## Christ The King Parish

The late Msgr. Joseph M. Tomikowski, pastor of Immaculate Conception Church, Indian Orchard, Mass. was the founder of Christ the King Church.

At the start of the 20th century, the Polish settlers of Ludlow became active members of the newly formed Immaculate Conception Parish. They contributed to its steady growth. As the Polish population increased, Msgr. Tomikowski deemed it feasible to separate his parish and set forth to organize a Mission Church in Ludlow.

The building plans were enthusiastically received by the parishioners on May 8, 1940. A large tract of land in the vicinity of Sewall, Center and Howard Streets was purchased and shortly thereafter, construction began.

The Christ the King Church was dedicated May 17, 1942 by the late Thomas M. O'Leary, Bishop of the Springfield Diocese. Religious services were held only on Sundays with the clergy from Immaculate Conception officiating.

On July 18, 1948 the parishioners of Ludlow welcomed their first pastor, Rev. John Mieczkowski. Thus was formed the Christ the King Parish with about 1300 members.

A two story dwelling on 21 Howard Street was secured to serve as a parish rectory. Fr. John labored zealously, ever mindful of the future needs of his people. In March 1951 he acquired the land adjacent to the church at the corner of Warsaw and Center Streets. Here he hoped to establish a parish center and rectory. In July 1952 he initiated a "Building Fund Collection", which raised a substantial sum of money. Fr. John was assisted by Rev. Sigmund Kwiatkowski, Rev. Marion Stanczyk, Rev. Robert Ceckowski, Rev. Richard Riendeau and Rev. W. Peter Piotrowski.

Poor health deprived Fr. John of starting this great project. After a lingering illness, he died on March 20, 1963. His work was continued by Fr. Peter Piotrowski, who was named administrator of the parish. He negotiated the purchase of the Graham property on Sewall Street.

On Sept. 23, 1963, before Bishop Weldon departing for the Vatican Council, appointed Fr. Xavier S. Baranowski the second pastor of Christ the King Parish. Fr. Baranowski accepted this challenge and with great determination carried on the expansion program of the parish. With dynamic energy and untiring efforts in behalf of his parishioners, he formulated the plans for the proposed social center, rectory and new sacristy. At the recommendation of Bishop Weldon, Fr. Baranowski acquired more land

from the Langevin property between Sewall and Center Streets, which was needed to straighten the boundary of the parish property. In 1967, due to the rising costs of building, Fr. Baranowski conducted a "Building Fund Drive" to augment the parish funds. The combined building funds equalled \$465,000.

After many months of hard work, study and consultation, Fr. Baranowski reached the fulfillment of his goal when Bishop Weldon allowed the building to begin on June 6, 1967. Vicar-General Walter Connell officiated at the ground breaking ceremonies on July 24, 1967.

The complex of new buildings was dedicated by Bishop Weldon on Sept. 29, 1968, the 20th anniversary of the parish. To complete the building project, a loan of \$333,000 was necessary.

The Social Center consists of an auditorium with a seating capacity of 750 persons. A spacious and well equipped kitchen provides ample room for food storage and preparation for social functions. The four classrooms are used for Confraternity classes.

The new rectory has accommodations for three priests, a guest and a housekeeper. Three offices on the first floor are available for parish business transactions and parishioner consultations. The lower level has two large rooms suitably used as classrooms and meeting rooms for small groups. A three car garage completes the rectory structure.

Fr. Baranowski was assisted in his endeavors by Rev. John Koonz, Rev. Eugene Ozimek, Rev. Conrad Daugiello, Rev. Stanley Szczypinski and Rev. Frederick Banas.

Sodalities associated with the church are: The Women's Rosary Sodality, Sacred Heart Sodality, St. Joseph's Sodality, Children of Mary and Young Ladies Sodality, St. Stanislaus Society, Christ the King Men's Society and the Holy Name Society, (now combined to form the Men's Guild of Christ the King) St. Anne's Sodality, Daughters of Christ the King, St. Cecilia's Choir, Knights of the Altar, Christ the King Athletic Association, the C.C.D. Executive Board, Christ the King Social Committee and the Parish Council. All serve in an advisory capacity.

Under the leadership of Fr. Baranowski, these groups are continually sponsoring social projects to defray the debt. With great pride and joy they are gradually achieving their goal.

As the town grew, so did the Parish of Christ the King. From a start of 1300 members, it now consists of 2600 active and loyal parishioners.

## Parafia Chrystusa Króla

S.P. Ks. Prałat Józef M. Tomikowski, proboszcz parafii Niepokalanego Poczęcia Najśw. Marii Panny, w Indian Orchard, Mass., był założycielem Parafii Chrystusa Króla w Ludlow, Mass. Na początku 20 wieku, Polska ludność która osiedliła się w Ludlow, należała do Parafii Niepokalanego Poczęcia Najśw. Marii Panny, i przyczyniła się do jej rozwoju. A że ludność Polska wzrastała w Ludlow, ś.p. ks. Prałat Tomikowski zadecydował utworzyć Polską misję dla Polskich ludzi w Ludlow. Z wielką radością ludność Polska przyjęła te postanowienie budowy kościoła 8 maja, 1940 roku. Zakupiono wielki obszar ziemi między ulicami Sewall, Center i Howard i budowa się rozpoczęła.

Kościół Chrystusa Króla był poświęcony 17go maja, 1942 roku przez ś.p. Ks. Biskupa Tomasza M. O'Leary, D.D., Ordynariusza Diecezji Springfieldzkiej. Nabożeństwa były odprawiane przez księży z parafii Niepokalanego Poczęcia tylko niedzielami.

Dnia 18go lipca, 1948 roku, wielka radość opanowała ludność Polską w Ludlow, kiedy ogłoszono że ś.p. Ks. Jan Mieczkowski był naznaczony jako pierwszy Proboszcz nowej Parafii Chrystusa Króla. Parafia wtedy liczyła 1300 parafian.

Zakupiono dom na 21 Howard ulicy na Plebanię. Ks. Jan ciężko pracował i gorliwie dla parafii, myśląc tylko o przyszłym rozwinięciu nowej parafii. W marcu 1951go roku, zakupił więcej ziemi, między kościołem i Center ulicy, mając na myśli że kiedyś tu postawi Salę i Plebanię. W tym celu, w lipcu 1952go roku, rozpoczął Fundusz Budowy, i zebrał poważną sumę pieniędzy. Niestety, słabe zdrowie nie pozwoliło by ks. Jan rozpoczął budowę. Po długiej chorobie, Ks. Jan zmarł 20go marca, 1963r.

Pomagali Ks. Mieczkowskemu w jego pracy: Ks. Zygmunt Kwiatkowski, Ks. Marjan Stańczyk, Ks. Robert Cieckowski, Ks. Ryszard Riendeau i Ks. Włodzimierz Piotr Piotrowski.

Pracę którą ś.p. Ks. Mieczkowski rozpoczął, dalej prowadził Ks. Włodzimierz Piotrowski który był naznaczony Administratorem. Ks. Piotrowski zakupił posiadłość państwa Graham, na Sewall ulicy. Tym kupnem zapewnił kompletną prywatność walej posiadłości Parafii.

Dnia 23go września, 1963r., zanim Ks. Biskup Weldon wyjechał na Sobor Watykański, Ks. Ksawery S. Baranowski był naznaczony jako drugi proboszcz parafii Chrystusa Króla. Ks. Baranowski z wielkim entuzjazmem podjął się do dalszego rozwinięcia parafii. Z wielką energią i nieustanną pracą dla dobra parafian, wykonał plany ś.p. Ks. Mieczkowskiego i wybudował wielką salę, nową Plebanię i nową Zakrystię do kościoła. Ks. Biskup Weldon, D.D. radził aby wyprostować naszą granicę, więc, zakupiono jeszcze więcej ziemi od Sewall ulicy do Center ulicy w roku 1966.. W tym czasie koszt budowy powiększał się, dlatego Ks. Baranowski urządził zbiórkę na budowę. Tak że, z funduszem uzbieranym przez Ks. Mieczkowskiego, gótówka na budowę dociągnęła do \$465,000.00.

Przez wielomiesięczną pracę i z ciągłą poradą Ks. Biskupa Weldaona, dnia 6go czerwca, 1967r. otrzymaliśmy pozwolenie przeprowadzić budowę. Budowa rozpoczęła się dnia 24go lipca, 1967r. z poświęceniem ziemi przez Wikariusza Generalnego, Ks. Infułata Walter C. Connell. Ks. Biskup Weldon poświęcił nasze nowe budynki dnia 29go września, 1968r., na 20stą rocznicę parafii. Na ukończenie budowy, pożyczliśmy \$333,000.00. Dziś z wielką chlubą i radością, parafianie spłacając dług z wiedzą że w tak krótki czas istnienia, taką wspaniałą mają posiadłość.

Nowa sala obsadzi 750 osób. Kuchnia jest obszerna z najnowszymi przyrządami do przygotowywania potraw.. Mamy także 4 klasy na naukę religii. Nowa plebania ma mieszkanie na trzech księży, na gościa lub misjonarza i na gospodynię, 3 biura na sprawy parafialne i drugie dwie klasy na dole plebanii które są używane na naukę religii i na zebrania. Garaż na 3 samochody uzupełnia komplet parafii Chrystusa Króla.

Ks. Baranowski miał do pomocy: Ks. Jana Koonz, Ks. Eugeniusza Ozimek, Ks. Konrada Daugielło, Ks. Stanisława Szczypinskiego i obecnie Ks. Frederyka Banas.

Towarzystwa które byli i które obecnie są połączone z parafią są: Bractwo Niewidzących Różanowych, Tow. św. Józefa, Dzieci Marii, Young Ladies Sodality, Tow. Męczenników Chrystusa Króla, Tow. Imienia Jezus, (ostatnie dwa towarzystwa dziś się połączły tworząc Gildę Męską Chrystusa Króla), Tow. św. Anny, Córki Chrystusa Króla, Chór św. Cecylji, Two. Ministrantów, Athletic Association, C.C.D. Executive Board, Christ the King Social Committee i Komitet Parafialny. Wszyscy, w jednym albo drugim sposobie, razem z Ks. Proboszczem na czele, prowadzą i rządzą parafią. Towarzystwa urządzały różnorodność by zniżyć i spłacić nasz dług jak najpierw. Tak jak miasto Ludlow rośnie, tak i parafia nasza. Dziś liczymy 2600 czynnych i wiernych parafian.







## *Christ the King Women's Rosary Sodality*

The Women's Rosary Sodality was organized August 15, 1948 by the late Rev. John Mieczkowski, first pastor of Christ the King Parish. Mrs. Josephine Hadro, a dedicated and zealous person was elected president and served in this capacity until her death in 1955.

The Sodality strives to foster among its members a fervent devotion to our Lady through the praying of the Rosary. Each year on August 15, The Feast of the Assumption, and on the second Tuesday of October, the members of the Sodality participate in a Solemn Mass and receive Communion in a body. At present, the 175 members participate in the Rosary devotions and pray the rosary daily.

During the years of its existence, the Sodality has contributed generously for worthwhile parish projects by sponsoring food sales, socials and banquets. Three \$100 Scholarship Awards were given in 1954, 1955, and 1956 to Cathedral High School graduates from our parish. Its most significant contribution was the furnishing of the office in the Parish Social Center.



## *Christ the King Sacred Heart Sodality*

The Sodality of the Sacred Heart was organized in 1948 by the late Rev. John Mieczkowski. In its first year it had 200 members, who concentrated their efforts on spiritual growth of the parishioners, material needs of the parish and charitable support of worthwhile causes.

Throughout its existence, the members manifested a special devotion to the Sacred Heart by participating in a Mass on the first Friday of each month and the Good Friday liturgical service. For many years they sponsored a pilgrimage to the Shrine of the Mercy of God in Stockbridge, Mass.

The Sodality sponsored socials and food sales for charitable and social causes. Their contributions furnished a patient's room in Ludlow Hospital, aided Fr. Luke in his mission work and purchased vestments for parish use. To sustain the young Christians who completed the CCD courses, each graduate was presented a St. Joseph Missal, which contained prayers and votive Masses of the liturgical year. Their most significant contribution was furnishing a CCD classroom in the parish social center. Their final donation of one thousand dollars was sent to educate the seminarians in the Phillipines and India.

Although presently the sodality is inactive, the

blessings of the past good works of the members are a source of inspiration to many who have experienced their generosity.





## *Christ the King St. Anne's Sodality*

St. Anne's Sodality of Christ the King Parish was organized October 18, 1960 by Rev. W. Peter Piotrowski during the pastorship of the late Rev. John Mieczkowski. The members include married women and girls of any age. At present there are 180 members. Mrs. Anna Trusz is president of the sodality since its origin.

The purpose of the sodality is to cultivate devotion to St. Anne in various forms. The members receive Communion in a body three times a year, participate in a Triduum to St. Anne in July which concludes with a candlelight procession, and for several years have sponsored a pilgrimage to St. Anne de Beaupre in Quebec. The Sodality remembers the deceased members and their families in times of sorrow by praying the rosary and attending the funeral. In April 1961 at the suggestion of Mrs. Trusz a decision was made that the stipend for a Solemn Requiem Funeral Mass for deceased members be taken from the sodality treasury.




In 1951, as a public act of devotion to our Lady, the Sodality under the guidance of Rev. Zigmund Kwiatkowski introduced the Coronation Ceremony, which is held annually on the first Sunday in May.

## *Christ the King Men's Guild*





## *Christ the King Confraternity of Christian Doctrine*



On August 20, 1952, a group of eight parishioners met with Rev. Zygmunt Kwiatkowski for the purpose of organizing the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine at Christ the King Parish. This group, consisting of Mary Makuch, (now deceased) Helen Bialka, Mary Szczygiel, Mrs. Genevieve Ziemian, Edward Zabawa, Theodore Muszynski, Mrs. Dorothy Pieczarka Lombardi and Walter Ziencina, met weekly thereafter and studied all the aspects of setting up such an organization, and consequently became the first Board of Directors.

The C.C.D. religion program for high school students was initiated formally in Sept. 1952. The first two sessions were held in the small parish hall beneath the church. By Oct. 1952, through the combined effort of all Catholic parishes of Ludlow, the Ludlow School Board gave the Confraternity permission to use the facilities of the Junior High School on Chestnut Street. Students from Christ the King Parish attended the religion classes at this location until the new parish center was completed in 1968. The C.C.D. also sponsored religion classes for the elementary grade students on Saturday mornings. Classes were staggered to accommodate all students in the limited space of the small hall beneath the church and the church proper. From 1954 to 1958 the C.C.D. through the generosity of Dr. Edward Dill and Dr. Stefan Ziemian, offered \$100 Scholarship Awards to the most deserving boy and girl graduate. At present, this award is offered by Rev. Xavier Baranowski to the student of highest scholastic rank.

During the regular meetings, the members were exposed to the sublime truths of the Catholic faith for personal sanctification. The Confraternity sponsored other functions to balance the total development of its members; mainly: A Junior Newman Club for high school students, Labor-Management classes in conjunction with local industries and labor unions. The Confraternity also planned

and ran many social events, such as the Christmas party and record hops for the students. During Catholic Press Month the Confraternity prepared informative and enjoyable displays at the Ludlow Savings Bank and Hubbard Memorial Library. It also maintains the pamphlet rack in the vestibule of the church. Other prominent activities include a Parent-Educator committee that makes personal contacts with new parents. A Discussion Club guided by a member of the clergy enabled the members to share and broaden their personal convictions, reactions, and enthusiasm on various religious topics and moral problems.

Presently the C.C.D. program under the leadership of Robert Gove is academically structured to follow the guidelines recommended by the Second Vatican Council. The primary goal of the Confraternity is to form strong christians and loyal Catholics. Contemporary approaches which parallel the students' normal development of maturity are used. To provide for continuous progress, student records and evaluations have been introduced. The Confraternity leaders concentrate on the students' spiritual needs of today and attempt to prepare him better for the spiritual needs and struggles of tomorrow.

## Ludlow Polish Womens Citizens Club History

The Ludlow Polish Women's Citizens' Club was organized on October 28, 1930. Mrs. Joseph Sarad was the first president of the group whose aims were two-fold: Aiding non-citizens in becoming American citizens; and taking part in civic and charitable projects.

A resume of the club's forty-two year history shows a record of great achievement in the many projects undertaken through the years.

The club has donated two statues to the Church of Christ the King, and has contributed to its building fund. The Ludlow Hospital received contributions toward surgical instruments; and two rooms in the new Ludlow Hospital were equipped by contributions from the club.

During the war years members did sewing and knitting for the American Red Cross; took part in fund raising and bond drives, and many other civilian defense activities. Poland's war victims were aided with shipments of medicine, food and clothing.

A contribution was made to the building fund of the new Polish American Citizens' Clubrooms. And as conditions warrant, donations are also made to the various annual fund drives, such as, the Heart Fund, Cancer Drive, the Missions, and the Hyde Park Orphanage in Boston.

The club has been an active member of the Polish American Congress-Western Massachusetts Branch, the Massachusetts Federation of Polish Women's Clubs, and the Tri-Town Scholarship Association, which comprises of the towns of Ludlow, Wilbraham and Indian Orchard.

Other past activities of the club include participation in local and out of town parades, Memorial Day services, excursions to the United Nations Building in New York City, Roosevelt's Home in Hyde Park, New York; concerts of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, pianist Witold Malczynski, and the Boston Krakowiak Dance group; Federation Fashion Shows and Exhibits at the Boston Public Library; and a trip to the National Shrine to Our Lady of Czestochowa at Doylestown, Pennsylvania.

Through the years, six Ludlow girls whose families were connected with the Club, have been recipients of the Federation scholarships awarded for college and graduate school level. Ludlow recipients have been the Misses Mary Bocon, Irene Tenerowicz, Wilhemina Pianowski, Elizabeth Lemek, Rosemary Barszcz, and Elaine Frydryk.

The year 1960 was a busy one for the Ludlow Polish Women's Club when it joined with other Ludlow Polish groups, and the Christ the King Parish, in the observance of Poland's Millennium and Poland's embracing of Christianity. Sponsored by the Western Massachusetts Division of the Polish American Congress, the observance activities centered in Springfield and included a Pageant at Cathedral High School, the publication of a souvenir program book, Te Deum Services at St. Michael's Cathedral, a banquet at the Sheraton-Kimball, and a gigantic parade featuring 24 bands, 20 floats and 6000 marchers. The Ludlow High School Band and Majorettes, with Mr. Al Strohman directing, led the Ludlow contingent which included along with the Polish Organizations, the Ludlow Board of Selectmen, Police and Fire Departments, Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts, and the Veterans of Foreign Wars organization.

Ludlow's Float depicted a sad fragment of Polish history: That of Poland enslaved.

Most Rev. Christopher J. Weldon, Bishop of Springfield, and Rt. Rev. Msgr. John A. Wieloch of Indian-Orchard, were honorary chairmen of the area committee, and Rev. John Mieczkowski, Pastor of Christ the King Church, was honorary chairman of the Ludlow committee, which was composed of representatives of all church and civic groups. Local co-chairmen were Mrs. Stanley Zielinski and Mr. Paul Nowak; recording secretary, Mrs. Bronislaus Szlosek; treasurer, Mr. Stanley Slosek; publicity, Miss Mary Szczygiel; Co-chairmen of the Float committee, Mrs. Andrew Kawecki and Mr. Walter Nowak, with Rev. Richard Riendeau serving as Art Adviser.






