After serving in various assistant posts of the diocese, Cardinal Mooney appointed and commissioned him to organize the new parish of Saint Albert the Great.

TRINITY SUNDAY "In the name of the Father,

It is common knowledge that most people believe in a God, the first person of the Holy Trinity. Jesus, the second person, proved that he is God by many miracles, especially by His resurrection from the dead. the Holy Spirit demonstrated his divine power on Pentecost, and has done so many times since then through the Church.
