sponsored the installation of the Educational TV equipment at the cost of \$3,600.00, furnished technical equipment for the Audio-Visual Department, and in 1967 provided the necessary funds for the Teachers' Lounge furnishings.

Vatican II brought emphasis on Layman participation in parish affairs, so a School Board was established in June, 1967, to help set school policy and administration. The First Board was chosen on this basis: one member from the Parish Committee, one from the P.T.A. one from the St. Ann's Ladies' Club and two from the Parish at large. The Pastor and the School Principal completes this Board. The First School Board consisted of: Mr. Frank Ostrowski, President, Sister M. Henrietta, Secretary, Mr. Edward Podsiadly, Mr. Stanley Golab, Mr. Stanley Stachelski, Mrs. Martha Knoblock and the Right Reverend Monsignor Cendrowski.

One of the most difficult decisions made by the Board was to discontinue the Kindergarten in July, 1967, because of the high costs and a very serious drop in the enrollment.

We can pride ourselves on the modernized school facility, on dedicated teachers and on the Catholic school tradition which seems to be the best producer of good God fearing citizens. If our parishioners want an orderly and peaceful society, they will recognize that the best investment they can personally make is to fully support our School.

CRISIS

The Michigan Public School System for years has been plagued by very serious financial problems. The rising costs of school operation compelled some school districts to curtail their educational programs and in some instances there are possibilities of closing the schools.

The Parochial School System in the Archdiocese of Detroit in recent years too was confronted with similar serious financial problems. In many instances the school enrollments dropped off considerably and the shortage of religious teachers compelled every parish to engage lay teachers at much higher salaries than those of the Religious. The school operation costs soared to fantastic heights which drained the meager financial resources of parishes. Some parishes were faced with bankruptcy.

The financial situation at the Immaculate Conception School in 1968 became quite serious. It was obvious that no one parish could successfully operate a school. Our pastor Monsignor Cendrowski, a strong advocate of school consolidation, took positive steps to meet the challenge. The school survey showed that the parish could not operate the school beyond 1969. The projected costs were simply forbidden. But there should be a school in the Area. The children cannot be left without educational facilities. Since no one parish can support the school, then two or three should. The ultimate answer to a sensitive question was — consolidate the schools in the area.

This proposal was supported by the Archdiocesan School Office, and on December 16th the pastor and some School Board Members met with Sister Mary Catherine, Archdiocesan School Supervisor, and prepared a 'Presentation of the School Problem' for the Parish Council and the School Board. At the meeting of the full membership on January 5, 1969, the whole school problem fully reviewed and then the membership unanimously approved consolidation with St. John Evangelist School, which was experiencing similar problems.

Now, it was necessary to work out sound consolidation proposals. Our School Board met on January 16th and again on January 26th and formulated a series of proposals to be discussed at a joint meeting of both parish School Boards.

The pastors, namely Father William Kearns of St. John Evangelist, Monsignor Cendrowski of Immaculate Conception, the Principals Sister M. Rosetta of St. John Evangelist, Sister M. Henrietta and the School Boards of both parishes met with Father John Zwiers, Archdiocesan School Superintendent, and Sister M.

Catherine, School Supervisor, on February 14th at Immaculate Conception Rectory. The work on Contract contents for both parishes began. Two other meetings, one at St. John's Convent, and the other, at the Immaculate Conception Convent finalized the contents of the extensive contract.

A special committee, chosen by our Vicariate, inspected all area schools, and then reported at the General Vicariate Meeting that the Immaculate Conception School is one of the finest and should be maintained. This recommendation was adopted by the Vicariate. Since the school is to be operated for the children of the Area and supported by both parishes, it was thought wise to change its name. The suggested name "Marian Elementary School" was unanimously adopted.

The pastors, Monsignor Cendrowski and Father William Kearns, signed the contracts on March 24th and the Immaculate Conception School became Marian Elementary School. Yes, time takes its toll. After fifty years, it's no more Immaculate Conception, but Mary's name prevails.

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Nasz Kościół

“Jak miły przybytek Twój,
Panie Zastępów” (Ps. 83, 2)

Kościół nasz został wybudowany przez śp. Ks. Stanisława Bortnowskiego. Architektem był G. A. Mueller, murarskie

roboty wykonał Rufus Wendland, elektryczne Stanisław Ludwiczewski, cieselskie Stanisław Różycki, mechaniczne Firma American Plumbing & Heating. Wymalował kościół artysta malarz Wincenty Mondo. Styl budowy jest Nowoczesno-Romaneskowy.

W roku 1952 artysta malarz Wincenty Mondo odrestaurował wszystkie obrazy i malował kościół. Również nowy dach na kościół został położony i sprawiono nowe drzwi. Pięć lat później głośniki zainstalowano, przebudowano konfesjonały, zmieniono ogrzewanie na gaz i dano nowe klawisze do organu.

W roku 1963, frontowe schody zostały przebudowane, co nadało całej fasadzie modernistyczny wygląd i bezpieczniejszy dostęp do kościoła. Artysta F. M. Prue odmalował całe wnętrze kościoła. W ławkach dano nowe i wygodniejsze klęczniki. W myśl II Soboru Watykańskiego, pan Franciszek Ostrowski wykonał nowy ołtarz obrócony do ludzi i ambonę.


Pod kościołem znajduje się obszerna hala, która służy parafianom na różne posiedzenia i na inne parafialne imprezy.

Wnętrze kościoła robi imponujące wrażenie. Może pomieścić około 672 osób. Ołtarze, figury i obrazy podkreślają dwie cechy charakterystyczne, mianowicie, że jest to kościół Maryjny i polski.

Główny ołtarz, w stylu benedyktyńskim, sprowadzony z Włoch, jest poświęcony Niepokalanej Dziewicy, naszej Patronce. Jej piękna marmurowa statua dominuje nad sanktuarium. Po obu stronach figury dwóch Aniołów, podtrzymującego baldachim nad nią. Dwa duże obrazy po bokach przedstawiają Aniołów adorujących Najświętszy Sakrament. Nad głową figury, obraz przedstawia grupę aniołków podtrzymujących koronę, co oznacza, że Matka Boska jest Królową Nieba i Ziemi. Wyżej zaś na frontowej ścianie sanktuarium widzimy duży obraz Trójcy Przenajświętszej, która jest najważniejszą prawdą naszej wiary. Nad nim widzimy przejęcie Naj-

świętszej Ofiary Syna Bożego przez Ojca i Ducha Świętego. Na bocznych ścianach sanktuarium są wymalowane dwa obrazy: jeden Matki Boskiej Częstochowskiej, a drugi Matki Boskiej Ostrobramskiej. Te obrazy doskonale świadczą o wielkim nabożeństwie ludu polskiego do Matki Bożej.

Po stronie lekcji znajduje się boczny ołtarz poświęcony Św. Józefowi, dar Towarzystwa Różańca Św. Na bocznej ścianie nad oknami, mamy obrazy świętych polskich. I tak św. Jan Kenty, chluba Krakowa, profesor, wielki kaznodzieja i opiekun biednego ludu. Dalej św. Andrzej Bobola, Jezuita, męczennik za wiare na wschodzie Polski. Dwa następne obrazy przedstawiają patronów młodzieży, św. Kazimierza Królewicza, i św. Stanisława Kostkę.

Nad środkową nawą na suficie są trzy duże obrazy. Pierwszy to Zwiastowanie N. M. P. Syn Boży staje się człowiekiem, by człowiek mógł się stać Bogiem. W środku widzimy obraz Niepokalanej Dziewicy, którą lud polski czei w Godzinach. Ostatni obraz to Narodzenie Pana Jezusa. Tę prawdę poeta polski tak wyraził: "Jeśli wierzysz, że Jezus narodził się w Betlejemskim żłobie, biada ci, jeśli On nie narodzi się w tobie."

Po stronie Ewangelii znajduje się ołtarz Serca Pana Jezusa i jest darem Arcybractwa Serca Jezus. Nad oknami po tej stronie widzimy dalszych świętych polskich, św. Wojciech, męczennik, głosił Słowo Boże Polakom i poniósł śmierć gdy nawracał Prusaków. Św. Jacek, Dominikanin, który był gorliwym czcicielem Matki Bożej. Dalej Błogosławiony Wincenty Kadłubek, biskup Krakowski i historyk, oraz św. Józafat Kuncewicz, męczennik za jedność Kościoła. Pod chórem z tytułu jest kapliczka Matki Boskiej Nieustającej Pomocy, dar Towarzystwa Różańca św.

Nad chórem widnieje obraz św. Cecylii, patronki chóru. Poniżej obraz św. Floriana, patrona straży pożarnej i obraz św. Andrzeja Żurawka, pustelnika Benedyktynskiego w Karpatach. Jest to pierwszy polski święty kanonizowany w 1083 r. Na chórze również jest umieszczony duży obraz Matki Boskiej Częstochowskiej, dzieło artysty Józefa Staskowica. Ten obraz wisiał nad ołtarzem w Cobo Hall, gdy Polonia Detroicka obchodziła Tysiąclecie Chrztu Polski 4 września, 1966 r. Stowarzyszenie Kapelanów Polskich podarowało ten obraz parafii w dowód wdzięczności i uznania za nadzwyczajny udział parafii i jej proboszcza Ks. Prałata Aleksandra Cendrowskiego w obchodach Millenijnych.

Miedzy oknami w głównej nawie są wymalowane aniołki i symbole Maryjne, a na suficie bocznych ganków symbole Eucharystyczne jak, Kielich, Hostia, Winogrona, Baranek, itd.

Stacje Drogi Krzyżowej, rzeźba z darzewa, były sprowadzone z Włoch i są darem Arcybractwa Serca Jezus.

Witraże w oknach przedstawiają najważniejsze sceny z życia Pana Jezusa i Jego Matki. I tak po stronie lekcji widzimy Narodzenie Maryi. Dalej obraz Zwiastowania, Zaślubin z Józefem, Nawiedzenie i Narodzenie Pana Jezusa. Po stronie Ewangelii mamy następujące obrazy: Obrzezanie P. J., Hołd Trzech Króli, Dwunastoletni Jezus w Świątyni, Cud w Kanie, Zesłanie Ducha Św. i Wniebowzięcie.

Kościół nasz, to przede wszystkim mieszkanie Boga. Tu otrzymaliśmy to wszystko czym jesteśmy. I dla tego miejsca należy się jak największy szacunek i cześć.

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
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
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

The Immaculata Plaza



A legend persists among several of our "Old Timers" that the Blessed Mother appeared in a dream to a certain pious person, asking that our church be built on the present site of our "Immaculata Plaza". Of course, the supposed dream was ignored and instead a saloon was erected on that spot. Time has strange and circular routes.


After over fifty years, the owner Mrs. DeBeauclair had a buyer for the property. When she learned that a certain group wanted to make a "store-front" church of it, she approached Father Cendrowski and asked whether the parish would consider purchasing the property.

The Parish Committee at a special meeting on June 27, 1961, decided to purchase it for a sum of \$8,700.00. The property was old and poorly constructed and could not serve the parish, and so the building was demolished. At that time, however, no one knew what to do with this space, and so it remained vacant for want of inspirational advice.

This advice came with our parish's Sapphire Jubilee and the approaching observance of Poland's Millennium of Christianity. What a fitting use of that space — a testimonial to the Blessed Virgin would be, thought the parish leaders — She had guided Polish Christianity for a thousand years and our parish for forty five years.

Thus, in 1962, with the support of our societies the tribute to Mary began to be constructed. A beautiful base composed of nine different stones from nine sections of our country was fashioned to hold in full view a beautiful marble imported statue of the Immaculate Conception. William Zaglaniczny was the contractor.

On May 31, 1964, the Feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin, the Immaculata Plaza was dedicated by the Archdiocesan Consultor, Monsignor Anthony J. Kolanczyk. The ceremony attended by hundreds of our people and by Veterans of the Polish Army brought another significant event to public attention. For this was the first official dedication in the Country to honor Poland's Millennium. As such, this event received unusual newspaper coverage.

The dedication of this plaza to Mary and to Her guidance was not an empty gesture. For it signaled the start of the most active participation by any parish during the historical observance of Poland's Christianity.


Monsignor Cendrowski quickly led his people to a high appreciation of the true meaning of the Millennium. The Parish chairman Frank Ostrowski devoted many hours to constructing altars, picture frames and other articles. Father Kędzierski, our Co-pastor, directed the construction of the Cobo Hall sanctuary. The Sisters devoted many hours to prepare our children for the participation, and the women sewed Altar covers and Throne decorations for many weeks. Even our youth aided in transporting numerous articles to Cobo Hall.

The activity in the parish for the Millennium Observance was such that hardly any newspaper account failed to mention Immaculate Conception Parish when describing the Michigan observance of the Millennium. Our Pastor, Monsignor Cendrowski, was in fact named the Michigan chairman of the event. Over 200 parishioners who attended the Cobo Hall ceremonies attested to the apt description that this parish was the center of the memorable commemoration.

Such untiring efforts did not go unrecognized. On Monday, September 5, 1966, Cardinal Wyszyński's Delegate, The Most Reverend Bishop Stanislaus Rubin, visited the parish and offered a pontifical Mass of Thanksgiving in our church. This was truly an international honor for such an humble parish.

Secondly, the Priests' Conference For Polish Affairs voted to donate to the Parish the magnificently huge painting of our Mother of Czestochowa. This painting which graced Cobo Hall during the memorable ceremony was given to the Parish which was most likely to carry on the memory of Mary and the Millennium.

Thus, Mary returned to us Her undying testimony and made public recognition possible because this parish sought first to honor both Her and Her Son Jesus. Her inspirational advice came slowly and strangely for who would have dreamed 50 years ago that a saloon site would be the instrument for so much honor and reward.





Soldiers' Memorial



Eleven years ago there was not much concern over the Military Draft, combat fighting or heroism. The Korean War had ended some four years earlier and World War II was long forgotten. True, the United States had some military commitments in Vietnam, but the nation had momentarily lost its military memory.

The memory of our Parish's lost fighting men, however, was sustained by a curious turn of events. The owners of the old delapidated store and apartment house, at Moran and Kanter streets, had decided to sell this property. They approached Father Cendrowski and he quickly seized the offer. The purchase price of \$7,300.00 was worth the opportunity to enhance the neighborhood and the church by removing the run down building adjacent to the church.

It was then that Fr. Cendrowski realized that this vacant land actually was a reminder of the vacant memory for our lost fighting men. Thus architect Walter Rozycki was commissioned to design a befitting military memorial site.

The simple but elegant memorial portrays the main elements of Christian patriotism. The base of the Memorial depicts a huge flower vase from which unfolds 35 feet into the sky the "Old Glory", for which those whose names are inscribed on the plaque died. The Vase surrounded by a solid circle of evergreens, a wreath, is a symbol of our now unwavering memory. A simple stone cross denotes that they died for God. The statue of Immaculate Conception, the Patroness of the United States, stands in the background, attesting to the love of our Country these men displayed.

Sunday, May 22, 1960, saw the dedication of this Memorial by Father Cendrowski. He was assisted by the Veterans of the Pulaski Post, Szafran-Sarnowski V.F.W., General Haller's Veterans and their Auxiliaries.

The cost of the Memorial and landscaping was \$3,256.00, given by people who wished to perpetuate the memory of those who gave so much and asked for so little. The Moran Construction Company, directed by Mr. Andrew Zaglaniczny, constructed the Memorial and Earl Forbes landscaped the garden.

It is a fitting response to today's local hysteria to mention those men who in dignified silence gave their lives so that Freedom, as we know it, could continue to reign.

The Golden Jubilee Shrine

How things work out themselves in the course of time! Our Golden Jubilee Shrine came about that way. The school parapet walls grew weak with age, and needed reinforcement. Atop the school's main entrance, there stood a beautiful stone carving of the Immaculate Conception, Patroness of our Parish. It would have to go in the remodeling for the good of safety, advised Mr. William Zaglaniczny, the Contractor, and the City's Safety Engineering Department. It could tumble and injure or kill someone. That our Blessed Mother would have no part of.


To take it down would be a serious problem. Because of its weight, the contractor suggested that it be destroyed, rather than lowered to the ground level. We could not agree to that reasoning. After all, it was the first statue purchased by the Parish — it was our precious relic — it marked the building as the original church — it had tender memories. Then, it was a very special statue, for it was sculptured from one solid piece of stone and had its value. Alas, the statue was taken off the original spot and simply left on the roof.

There, it rested until September of 1967, when at the advice of Mr. William Zaglaniczny, a 150 foot boom was employed to take it off the roof, and placed on the side-drive of the rectory. There, it remained while we kept thinking and seeking suggestions as to what to do with it.

Then one day Monsignor Cendrowski himself got an idea. He thought to himself: 'The Parish Golden Jubilee is coming soon — let it become our Golden Jubilee Shrine piece'. So it became. In June of 1968, the statue was given its new and more permanent setting in an alcove overlooking the garden alongside the rectory. The plaque reading "Golden Jubilee 1919-1969" is a gift of the Joseph Pasek Family.

Thus, the memorable icon is now so clearly seen and continues to be an inspiration to people as they wend their way to church through Trombly Avenue — something that Mary's image could hardly do atop the school. For years to come may it recall the date of our Golden 1969 Jubilee and its historical place in the Parish history.

TOWARZYSTWA

Wobec nawału licznych potrzeb, potrzeba koniecznie siły skupiać, aby skutecznie pracować, a więc zawiązujemy różne towarzystwa przy parafiach. Wiele z nich długo się utrzymuje, ale też wiele upada. Główna przyczyna upadku to ta, na którą całą winę zwalają członkowie — "Starzy wymierają, a nowych członków mało wstępuje." Pewnie, że to najbliższy powód, ale nie najważniejszy. Bezzczynność zabija nasze towarzystwa. Czynnymi są urzędnicy i zaledwie kilku gorliwych członków, a większość zdawała się samym faktem "należenia," opłacania podatku i zapewnienia sobie jakiejś korzyści, jaka z kasy towarzystwa wypadnie w danej potrzebie. Należy więc gorliwie około tego baczyć, aby każdy członek zajął się wypełnieniem ustaw konstytucji istniejącej. Jeżeli zaś konstytucja ułożona przed laty nie daje zajęcia braterskiego członkom, trzeba koniecznie poczynić zmiany odpowiednie. Czasy się zmieniają, świat nie stoi na miejscu, wytwarzają się nowe okoliczności, potrzeby nowe powstają — to wszystko wymaga koniecznie rozsądnej zmiany. Jeżeli się tej zmiany nie przeprowadzi, to towarzystwa oparte na przestarzałej konstytucji zmarnią. — Wiele towarzystw parafialnych powstało w latach kiedy zakładało się parafie. Stosunki były zupełnie inne i dla tych stosunków układano konstytucje. Dziś zmieniło się wiele, a stara konstytucja pozostaje bez zmiany. Czasem też starzy członkowie patrzą na konstytucję jak na jakąś relikвиę lub zabytek przeszłości nietykalny. To czynią bardzo nie właściwie, bo wtenczas i ich towarzystwo wkrótce stanie się zabytkiem przesz-

łości, bez życia i zapisze się w kronice parafialnej, że "było" to towarzystwo, ale dziś już go nie ma. Z ostatnim członkiem zeszedł i towarzystwo do grobu.

Inny powód, od tamtego niezależny, to ten, że ustawy konstytucji dla wielu są tylko martwą literą. W konstytucjach towarzystw spotykamy nierzaz ustawy szlachetne, wzniósłe, miłosierne, ale co z tego, jeżeli członkowie ich nie przeczytali i nie zrozumieli. Czego nie znamy, tego nie kochamy i tego nie czynimy. Raz na rok nie byłoby za często wysuchać przemówienia na temat głównych ustaw konstytucji. Członkowie muszą się przejąć duchem ustaw i pojąć jasno, co ich łączy w towarzystwie.

Wreszcie poznawszy ustawy, trzeba je w życiu wprowadzić. Na tym punkcie spoczywa wielka odpowiedzialność na urzędnikach. Kiedy wielka liczba członków przechodzi na bierną stronę, grozi towarzystwu wielkie niebezpieczeństwo. Bierny członek podwójnie szkodzi: po pierwsze sam nie działa, a po drugie daje zły przykład obojętności i bezzczynności innym. Kto na każde zwołanie znajduje wymówkę i usuwa się od obowiązku, ten jest szkodnikiem dla towarzystwa. Trzeba zatem przyprowadzić go do porządku, zwrócić mu uwagę i naklonić do uległości powinnej dla ustaw towarzystwa. Od tego są urzędnicy. Urzędnik, który jest popularny kosztem niewypełnionych obowiązków, ten właśnie sam należy do obojętnych i więcej szkodzi towarzystwu aniżeli bierny członek. Zarząd musi być czynny i czujny. Tylko czynne towarzystwa odegrają wielką rolę. Bezzczynne pójdą w zapomnienie.
