

Father Zaorski and dear Friends of St. John Cantius Parish:

In the early months of the dawning of the 20th century, St. John Cantius Parish was organized by Father Felix Keiruj, pastor of St. Francis Parish in Detroit, and its first resident pastor was appointed shortly thereafter, with the blessing of the first church in 1902 by Bishop Foley. In the 105 years since then, your parish has continued to build on the tradition and heritage of the past and has lived through times of growth and development, as well as periods of diminishment and loss. Through it all, the proclamation of the Gospel, worship of the Lord in the Holy Eucharist and through the Sacraments, and deeds of Christian service, have continued without pause.

I recall visiting your beautiful Romanesque church which was built and dedicated in the mid-1920s. It is a true gem in terms of its architectural and artistic qualities. Most importantly, it has been a place for the community to gather in times of joy and sorrow, presenting their needs to God, even as they praised and thanked Him for blessings received.

During your long history, you have been served by a relatively small number of pastors, inasmuch as each of them served for a significant period of time—Father John Walczak, your founding pastor, from 1902 to 1941; Father Vincent Anuszkiewicz, your second pastor, from 1941 until 1968. Then, your beloved Father Edwin Szczygiel, who served 34 years from 1968 until his death in 2002. We thank Father Edward Zaorski, who has been the administrator of your community since Father Szczygiel's death and has brought the community into partnership with some of the neighboring parishes of the vicariate in a cluster arrangement.

On this day, as we look to the past and give thanks to God for the 105 years of your parish history, it is also important to remember the parish school, which was a significant part of the parish history right from its very beginning in 1902. At one point, in the 1930s, there were over one thousand students in the school, but sadly, due to demographic changes, the school had to close in June 1969. We give thanks to God for the faithful service of the Felician Sisters of Livonia, who staffed the school for the seven decades of its existence.

As St. John Cantius Parish prepares to close, I want to take the occasion to acknowledge the countless men and women who have been a part of this great story of faith. Even though the parish will no longer exist as such, the memories of St. John Cantius and the service accomplished there will continue to live on through its alumni and former members, and in the ongoing life of the Church of Detroit. As the Book of Ecclesiastes reminds us, "To everything there is a season..." At this time, we thank God for the many beautiful seasons of development, growth, flowering, and now, diminishment. In the providence of God, as one door closes, something new always comes to birth.

As we say farewell to the memories and experiences of St. John Cantius Parish, we give thanks to God for all that has been and, with open minds and hearts, we move forward into a new chapter of life and faith as the Lord calls us to let go and to trust in His love for us and through us.





St. John Cantius

St. John Cantius was born in 1403, in a village the name of which he bears, situated in the Diocese of Cracow, Poland. His childhood was passed in innocence under the care of his virtuous parents. After finishing his studies he became professor in the University of Cracow, a position he occupied several years, endeavoring not only to train his pupils in science, but also to instill into their hearts the sentiments of piety with which he himself animated.

Having been ordained to the priesthood, he distinguished himself by still greater zeal for the glory of God and his own perfection.

The carelessness and indifference of so many Christians were for him a great source of affliction. As a parish priest, he became a true pastor of souls, severe toward himself and indulgent to others showing himself the father of his people and their friend when they were in need. After some years he resumed his duties of professor practicing at the same time, prayer, love for the poor and all Christian virtues.

Consumed by the desire of suffering martydom, he made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem and preached "Jesus Crucified" to the Turks. Four times, he made a journey to Rome on foot. His sleep was short and taken on the floor, his food barely sufficed to keep him alive. By means of fasting and severe dicipline, he preserved his purity intact. During the last thirty years of his life, he abstained entirely from meat. Finally, after distributing to the poor all he had in his house, he died in 1474.





History of St. John Cantius Parish



St. John Cantius Parish was organized in 1900 by the Rev. Felix Keiruj, Pastor of St. Francis Parish in Detroit.

The first resident pastor was Rev. John Walczak. The first combination school and church was erected October 26, 1902 and blessed by Bishop Foley. The cornerstone of the second school and church building was laid on August 28, 1910 by Bishop Kodelka of Cleveland, Ohio and was dedicated on March 14, 1925.

The cornerstone of the present church, a brick structure in Romanesque Style was laid in 1923 and the church was dedicated in 1925.

The church was built by building contractor Joseph Nowakowski. A Mr. Christensen drew up blueprints of the church building. The church was designed by Mr. Steinbach, an architect who originated from Chicago and was from the architectural firm of Worthmann and Steinbach.

Rev. John Walczak, first resident pastor died on May 22, 1941. On July 8, 1941, the good work begun by Rev. Walczak was continued by Rev. Vincent Anuszkiewicz, the second pastor of St. John Cantius Parish. His reign continued until June 1968, at which time he retired from his zealous work. On June 18, 1968 and installed on June 26, 1968 the Rev. Edwin A Szczygiel was appointed as the third pastor. Rev. Szczygiel ministered at the parish for 34 years until the time of his death on February 10, 2002.

Rev. Walczak organized the school in 1902. There were eleven classrooms. In 1903 there were 107 students, in 1930 there were 1,161 students, and in 1950, there were 309 students. Due to the fact that the community was taken over by the city, many families moved to the suburbs and this affected our school status. Due to the lack of students, the school was closed in June 1969. The Feleican Sisters, whose Motherhouse is in Livonia, Michigan, taught at St. John Cantius.


At present, our parish is comprised of approximately 167 families. The St. John Cantius Church that stands today is a culmination of the history of the parish to which its current parishioners can relate.

We have reached another milestone in the history of St. John Cantius Parish. Despite all the changes wrought by the Water Board in our community, inconveniences, heartbreaks caused by the loss of ancestral homes, neighbors, and life-long friends, we have survived.

On February 15, 2002, the Rev. Edward Zaorski was appointed as Temporary Administrator of St. John Cantius Parish. At present, under the leadership and guidance of Rev.Zaorski, we went through the process of "clustering" with All Saints and SS. Andrew and Benedict Parishes in Detroit.
