God has blessed us through the years and we are sincerely grateful for His providential care over us as individuals, as families and as a parish community.



Rzadko się zdarza, aby wiec polityczny dał początek parafii katolickiej. Zdarzyło się to jednak w miejscowości Salamanca. Do miasteczka, gdzie mieszkała spora gromadka Polaków, przybył w 1892 p. Jakub Rożan z mową polityczną. Rodacy skarżyli się na brak polskiej parafii w Salamanca i na wysokie opłaty do irlandzkiej parafii św. Patrycjusza.

Kilka dni później ks. Pitass towarzyszył panu Rożanowi do Salamanca, gdzie zakupiono ziemię pod przyszły kościół z funduszu zebranego przez Polaków w tym mieście. W grudniu 1892 roku otrzymali pozwolenie od Biskupa Stephen Ryan na budowę kościoła a 19 grudnia tegoż roku na zebraniu parafialnym wyznaczono komitety, które miały się zająć zbiórką funduszów. Ks. Piotr Basinski został pierwszym proboszczem. Około dziewięćdziesiąt rodzin zapisało się do nowej parafii.



Dnia 1 lipca 1915 roku ks. Wojciech Cichy naznaczony został proboszczem. Podczas jego pasterzowania, z początkiem 1923 roku, powzięto decyzję budowy nowego kościoła w miejscu, gdzie stała szkoła i dom sióstr. Budynek szkolny został posuniety za kościół, a dom sióstr sprzedano i usunięto.

W dniu 10 września 1961 ks. Władysław Garstka przybył do parafii.

In the early 19th century, Europeans flocked to the New World, seeking the promise of "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." Included among these immigrants were thousands of Polish people. Desiring to maintain their national traditions in the religion, as well as in their lives, they organized, across the country, hundreds of Polish Roman Catholic Churches. In 1893, Salamanca saw the establishment of such a church,—Holy Cross.

The corner stone of the first Holy Cross Roman Catholic Church on Broad St. was laid Sunday afternoon September 3, 1893 at 1:30 p.m. The Citizens Band headed a welcoming committee that marched to the depot to meet the priests and a number of Polish people from Buffalo. Later a procession was formed in front of St. Patrick's Church on River St. and marched to the site of the new church. Father Basinski, the resident pastor, was assisted in the ceremonies by the Rev. Father Pitas, pastor of St. Stanislaus Church in Buffalo, a French-Polish priest from the same place, and by the Rev. M. P. Berkerv, pastor of St. Patrick's Church.


Among the founders of the original church were John R. Kubinski, Julius Nadolski, Michael Pilarski, and the Ambuski's, the Zaprowski's, and the Mackowiak's.



Issues Personal Plea:

Priest Here Urges Speedy End of War

In a personal plea today, the Rev. Constantine Kwiatkowski called for a speedy end to the war in Vietnam, which he called a "deep, massive, personal, human tragedy."

Emphasizing that he was speaking for himself—not as a priest nor as pastor of Holy Cross Roman Catholic Church—Father Kwiatkowski called on the people of Salamanca to take "peaceful, positive, constructive steps" that "these and other evils that continue to result from this conflict will soon be ended."

Noting the announcement this week of two Salamanca casualties in the war in Cambodia, the priest declared: "The best way to rave our most precious stake in Vietnam—the lives of our soldiers—is to stop the war. A military victory is not in sight and it probably will never come."

"I express these views as my own," Father Kwiatkowski said in issuing the statement. "I am speaking for myself—as a citizen of this great country, not as a Catholic priest or as pastor of Holy Cross Church."

The text of his statement fol-

"Just a few days ago the City of Salamanca was greatly shocked when the names of Salamanca's two casualties in the was in Cambodia were announced."

"At a time when the voices of so many of our people are raised in a cry of mourning for Cpl. Keith K. Franklin and Staff Sgt. Arnold Lee Robbins and all our war dead and of longing for peace in our day, I ask all of my fellow citizens to lift up their minds and hearts in prayer that God may guide our leaders and all our fellow citizens to find a way to a speedy and honorable end of the Vietnam war and to a true and lasting peace."

"All of us are keenly conscious that this war has already lasted longer than any other in the history of our country; that many thousands of our young men have been killed and more have been horribly wounded; that the struggle has led to deep frustration, great confusion and harmful division in this country."

"It is my sincere prayer and hope that all the people of Salamanca take peaceful, positive, constructive steps that these and other evils that continue to result from this conflict will soon be ended."

"Nothing will bring back those who died. There is no need, however, for others to be sent to their death. The best way to save our most precious stake in Vietnam—the lives of our soldiers—is to stop the war. A military victory is not in sight and it probable will never come."

Priest helps nab pair in church theft

Salamanca police reported today the apprehension of two youths in connection with a theft late Sunday afternoon at the Holy Cross Church, 284 Broad St.

The two were nabbed, with the help of the Rev. Constantine Kwiatkowski, in connection with the theft of \$11 from the St. Vincent De Paul poor box at the rear of the church and a microphone from the altar, valued at about \$60

The two youths apparently tried to return to the church late Tuesday afternoon and break in the front door, when they were spotted by a parishioner who phoned Father Kwiatkowski with a "vivid description."

Later that day, the priest spotted the two boys walking along the street while he was driving his car. He said he stopped to talk to them, approaching them with "kindness and love" and persuaded them to confess to the thefts.

A nearby resident phoned police, who came to apprehend the pair. They will be petititioned to family court.

Police also said that all of the stolen property was recovered and returned to the church.


Dinner-Bazaar nets \$2,685 for carpet fund
















A-spiring to the sky

Building That Housed First Holy Cross Church is Being Razed; Was Built in 1893

Completed in 1893 and used for some thirty-one years before being replaced by a larger and modern structure, the first Holy Cross R.C. Church on Broad St. is being razed.

Demolition of the former wooden church building, which is "beyond repair and of no use to the parish", was decided by unanimous vote of the church trustees and members of the parish lay council, the Rev. Constantine Kwiatkowski, pastor, said today.

After their decision, members of the parish were given two months to voice an objection, but "not a one was received", said Father Kwiatkowski.

Razing of the building just east of the present brick Holy Cross Church is expected to be completed this week by Work & Silvis Co., Inc. of Allegany.

The area now being cleared will be used to increase parking space for persons attending Masses.

Present plans call for the added space to be blacktopped next September after gravel, with which the basement of the former church is to be filled, is allowed to settle for a year.

Formal laying of the cornerstone of the 77-year-old former church building was conducted on Sunday, Sept. 3, 1893 at 1:30 p.m. according to a history of the parish. The church was completed in December 1893.


A "citizens' band" headed a welcoming committee which marched to the "depot" to meet a group of Buffalo priests and other persons who came here by train for the cornerstone laying, the parish history states. A procession was formed in front of St. Patrick's

Church and marched to the site of the new church.


By 1923, the Holy Cross parish had grown so large that it was decided to construct a new and larger church.

The present brick church with its modern, sparkling interior was formally dedicated Sept. 28, 1924 and has been in use ever since.

The former wooden church building was used for parish activities, including the annual dinner, until the Holy Cross Athletic Club moved into its new headquarters on Clinton St. in the fall of 1954. Men's and women's parish activities mow are held at the club, where complete and modern facilities are available. Previously, the athletic club was located upstairs at 11 Main St. starting in 1936.



HOLY CROSS SCHOOL, 1906-1968

Holy Cross Parochial school saw its beginning in the year 1906. Classes were first conducted in a large building on Broad Street, to the right of the church. Teaching them were the Felician sisters.

The first school session began in September 1906, with an enrollment of 150 pupils. The nuns who filled teaching posts were Sister M. Cazmaerine, superior, Sister M. Christine, and Sister M. Mary. Previous lay teachers included Miss Parkell, Mr. Sienkiewicz, organist and Polish teacher, Mr. Nowecki and Mr. Gasiewski.


Then, in 1924, after completion of the new church building, the school was transferred to the basement area of the church. The new school included six school rooms, each of which could accommodate 50 children, an office, janitor's quarters and a meeting room for the various parish for the various parish organizations. In later years, school improvements were made. Included were: painting classrooms; installing new desks; renovation of the lunch room; and the purchase of audio-visual aids as well.



Studies are being made for merging the 80 children of Holy Cross with those of St. Patrick's. If the two schools did merge in the future, the resulting school would be called "The Salamanca Catholic Elementary School." This would form on elementary school for all Catholic students in the city. Facilities at Holy Cross might conceivably be used for religious education of high school students under the release time program.
