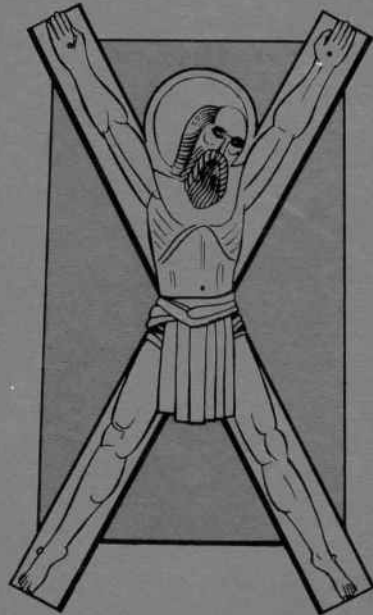

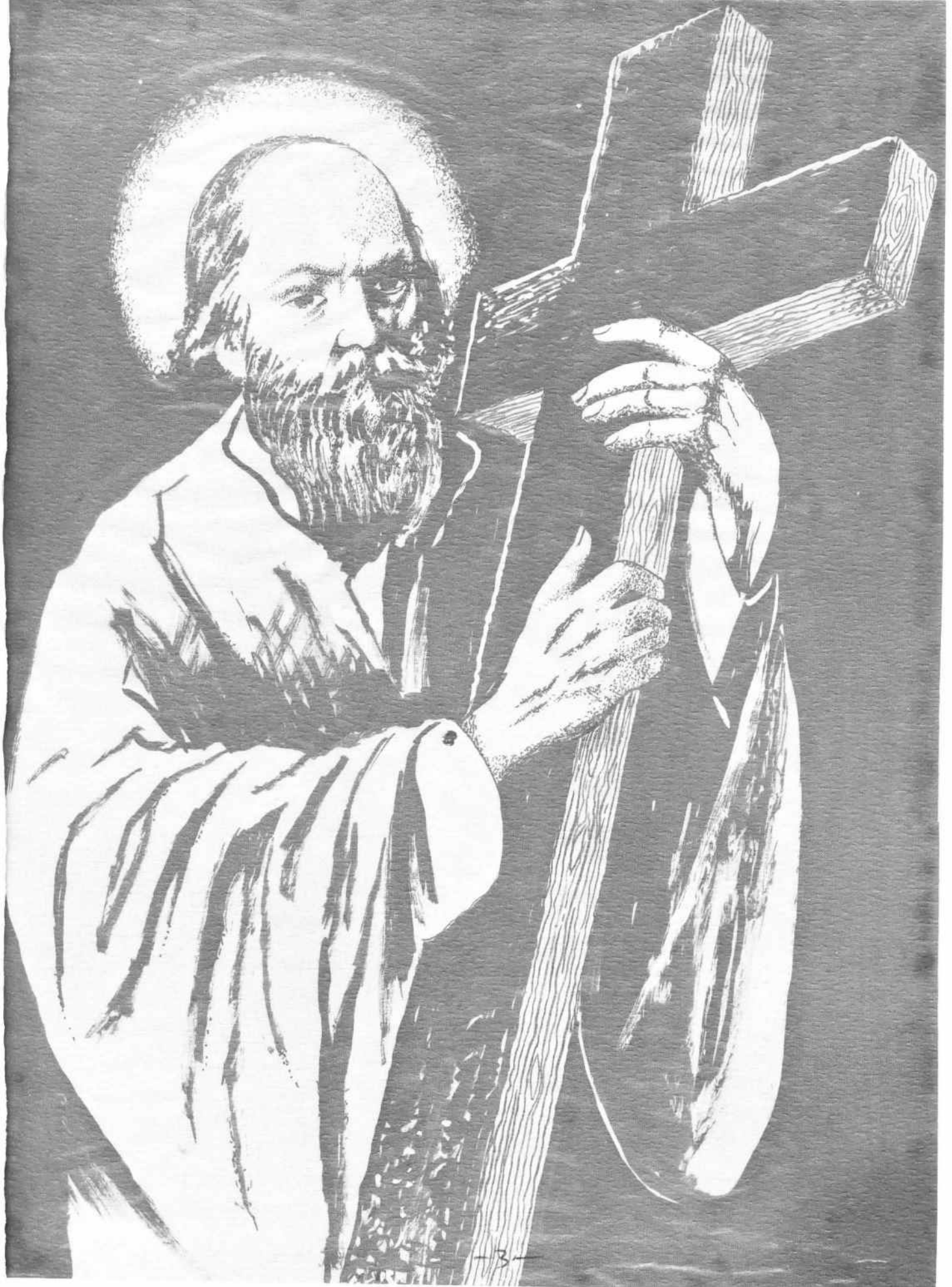

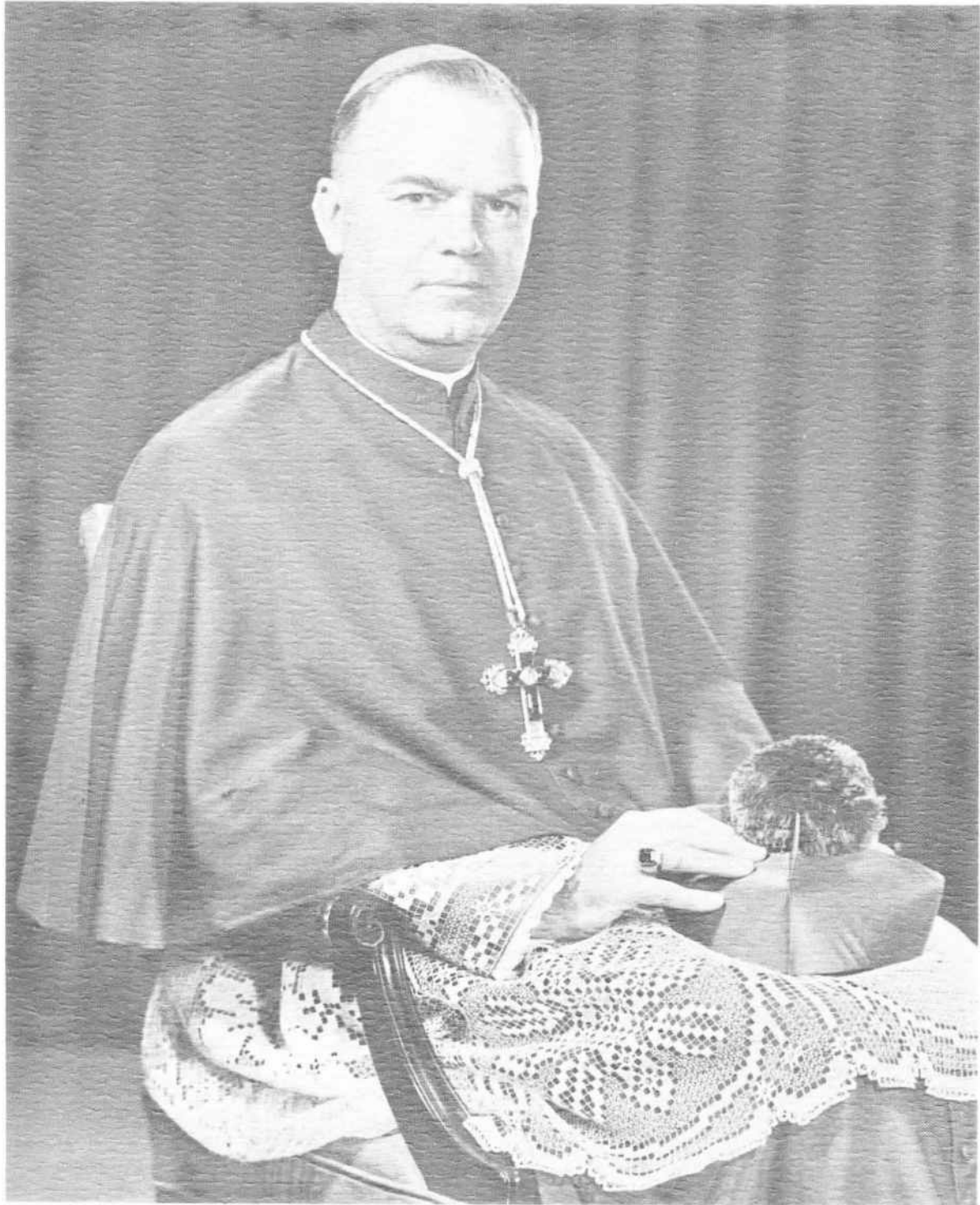
NASZ ZŁOTY JUBILEUSZ

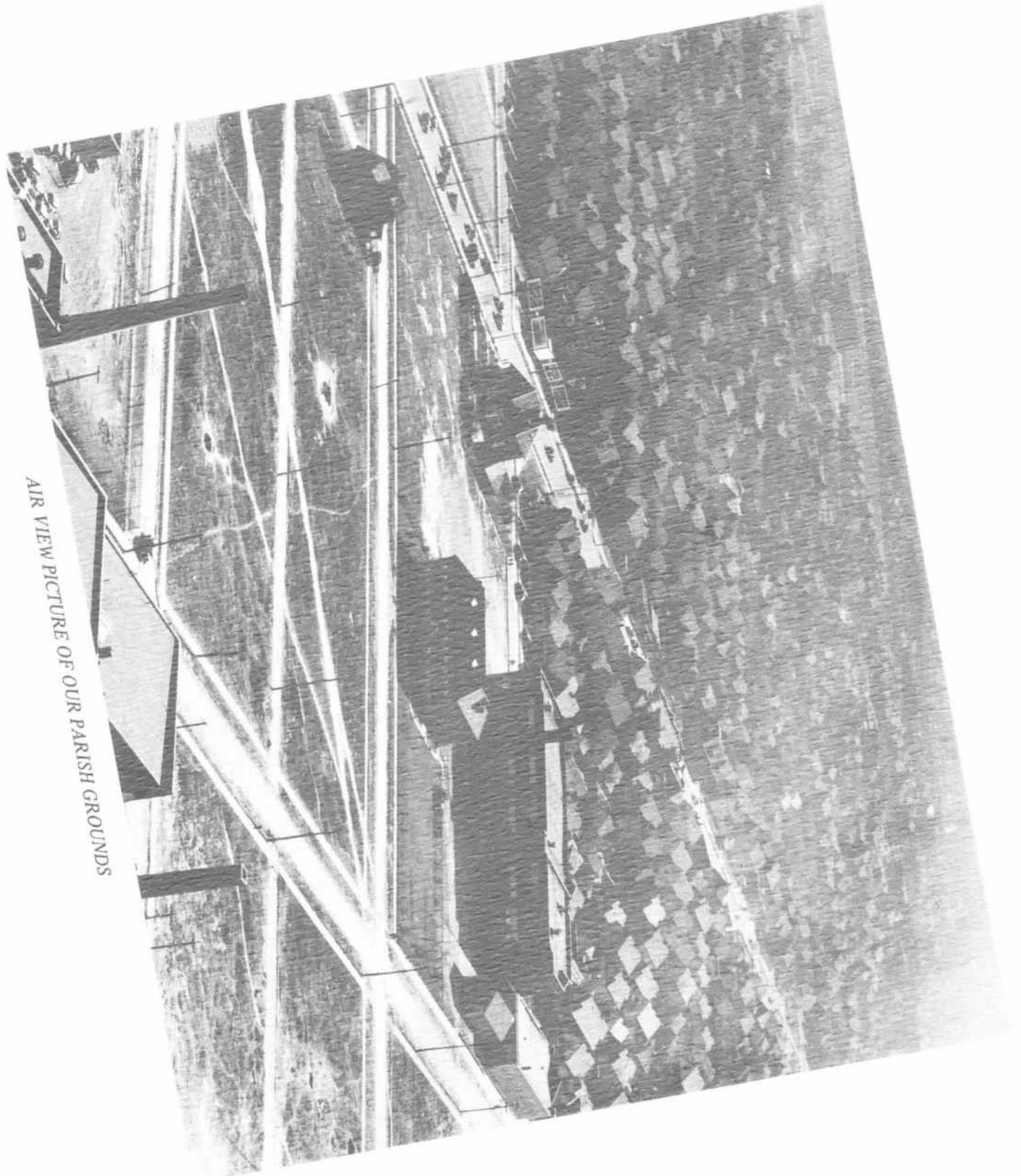



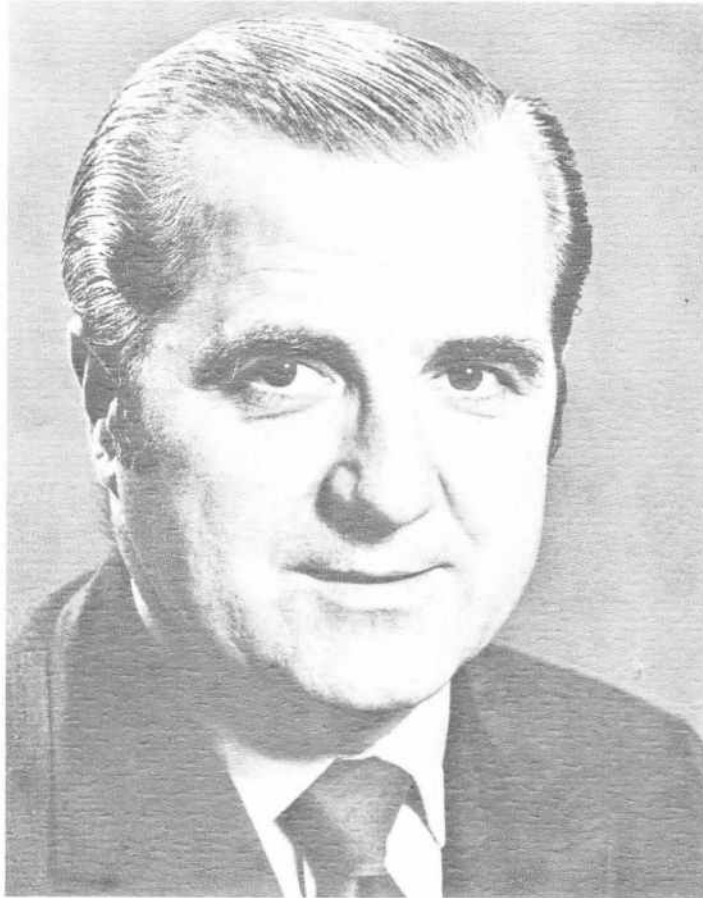
- WHEREAS On Sunday, November 29, 1970, St. Andrew's parish will mark its Fiftieth Anniversary with a Golden Jubilee celebration, and
- WHEREAS Taking part in this momentous occasion will be many of the 1,600 families, most of them of Polish ancestry, who attend St. Andrew's Church, and
- WHEREAS Throughout its history, St. Andrew's has been a leading influence in the near westside community it serves, providing school instruction for children of the parish and athletics programs and Senior Citizens activities, and
- WHEREAS St. Andrew's excellent grade and high schools have a total enrollment of 835 youngsters, including a number of children from Spanish-American families who now live in the parish

St. Andrew's Parish History

Our beloved St. Andrew Parish had its humble beginning in 1920. A committee of ten zealous Catholics residing in the area of McGraw and Chopin on the West Side of Detroit met with a view of organizing a new parish. Approximately 344 signatures of interested supporters of the plan were obtained through the efforts of C. Dombrowski, chairman, 7044 W. Warren; M. Dombkowski, 7538 Burnette; V. Wrona, 7157 W. Warren; W. Jeruzal, 6610 Clifton; L. Staskowski, 7605 Wetherby; L. Jedynak, 7157 W. Warren; W. Pankowski, 6476 Walton; B. Unold, 7810 Prairie; C. Lato-siewicz, 7300 American; W. Wypych, 7526 Prairie.

His Excellency, Bishop Michael J. Gallagher approved the petition, and on October 15, 1920, assigned Rev. Maximillian Gannas, then pastor of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish, Wyandotte, to organize the new parish.

On Thanksgiving Day, November 26, Father Gannas purchased two lots at Tarnow and McGraw and drew plans for a temporary church. The following day the plans were approved by Bishop Gallagher. On November 29, the vigil of the patron, St. Andrew, in whose honor the parish was named, the committee met and accepted bids for the completion of the building. The contract was let and the following morning the ground was broken for the new church — a structure of frame, 90 ft. long and 46 ft. wide, and with a seating capacity of 550.

The completion of this church represented 15½ actual working days, which was an unparalleled record in the establishment of a new parish, even in dynamic Detroit. The building was erected only for temporary use. The people who petitioned for the establishment of the parish had assured Bishop Gallagher that it would be only a question of time when they would erect one of the most beautiful churches and schools in the diocese of Detroit.

Bishop Gallagher blessed the church and midnight Mass was celebrated there on Christmas Eve. Other Masses were celebrated at 8:00 and at 10:30 Christmas morning.

Father Gannas received congratulations not only for the record of a remarkable achievement due to the rapidity with which the work was completed and the church ready for occupancy, but also for having charge of a congregation able to erect so fitting a monument to its zeal and desire to worship within the walls of its own church at Christmas.

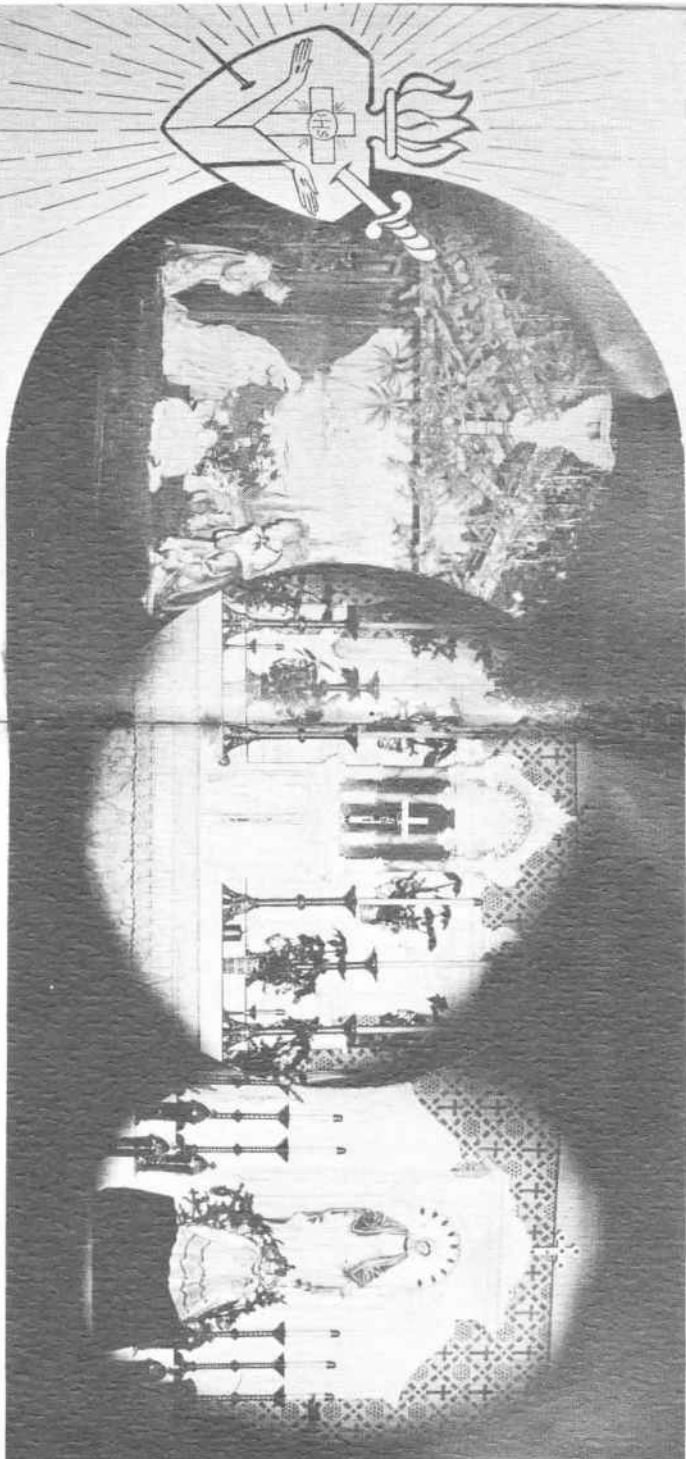
Sunday, February 20, 1921, Bishop Michael J. Gallagher, attended by ten of his clergy from neighborhood parishes, paid an official visit to the parish and blessed the bell which had just been installed. The ceremony was simple, consisting of anointing the bell holy oil after which Father Alexander Grudzinski, pastor of St. Francis Church, preached the sermon. Benediction followed.

On May 9, 1923, Father Stephen Trepczynski, then pastor of St. Michael's in Port Austin, was appointed to succeed Father Gannas. The



DEDICATION OF THE NEW CHURCH AND SCHOOL - SEPT. 14, 1924

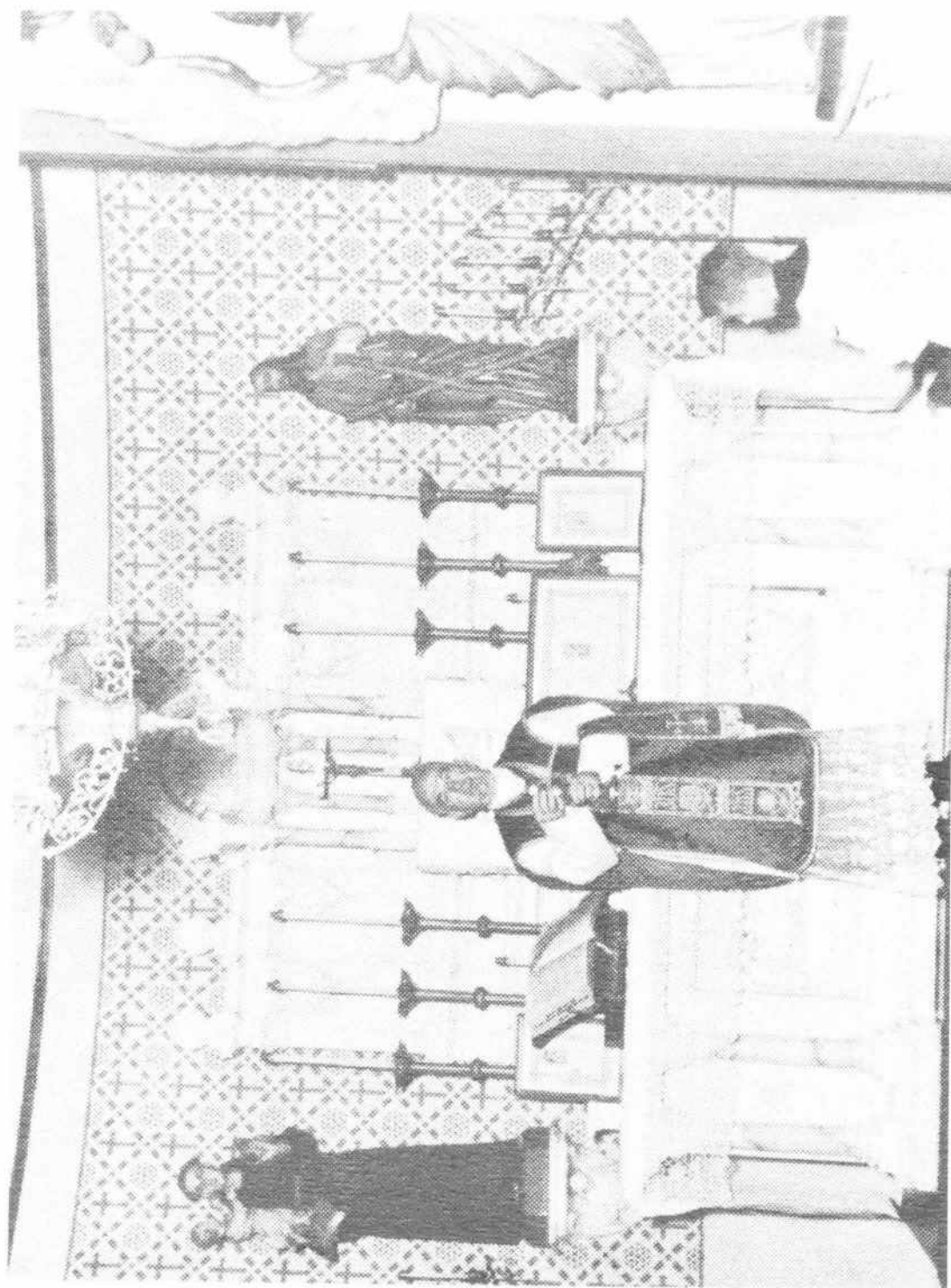

newly appointed pastor was faced with a rapidly increasing number of pupils; therefore, the construction of a new school was a necessity. Twenty-four classrooms served the needs for teaching purposes while the basement was established as a temporary church. Upon completion of the school, the building of the rectory had begun.

The new St. Andrew School was solemnly blessed by Bishop Gallagher on September 19, 1926. Twenty-five priests were present to assist the bishop on that great occasion in the presence of some 5,000 people. Both Bishop Gallagher and Father Joseph Lempka, then pastor of St. Stanislaus Church in Detroit, spoke at the ceremonies.

With the beginning of the school year, 130 new families joined the parish and the enrollment in the school rose to 1,764 pupils. Fourteen Sisters and six lay teachers constituted the faculty. On March 17, the ground breaking for the convent took place and by August 31, 1930, the convent was completed.

The number of pupils gradually decreased so that by 1940, 984 pupils were enrolled in the elementary school when the first class in the high school was organized. Forty-eight students enrolled as freshmen at St. Andrew High School. Four years later, June 11, 1944, the first graduating class of 21 students was a reality. On June 19, 1944, the high school received its accreditation.

The post-war years had an effect on all city parishes and schools and escaping the congestion of crowded city areas, people began to deve-

lop the urban sections in and around Metropolitan Detroit. Though not as seriously affected by these conditions, St. Andrew Parish had indicated some changes.

On October 24, 1945, Father Trepczynski wrote to Archbishop Mooney requesting permission to build a church in the Romanesque style at a cost of approximately \$250,000 with a seating capacity of 1,000. Mr. N. Kostrzanski was suggested as the architect. At that time Father Trepczynski indicated that \$220,000 was on hand toward the building of the new permanent church. The request was promptly approved on October 29. However, due to other difficulties, the plan was not realized.

The pastor requested consent to build a gymnasium on November 30, 1948. Plans for the gymnasium were approved in a letter from the Chancellor, Monsignor Hickey, dated July 7, 1949. Consequently, a beautiful and spacious activities building was erected to serve the educational, social, and athletic needs of the parish.

Permission was requested by Father Trepczynski on June 5, 1951, to install new pews in the old church at a cost of \$14,000; this petition was approved June 4.

Due to continued ill health, Father Trepczynski resigned on January 1, 1954. Father Francis A. Banaszak, then pastor of Resurrection Parish, Detroit, succeeded as the pastor of St. Andrew Parish. Shortly thereafter, the gymnasium was remodeled at a cost of \$12,400.

Final plans for the new permanent church were approved in a letter

of the Vice-Chancellor, Monsignor Bernard Kearns, Secretary of the Building Commission, dated May 18, 1956. The permanent "new" church is one of vast breadth and depth matching the upsweep of the natural roof line. The steeply pitched roof forms its own spire, lifting the eye upward to create an atmosphere of worship. There is no "fussiness" for the entire chancel wall is a sheer expanse of eggshell-white stone spattered with gold. Its only ornamentation consists of a modern-style, lifesize crucifix and a canopy of zigzag pattern above the main altar. After the church was completed, the "old basement Church" was converted into ten modern classrooms. The first through sixth grades are located in this area.

On March 15, 1970, Rev. Francis A. Banaszak resigned. In the interim, Father Joseph Sito, the Associate Pastor, served as an Administrator. In June, 1970, Rev. Francis P. Kozlowski, pastor of St. Paschal Parish, Taylor, was appointed as the Pastor of St. Andrew Parish

Registration for the school year of 1970-1971 lists 452 in the elementary school with Sister M. Bernadette as the Principal. There are thirteen classrooms with five religious and eight lay teachers. The high school enrollment totals 384 with Sister M. Marcianne as Principal. There are twelve homerooms with nine religious and eight lay teaching personnel.

There have been fifteen principals at St. Andrew School since the beginning of our Felician Sisters teaching here till the present time. Those who have been entrusted with this assignment are: Sr. M. Honorina, late Sr. M. Maura, late Sr. M. Tarcilia, late Sr. M. Alexandrine, Sr. M. Edmunda, late Sr. M. Fabiola, Sr. M. Bonfilia, Sr. M. Electa, Sr. M. Benedicta,

late Sr. M. Paula, Sr. M. Dominic, Sr. M. Assumpta, Sr. M. Prudence, Sr. M. Marcianne and Sr. M. Bernadette.

Our St. Andrew Parish has the following societies: St. Andrew Society #2388 PNA, St. Vincent de Paul, Sacred Heart, St. Francis - PRCU, Retirees Club, Dads' Club, Ushers' Club, Holy Name, Holy Family, Altar, Rosary, Mothers' Guild, Third Order of St. Francis, Apostleship of Prayer to the Sacred Heart, St. Salomea #1368 ZPRK, Polish Women's Alliance-Group 386, Legion of Mary, Parent-Teachers Guild and St. Andrew's Choir.

The St. Andrew United Parish Society has been replaced by the Parish Council which was formed in 1970. It consists of the Pastor, the Associate Pastor, two religious, and fifteen lay people.

Historia Parafii Św. Andrzeja

Nasza kochana parafia Św. Andrzeja założona została w roku 1920. Komitet składający się z dziesięciu gorliwych Katolików, zamieszkujących w okolicy McGraw i Chopin na Zachodniej stronie miasta Detroit zgromadził się, żeby zorganizować nową parafię. Zebrano około 344 podpisów mieszkańców tej okolicy, a to wysiłkiem C. Dombrowskiego, przewodnika, 7044 W. Warren; M. Dombkowskiego, 7538 Burnette; V. Wrona, 7157 W. Warren; W. Jerusala, 6610 Clifton; L. Staskowskiego, 7605 Wetherby; L. Jedynaka, 7157 W. Warren; W. Pankowskiego, 6476 Walton; B. Unolda, 7810 Prairie; C. Latosiewicza, 7300 American; W. Wypycha, 7526 Prairie.

Jego ekscelencja, Biskup Michał J. Gallagher dał aprobatę prośbie tego komitetu, i w dniu 15-go października 1920 r. naznaczył Księdza Maksymiliana Gannasa, proboszczem parafii Matki Boskiej Szkaplerznej w Wyandotte, aby zorganizował tę parafię.

W Dzień Dziękczynienia, dnia 26-go listopada, Ks. Gannas zakupił dwie loty na McGraw i Tarnow i rozpoczął plany na tymczasowy budynek, któryby służył jako kościół. W następnym dniu plany zostały zatwierdzone przez Biskupa Gallaghera. Dnia 29-go listopada, w wigilię Św. Andrzeja zebrał się komitet i przyjął oferowaną cenę na wykończenie budynku, który został pierwszym naszym kościołem, oddając go pod opiekę Św. Andrzeja jako Patrona. Kontrakt został podpisany i w następnym dniu odbyło się poświęcenie gruntu pod budowę nowego kościoła.

Budynek miał rozmiar 90 stóp na długość, a 46 stóp na szerokość, z pomieszczeniem dla 550 ludzi.

Wykończenie tego kościoła trwało tylko 15 i pół dni pracy, która była niezrównana w rekordach założenia nowej parafii w tak krótkim czasie, nawet w tak wielkim mieście jak Detroit. Budynek był tylko wybudowany na tymczasowe użycie. Ci, którzy prosili Biskupa Gallaghera o założenie tej parafii przyrzekli mu, że z czasem wybudują piękny kościół oraz szkołę.

Biskup Gallagher poświęcił kościół i pierwsza Pasterka była odprawiona w Wigilię Bożego Narodzenia. Msze święte były odprawione o godzinie 8:00 i 10:30 rano.

Ksiądz Gannas otrzymał kongratulacje nie tylko za to, że praca przy budowie kościoła była wykonana w krótkim czasie i budynek był gotowy do nabożeństw, ale także dla parafian, którzy z taką gorliwością pragnęli w nim uczcić Boga.

W niedzielę, dnia 20-go lutego 1921 roku Biskup Michał Gallagher i dziesięciu księży z sąsiednich parafii byli obecni na poświęceniu nowego dzwonu. Dzwon ten namaszczoney został olejami świętymi. Z tej okazji Ks. Aleksander Grudziński, proboszcz parafii św. Franciszka wy-

głosił kazanie, po którym nastąpiło Błogosławieństwo Przenajświętszym Sakramentem.

Dnia 9-go maja 1923 r. Ksiądz Szczepan Trepczyński, proboszcz parafii Św. Michała w Port Austin, Michigan został назначony drugim proboszczem parafii Św. Andrzeja na miejsce Księdza Gannasa. Nowy proboszcz, widząc szybki wzrost liczby studentów, zmuszony był do budowy nowego budynku szkolnego. W tym budynku mieściło się dwadzieścia cztery klasy do użytku dla dzieci na lekcje, a w piwnicy wybudowany został tymczasowy kościół. Po ukończeniu budowy szkoły z kościołem, odbyło się rozpoczęcie budowy plebanii.

Nowa szkoła Św. Andrzeja była solennie poświęcona przez Biskupa Gallaghera dnia 19-go września 1926 r. Dwudziestu pięciu księży było obecnych na tej uroczystości oraz 5,000 ludzi. Biskup Gallagher, jak również Ksiądz Józef Lempka, proboszcz parafii Św. Stanisława w Detroit przemawiali podczas tej uroczystości.

Z rozpoczęciem roku szkolnego, 130 nowych rodzin zapisało się do parafii. Rejestracja dzieci do szkoły wzrosła do 1,764. Czternaście Sióstr i sześć świeckich profesorów tworzyło Fakultet. Dnia 17-go marca odbyło się poświęcenie ziemi na klasztor, który był wybudowany i poświęcony dnia 31-go sierpnia 1930 roku.

Liczba studentów powoli zmniejszała się tak, że w roku 1940 tylko 984 dzieci było zarejestrowanych do elementarnej szkoły. W roku 1940 była zorganizowana pierwsza klasa wyższej szkoły. Czterdziestu ośmiu studentów zapisało się do dziewiątego stopnia wyższej szkoły Św. Andrzeja. Cztery lata później, dnia 11-go czerwca 1944 r. odbyła się pierwsza

graduacja, a dnia 19-go czerwca 1944 r. wyższa szkoła otrzymała swą akredytację.

Lata powojenne miały nie tylko wpływ na całe miasto, ale także na parafie i szkoły. Ludność miasta zaczęła się przenosić z ciasnego miasta do miast lub miejscowości poza metropolią Detroit. Choć parafia Św. Andrzeja nie została na skutek tego poważnie dotknięta, jednak nastąpiły zmiany w parafii.

Dnia 24-go października 1945 r. Ksiądz Trepczyński napisał list do Arcybiskupa Mooney, prosząc o pozwolenie na budowę kościoła w stylu Rzymskim, któryby kosztował około \$250,000, a pomieściłby 1,000 wierznych. Nazwisko pana N. Kostrzanowskiego było podane jako architekta. W tym czasie było w kasie \$220,000 na budowę nowego kościoła. Prośba uzyskała aprobatę, lecz z powodu innych trudności, plan ten nigdy nie został zrealizowany.

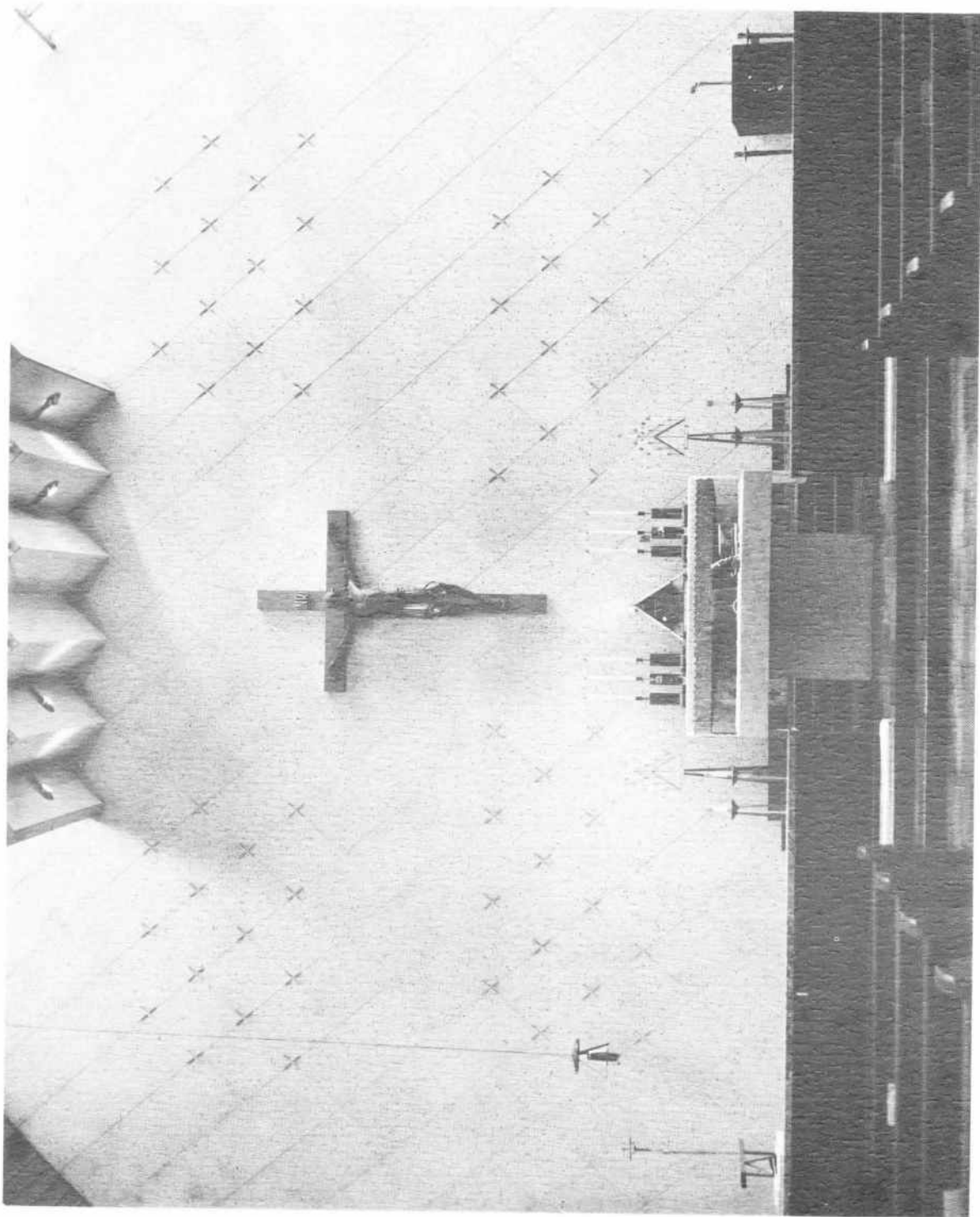
Dnia 30-go listopada 1948 r. Ks. Proboszcz prosił o pozwolenie od Kanclerza, Prałata Hickey na wybudowanie gimnazjum, na którą to prośbę otrzymał pozwolenie dnia 7-go lipca 1949 r. Piękny i obszerny ten budynek był przeznaczony na potrzeby wykształcenia naszej młodzieży, na zabawy towarzyskie i sporty.

Dnia 5-go czerwca 1951 r. Ksiądz Trepczyński otrzymał pozwolenie na zakupienie nowych ławek do kościoła.

Z powodu słabego zdrowia, Ksiądz Trepczyński zrezygnował z probostwa parafii Św. Andrzeja dnia 1-go stycznia 1954 r. Ksiądz Franciszek Banaszak, proboszcz parafii Zmartwychwstania Pańskiego w Detroit został mianowany proboszczem parafii Św. Andrzeja. Krótco po przyjeździe



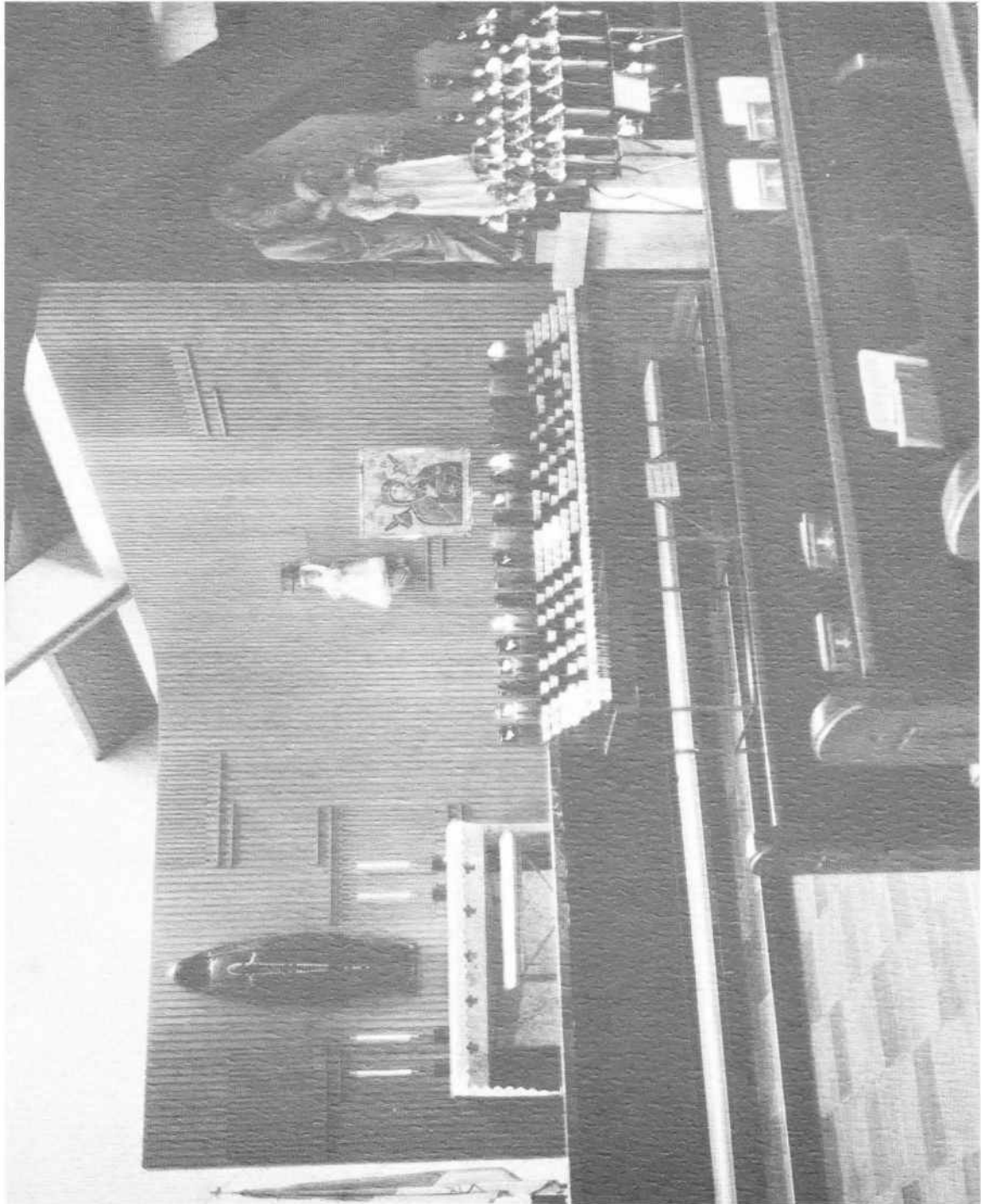
OUR PRESENT CHURCH BEFORE THE NEW ALTARS ARRIVED

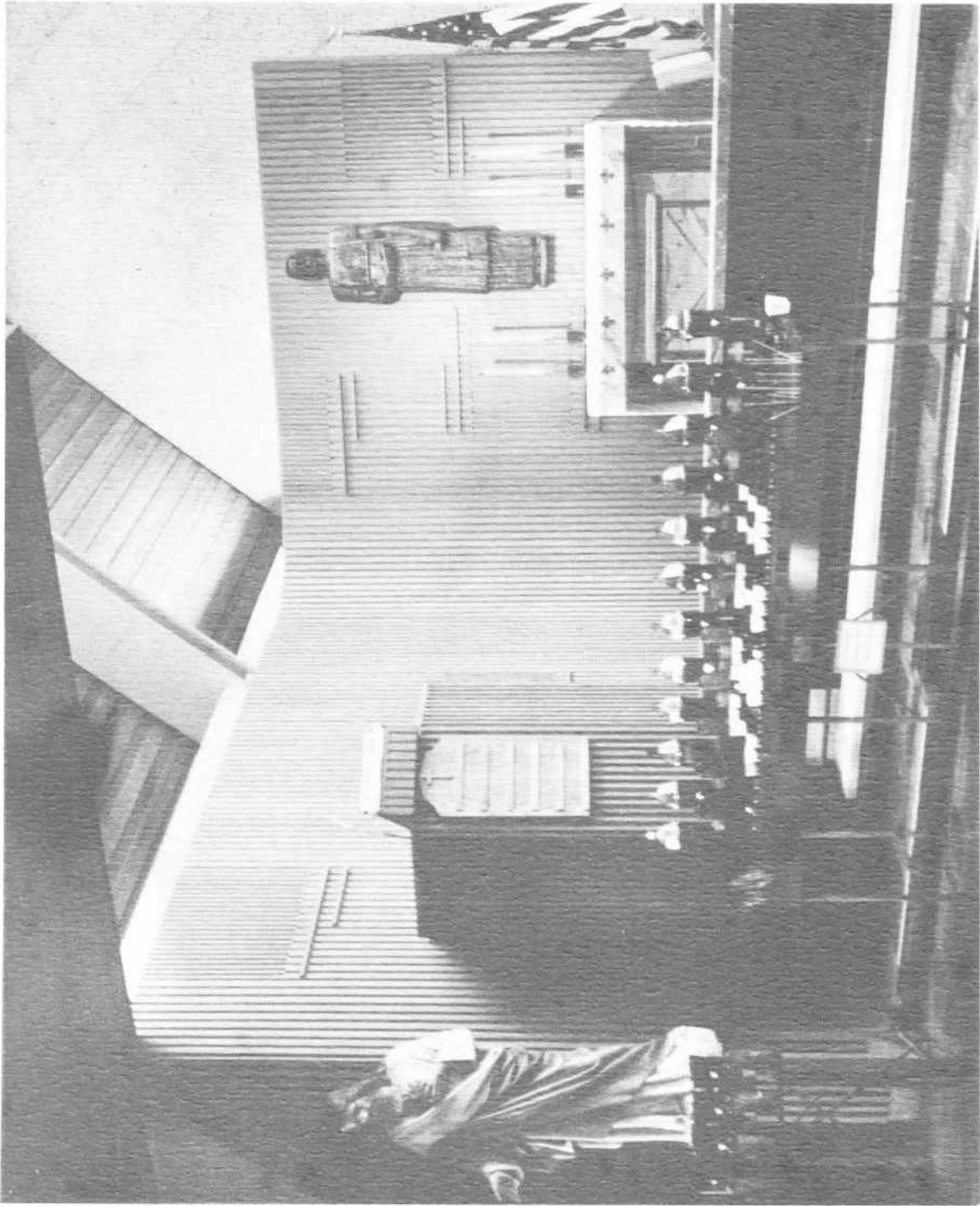

Księżda Banaszka, gimnazjum było odnowione, którego koszt wynosił \$12,400.

Końcowe plany na nowy stały kościół zostały aprobowane przez Wice-Kanclerza, Prałata Bernarda Kearns, Sekretarza Komisji Budowlanej w liście noszącym datę dnia 18-go maja 1956. "Nowy" kościół przemawia wielkością, obejmującą szerokość oraz głębokość, którą dorównywać można do podnoszącego się dachu. Patrząc na styl dachu, wznoszą się oczy i tworzą atmosferę głębokiego uczczenia. Kościół sam w sobie jest prosty; jedyną ornamentacją jest naturalnej wielkości krzyż Pana Jezusa i baldachim powyżej głównego ołtarza. Kiedy nowy kościół został wykończony, stary kościół przerobiono na dziesięć nowoczesnych klas szkolnych. Mieszczą się tu klasy od 1-go do 6-go stopnia.

Dnia 15-go marca 1970 r. Ks. Franciszek Banaszak zrezygnował. Do czasu kiedy został mianowany nowy proboszcz, obowiązki Administratora spełniał Ks. Józef Sito, współuczestniczący proboszcz. W czerwcu 1970 r. Ks. Franciszek Kozłowski, proboszcz parafii św. Paskala w Taylor, Mich. został proboszczem parafii św. Andrzeja.

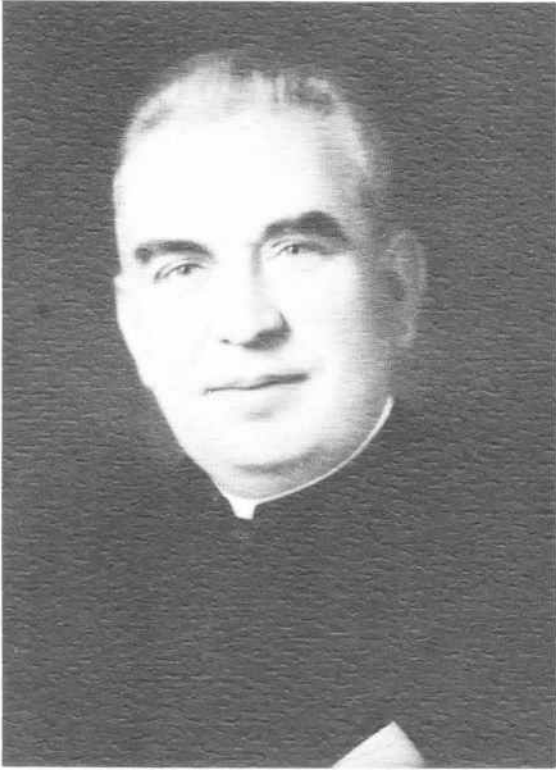
Rejestracja dzieci na rok szkolny 1970-1971 wynosi 452 studentów w elementarnej szkole z Siostrą M. Bernadeta jako Przełożoną. Szkoła elementarna składa się z trzynastu klas, w których uczy pięć Sióstr i osiem świeckich nauczycieli. W wyższej szkole znajduje się 384 studentów z Siostrą M. Marcianną jako Przełożoną. Szkoła wyższa składa się z dwunastu klas, w których uczy 9 Sióstr i 8 świeckich nauczycieli.

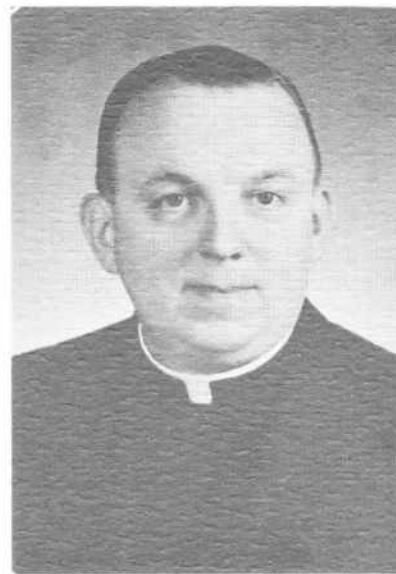

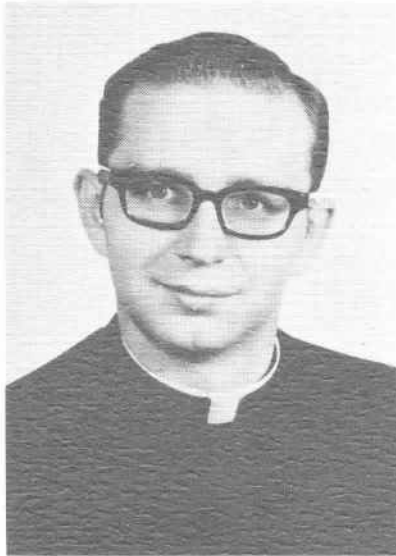

Love Is What Nuns Are Made Of

Love of Christ! Love of humanity! Love of souls! That's what a Catholic nun is made of.

Only such a powerful motivation, in fact, could prompt a young woman to choose such a life. For the life of a nun offers no practical or material rewards commensurate with the sacrifice she makes to be one.

A nun turns her back on the pleasures, vanities and possessions most women want out of life. Instead of having a family and home of her own, she lives in a community with other nuns. Instead of trying "to keep up with Joneses," she dedicates herself to a lifetime of poverty, chastity and obedience.

She makes these sacrifices . . . and devotes years to her education and training . . . so that she may be able to devote the fulness of her mind and heart and talents to the service of God. So that in the pursuit of her own holiness she will bring holiness to the souls she so humbly seeks to serve.

The number of young women who feel a divine call to the life of a religious is relatively small compared with those who choose otherwise. Yet something like a million nuns of the world-wide Catholic Church serve Christ and humanity in religious, charity and education activities that bless the lives of everyone, everywhere.

Equally interesting is the story of how the individual talents of aspiring nuns are fitted into the work of the various sisterhoods, to provide a richly rewarding career for those who choose the religious career.
