History of the Polish Daily News

1904 - 1914

The Polish Daily News gained confidence of the Polish immigrants, as well as of the old Polish residents; it became their voice and representative; it took the role of the interpreter of American ways, culture and ideals to the new arrivals, and inspired them to loyalty and attachment to their adopted Country.

1914 - 1918

Always continuing the work among the Polish people, the paper now had a new duty: that of presenting to the old immigrants and the new Americans, the rebirth of their homeland, and with the aid of America and Americans, help Poland in her resurrection and rehabilitation.

1918 - 1939

The Polish Daily News now considered its goal the instilling into its readers the ideals of justice and honor and loyalty — all American principles, and all readily understood and appreciated gratefully by the new arrivals and new citizens. Furthermore, the paper considered it its most sacred duty to impress upon the younger generation the need for advanced education, and upon their parents, as well as their children, the glories of the new opportunities, which need not replace the ancient culture and beautiful traditions of their homeland, and explained to them how these might be fused for the glory of the future.

1939 - 1944

When Poland first of all, and then the World, became a victim of mad aggressors, when totalitarian tyranny threatened the Earth, the Polish Daily News devoted all its energies to the defense of Freedom and Democracy. At the beginning of the war, the paper implored for assistance to Poland, at the same time fervently urging America to arm and warning her of the impending danger.

It cooperates unceasingly and with tireless enthusiasm in every relief project, it donates and solicits funds for the victims of war.

The paper has come to the realization that it is not only the voice of the people, but its pulse and its hearts, beating under guiding and protecting leadership.

It has also come to realize, from facts and figures collected, that the Americans of Polish descent have supplied the largest percentage of any in volunteers to the United States Army; that the Americans of Polish descent constitute the largest group of workers in the war industries; and that they rank the first among the nationality groups in the purchase of War Bonds, which they proudly keep in their possession.

The Poles in America already gave over 600,000 to the Armed Forces; they willingly give their efforts, blood and their lives to these honored and beloved United States, their adopted Country, and they are ever true to the principles dear to the heart and honor of every true American, which the Polish Daily News has ever inspired and re-echoed through its pages.
