


TO THE PASTORS AND PRIESTS who, despite occasional moments of despair, successfully shepherded their flock through three-quarters of a century of exciting history.





a Personal Note from the Pastor

Dear friends,

May 23, 1965

Many pleasant thoughts crowd my mind as I sit here and think of the many things I want to say in this letter to you. The right words aren't easy to come by, for mere phrases, of themselves, cannot adequately express the warmth, the thrill, the ecstasy that this moment inspires. After all, a Diamond Jubilee is a once-in-a-lifetime occasion for St. Josaphat's—and for me, as well.

My own happiness belies the fact that I have been here only a few years. Granted that three years out of 75 is not many, but somehow, it feels as if I've been at St. Josaphat's all my life, and St. Josaphat's has been in me all its life. I'm not sure why this is so, but I have a strong hunch it's because of the type of people who make St. Josaphat's their parish. The pioneers of St. Josaphat's back in 1890 must have had the same type of loyalty and devotion that is reflected in the 1965 St. Josaphat parishioners.

Someone once told me that the people of St. Josaphat's were the "smietanka" of the East Side. For a "cream-lover" like me, that's the highest tribute you can pay any group of people. I'll go one step farther; you parishioners are the "smietanka" of the entire Archdiocese of Detroit!

The first 75 years are the hardest, they say. And, after reading through the history of the parish in this booklet, you, too, are bound to agree that they were at St. Josaphat's. After all, what other parish can boast of being built on the battle-field site of "The Battle of Bloody Run"? Or auctioning its old rectory to a blacksmith for \$100? Or seeing its pastor resign and head for the jungles of South America? That's HARD in any language!

Seriously, though, I want to take this opportunity to thank each of you for receiving me so warmly and considerately into your parish. Your willingness to make sacrifices of time and money, your loyalty, your cooperation—all these will be remembered in my heart forever, and, needless to say, in my prayers, too.

At this time, I should also like, in the name of the parish, to thank Achbishop John F. Dearden for taking time out of his busy Sunday schedule to pontificate the Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving this morning. Who will ever forget his words to us three years ago: "The history of St. Josaphat Church has thus far been great, but its future will be even more glorious." I have personally pledged that, God willing, St. Josaphat's will realize that goal.

St. Josaphat: a Memorable History

In the early days of Detroit, a pitched battle was fought between the Indians and the white settlers in a narrow valley near what is now the Canfield-Hasting intersection. Little is known about that skirmish today except that it was unusually vicious and bloody. So bloody, in fact, that the settlers in later years called it "The Battle of Bloody Run," because, as they put it, "blood flowed in the valley like a river."

It was near this battlefield that St. Josaphat Church was built some 75 years ago. But the St. Josaphat story goes back much further than that. Its remarkable history is tied to another remarkable history — the coming of the Polish immigrant, homesick for the land of his birth but hopeful of the future, to the mushrooming city of Detroit.

The St. Josaphat Story properly begins in 1870 when a handful of Poles decided that a Polish-speaking parish was needed to serve their religious needs. And, thus, was born St. Albertus Church, named in honor of that well-known Polish saint who himself died a martyr's death in attempting to unify dissident faction in the church. But it soon became apparent that St. Albertus parish alone could not handle the thousands of Polish families who began to pour into the city. Accordingly, two years later, St. Casimir's parish arose on the west side of town.

The St. Josaphat Story now jumps to 1889. More Poles enter the city. Extremely nationalistic, they form "Little Poland" community groups, mostly on the east side. To take care of the ever-increasing numbers, St. Albertus is rebuilt from the ground up, but to no avail. Even this larger edifice is not big enough to serve the more than 4,000 Polish families now living in Detroit. Apprised of the situation by Bishop John Foley in June of 1889, the Rev. Casimir Rochowski is asked to organize a new parish in the area just this side of the railroad tracks from Dequindre Street. Plans for the third Polish church in Detroit are set into motion.

Father Rochowski's first act is to summon all those parishioners who are interested in building a new parish. Held in the St. Albertus parish hall, the meeting attracts a small but enthusiastic group of churchmen dedicated to the imposing task set before them. Chosen to head the planning committee are Thomas Zoltowski, president, and Stanley Kabacinski, secretary, aided by Julius Kosecki, Thomas Glowny and Joseph Nowakowski, committee members. The first item on the agenda is to find a land site for the fortcoming parish. And here, the committee encounters a stroke of good fortune. It seems that Mr. Zoltowski owns a sizeable acreage of land on Fremont (now Canfield Street) and Hasting Streets. He charitably offers to donate 12 lots on Fremont for the new

edifice. Needless to say, his offer is joyously accepted and the next phase of the operation begins.


John Begrin is named building contractor, and a two-story structure with basement to house a church and school is submitted and accepted. The first floor is designated for a school and living quarters for the teaching sisters, while the second floor becomes the church proper. The basement is structured to contain steam heat furnaces and four classrooms, the latter to double also as meeting rooms for church societies.

As the parish begins to rise from the ground, the Rev. Anthony Leks is named pastor of this new Polish section by Bishop Foley. Because of the absence of a permanent rectory, however, Father Leks is forced to live in a house some distance away on the south side of Canfield near St. Antoine.

Events soon follow with dazzling speed. On October 6, 1889, the cornerstone is blessed; and shortly thereafter, on February 2, 1890, the church itself is blessed. Church records indicate three baptisms the following Sunday: (1) Francis Cymbrowicz, born February 6, son of Julius Cymbrowicz and Ann Krajenka; (2) John Kazmierczak, born January 25, son of Frank Kazmierczak and Maryann Gacka; and (3) Anna Okraj, born February 6, daughter of John Okraj and Teresa Fetczyn.

The first marriage took place on April 29, 1890, between Joseph Tocki and Anna Szulc; the second on May 5, 1890, between John Krajenka and Catherina Rafalska; the third on May 19 between Matthew Szczesniak and Rosalie Szrejber. To aid the church committee, the following churchmen were selected as ushers: Frank Bastuba, Joseph Berchel, Michael Merecki, Frank Karbowski, Stanley Zientarski and John Szramkowski. Among the families living within the St. Josaphat area were: Balowski, Slotowski, Schemanski, Kosmowski, Klepaczyk, Konieczny, Budnik, Szafran, Kosmalski, Utas, Wisniewski, Wesolowski, Kopydlowski, Matuszczak, Domzalski, Domagalski, Bartkowiak, Walkowski, Radlik, Cyrowski, Rejman, Sadowski, Blaszkiewicz, Malinowski, Pasternacki, Witkowski, Polcyn, Hildebrandt, Siudowski, Kulwicki, Lukasiewicz, Mioskowski, Jablonski, Jermolowicz, etc.

The early history of the fledgling parish indicates that its troubles did not end with the building of the church. Indeed, the first two years can be described as "stormy." It is true that St. Albertus Church again came to its aid by donating its old rectory to St. Josaphat's, but Father Leks lived there one year. Tormented by a \$28,000 debt which, in his opinion, was unpayable, Father Leks resigned his pastorship and was replaced by the Rev. Martin

ks. B. Sławinski ks. St. Nierychlewski Mozejewski and an assistant, Rev. Florian Chodniewicz, just out of the seminary. But Father Mozejewski's tenure proved to be even shorter than his predecessor's; he resigned because of ill health several months later and left for Brazil in South America.

For St. Josaphat's, this meant another pastorthis time, a young, energetic, forceful priest, the Rev. John Rzadkowalski, who proved to be the answer for many of the problems besetting the parish. Under his pastorship, the church grew until it numbered over 1,000 families. Various business enterprises sprouted in the neighborhood until it became known to many as the "downtown" of the center city. Among the concerns were Witkowski and Leszczynski, clothing; Myslowiecki, shoes; Melin and Jermoliwicz, furniture; Zoltowski, Zientka and Kulwicki, taverns; Balowski, Kopydlowski and Wolanski, groceries; Pasternacki, drugs; Prusinski, baked goods; Konieczny, tobacco; Kosmowski, shoe repair; and Pesta, blacksmith. Included in the professional ranks were Boleslaus Pasternacki and W. K. Kwiecinski, physicians.

Another type of problem-growing pains-led directly to the building of a new structure and the razing of the old church buildings. Noting the influx of people and businesses in the area after ten years, Father Rzadkowalski came to the conclusion that a larger edifice was necessary. Accordingly, plans were laid for the construction of a new church, rectory, and janitor's home—the latter building to contain a central heating system for all the new additions. To accomplish this purpose, it became necessary to purchase four more lots from Mr. Zoltowski who, after the transaction, offered \$500.00 for the new church. Before actual construction, Father Rzadkowalski sold the old rectory at an auction sale for \$100.00. The purchaser was Mr. Pesta who transferred it to Forest Street along side of his blacksmith shop.

With these preliminaries out of the way, construction began under the direction of Mr. Kessler, architect; Mr. Knot, mason; and the Harcus and Lang Company, carpentry. The Harcus firm also contributed to the construction of the main altar. The side altars (i.e. the altar of the Sacred Heart, Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Francis) were built by the Jermowicz Company, which also was responsible for the new pews. From the old church came the side altar of St. Anthony. In all, the new structures totaled some \$100,000 in cost, half of which was subscribed almost immediately.

That first year, the new parish had only one bell which stood in the wooden belfry between the school and the rectory. Completely dissatisfied with this state of affairs, Father Rzadkowalski, who admired the sound of the bells emanating from a church on Chene and Hale Streets, obtained the serial number on those bells and purchased their equivalent from a Pennsylvania firm. He Christened the new bells Thomas, Matthew and John.

To cover building expenses, the parishioners at their general meeting decided that each family would donate at least \$25.00, and that a standard donation for stained glass windows in the church would be \$100 and \$25 for lower and upper, respectively. Approximately \$50,000 was collected in this fashion, and a like figure was received via a bank mortgage in 1901. During the next six years, the debt was reduced by some \$15,000, leaving the parish still in debt for \$35,000. Furthermore, in 1907, a new home for the sisters was completed.

Faithfully aiding Father Rzadkowalski during his pastorship were assistants Rev. Apollinaire Tyszka, Rev. Sylvester Kolkiewicz, Rev. John Mueller, Rev. Nicholos Wybraniec and Rev. Walter Wiencek, who was officially appointed as a curate. His long and inspirational pastorship was to come to a sudden and unexpected end after 24 years of guiding the parish through its difficult, formative years. His death on June 29, 1939 caused considerable gloom over the parish which had lost not only a grand administrator but also a great Polish patroit who, in several capacities, initiated and carried through many national celebrations and devotions at the parish. History will long remember him and his masterpiece —St. Josaphat Church.

The life of the parish is also the life of church societies. The first was the St. Josaphat Society, followed by the Rosary Society, St. John Baptist Society, St. Anthony Society, St. Peter Skarga Society, Sacred Heart Society, Third Order of Foresters, Y.M.C., Altar Society, Holy Name Society, Alumni of St. Josaphat High School, P.N.A., and Christian Mothers.

After the death of Father Rzadkowalski, Bishop Foley chose the Rev. Joseph Lempka as the new pastor. Perhaps his greatest contribution to the parish was the building of St. Josaphat High School, an institution which served the area with distinction until its closing many years later. His accomplishments were as varied as they were important. During World War I, for example, he was greatly responsible for recruiting soldiers for the Polish Army.

A Polish patriot in every way, Father Lempka encouraged the ladies of the parish to take an active part in collecting funds for Poland and in sewing clothing for the soldiers and the homeless. Oftentimes, he entertained well-known, influential people at the rectory at his own expense, hoping thereby to help the Polish cause in as many ways as possible. His love of Poland did not interfere with his administrative duties at home, for he paid out the parish debt, painted the interior of the church, and constructed an iron fence around the church grounds. During his administration, he was ably assisted by Rev. Stephen Trepczynski, Rev. Bernard Jarzembowski, Rev. Stanley Wasielewski and Rev. Joseph Gorski.

A new face came upon the St. Josaphat scene in 1926 in the person of Rev.Maximillian Gannas

following the transfer of Father Lempka to St. Stanislaus replacing the deceased pastor, Rev. Frank Grzella. Rev. Gannas, then pastor of St. Stanislaus Kostka in Wyandotte, Michigan, lent his experience in soliciting funds to complete the many repairs of parish property that were deemed necessary. A former professor and a lover of music, he devoted much of his time to upgrading the educational standards of the high school. Besides introducing a course in domestic science to the school's curriculum and adding a modern kitchen to accomodate students who did not live in the immediate area, he was instrumental in getting accredidation for the school from the University of Michigan.

Father Gannas, who also reorganized the Holy Name Society, Altar Society, Christian Mothers and Ushers Club, was assisted in order by Rev. Joseph Gorski, Rev. Peter Borkowicz, Rev. Edmund Behrendt and Rev. Sigmund Osmialowski. His pastorship came to an end in the Golden Jubilee year when Edward Cardinal Mooney transferred him to a much larger parish, St. Francis of Assissi. His replacement was one of St. Josaphat High's graduates, Rev. Edmund Lukasiewicz. In all, six members of the parish have been ordained as priests: Rev. Joseph Utas, Rev. Edmund Lukasiewicz, Rev. Aloysius Guzicki, Rev. Edward Wolschon, Rev. Maximillian Kaminiecki and Rev. Francis Szaniawski.

The new era which seemed destined for St. Josaphat's with the advent of one of its own sons never was to materialize, for Father Lukasiewicz died suddenly and unexpectedly shortly after assuming his new post. The parish was administered for several months by another alumnus, Rev. Sigismund Osmialowski, present pastor of St. Cyprian's in Riverview. He, in turn, was succeeded by Rev. Alexander Jarzembowski whose pastorship lasted for some 20 years. It was largely through his personal efforts that the church was redecorated from within, and parish grounds maintained in good order. Due to circumstances beyond his control, he was forced to order the closing of the grade and high schools at the end of the school year in June, 1960. In poor health for many years, the closing of the school he loved so much may well have contributed to his untimely death on September 28, 1959.

Many tears were shed when news of the school closing reached the ears of alumni who cherished fond memories of St. Josaphat High School. Today, many thousands point to the school as their "alma mater," including some ten priests, over 50 sisters in the religious orders, and hundreds of men and women in all walks of life—civic, professional and commercial. Winners of solfball championships in 1937 and 1939, the school nevertheless boasted mostly of its fine basketball teams throughout the '30's. These include: 1934, Michigan Catholic Fourth Division Championship; 1935, Michigan Catholic East Side Second division Championship, and M.H.S.A.A. District Class C Championship; 1936, M.H.S.A.A. District Class D, and M.H.S.A.A. Regional Class D

Championship at Lake Orion; and 1938, Catholic High School League Third Division Championship, and M.H.S.A.A. District Class D Championship at St. Clair Shores.

Following the death of Father Jarzembowski, the parish came under the administration of Rev. Joseph Karasiewicz who, in addition to his post at St. Josaphat, served simultaneously as assistant vice chancellor in the Archdiocese of Detroit. Among his first acts was the demolition of the school building in the summer of 1961 at a cost of \$4,300, and its subsequent redesignation as a parking lot for church goers. Other improvements in church properties followed, including the renovation of the rectory kitchen and the redecoration of the sister's convent which became the parish hall. At the request of the chancery, all St. Josaphat school records were transferred to St. Albertus School to comply with state laws requiring that permanent school records be administered by a school principal.

On January 19, 1962, this energetic and devoted priest was sent by the Archdiocese to St. Casimir Church with instructions to build a new church. He, in turn, was succeeded by the Rev. Francis J. Dolot, then an assistant at St. Hyacinth. Since coming to the parish three years ago, Father Dolot has devoted himself to one primary administrative goal: make the church area as beautiful as possible.

Three major problems had to be tackled before this goal could be realized however. One was to slow the tide of families transferring to other parishes; perhaps the answer lay in a church that was convienent and modern. Another problem was to repair and redecorate the church but at a minimal cost to the parishioners. And, finally, the last problem was the survival of St. Josaphat itself in the face of an ever-sprawling Medical Center which was seeking additional land in the area.

Among the steps taken to insure all the conveniences possible for church goers were: a firm blacktop parking lot complete with a drainage system, three separate gas heating units for church, rectory and parish hall in place of a central heating system which had proved cumbersome in the past, new padded kneelers with firm rubber, and an extrasensitive public address system in the church.

To cut down service costs, many parishioners contributed their time and money in tackling the problem of repair and renovation. The Czerniakowski family donated seven evergreen Colorado Blue Spruce trees to the parish, while through the efforts of Mr. Max Dombinski, several other evergreens were planted around the rectory. In August, 1963, 24 parishioners showed up on two consecutive Saturdays and painted the rectory, janitor's home and parish hall. Parishioners also placed new roofs on the janitor's home and on the parish hall. Mr. Joseph Hebel, an artist, renovated the sanctuary wood to

its original oak wood sheen, and repainted statues tn the church. Tom Balawender and Elaine Nowodworski are presently and for the past two year have been taking care of the church sanctuary and altars; their services are also gratis.

When the question of renovation came up, there was some talk that St. Josaphat might be razed in order to make room for the New Medical Center. The decision of the Archdiocese to give permission to Father Dolot to spend \$24,3000 for sandblasting, tuckpointing and siliconing meant a renaissance for St. Josaphat's. Another \$28,800 was approved for the reroofing of the church building and other work on the steeples.

So much for the past - a past that is rich in

church and human history, for it is a record of hard times, good times, troublesome times, exciting times. What about the future of St. Josaphat? What additional chapters will be added to the St. Josaphat Story? The future looks bright, indeed. Bordered by the Chrysler Expressway, Mack, Woodward and Warren, the St. Josephat area is presently undergoing a changing landscape. A Medical Center, one of the finest in the country, is already a reality. All homes south of the parish have been demolished; those to the north will be demolished within 12 months. In general, the area has been designated a residential zone of new homes. So the future looks bright and exciting.

And so, the St. Josaphat Story continues . . .



Main Altar St. Josaphat Church

Altars and Murals in St. Josaphat Church and Their Symbolism . . .

St. Josaphat R. C. Church being one of the oldest Catholic Churches in Detroit, has had, its interior renovated after nearly forty years. This work has been down in the main, by a Polish artist from Krakow, named Karol Malczyk with the aid of his wife Milada. The spirit of this labor of love is in keeping with the history of this church — the symbol of Polish Catholicity in America. Volunteers departed from this church for the battle fronts of Europe with the blesing of Our Lady of Czestochowa, to fight for freedom of Poland. After that victory the first Polish Consulate was formed. It consisted of members of this parish. The Polish and American Veterans have had their anniversaries celebrated with proper Masses and sermons in this church, which is, indeed, dear to the hearts of all of Polish ancestry.

The main Altar is dedicated to St. Josaphat, Martyr for the unity of the Catholic Church. His purity is symbolized by the white on the Altar. The Gold is symbolic of his spiritual wealth, and the red of the platform carpet denotes the blood of this Martyr. There is a beautiful painting of the Patron Saint, in the center of the Altar which alternates with a magnificent picture of Our Lady of Czestochowa. The other four altars are dedicated as follows: the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Francis of Assisi and St. Anthony.

The murals in the sanctuary symbolize most eloquently the truths and beauty of the Catholic Faith. Upper most, over the main altar, is the Most Blessed Trinity. It is depicted in the acceptance of the Most Precious Sacrifice of the Divine Son by His Eternal Father the Most Holy Spirit." For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son". (John 3:16). The Nativity of Our Lord is the Incarnation of the Son of God. The Last Supper signifies the Testament of Our Lord: "I will not leave you orphans" (John 14:18) "Take and eat: this is my body . . . All of you drink of this: for this is my blood . . ." (Matt. 26:26-28). "Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19-20). "Behold, I am with you all days, even unto the consummation of the world" (Matt. 28:20). Directly above the place where rests the bier of the faithful departed brought for the burial services to this church, is the beautiful picture of the resurrection of Our Lord, adding comfort to mind and heart of the bereaved, through the words of Our Divinne Master: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has life everlasting and I will raise him up on the last day" (John 6:55). Since the picture of Our Lady of Czestochowa is placed in the main altar, it follows that the love of the Poles should be so beautifully symbolized by a large painting on the epistle side. Portrayed here is a figure of a peasant dressed in his Sunday garb, carrying the huge, plain cross of love and sacrifice, followed by a host of pilgrims. On the gospel side we have the picture of the miracle occuring on the river Wisla. At the height of this decisive battle, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared above the battle ground, turning the tide of battle against the Bolsheviks. This was the victory of faith against atheism. This is the cherished hope of the Poles for a final victory through Mary, the Mother of God.

Of the pictures of the four Evangelists, St. John was placed nearest to Christ. His gospel gives the strongest and clearest explanations of the fundamentals of the Divinity of Christ. Since St. Luke wrote so much about the facts concerning Our Blessed Lady's life, it seemed only proper to place him nearest to the picture of Mary, Queen of Poland. Even more so because, according to tradition, the picture of Our Lady of Czestochowa was painted by him. On the arms of the cross, in the center of the church, the evangelists, St. Matthew and St. Mark form the entirety of the Gospels.

On he epistle side in the arm of the cross are St. Barbara, patroness of a happy death and St. Alexander, the pastor's patron Saint.

On the gospel side are the pictures of St. Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr, who shed his blood for the sanctity of christian home life. Also, on that side of the Blessed Virgin Mary Altar, is the mural of St. Bernard, author of many books written in Her honor. This painting was donated by the Very Rev. Dr. Bernard Jarzembowski, also an author of many books in honor of Blessed Virgin Mary and preacher of sermons for the recruiting of soldiers during the first world war.

The picture of Mary, Queen of Poland, includes some of the best known Saints and Blessed of the Polish nation. This is one of the most outstanding murals in S. Josaphat Church.

St. Cecilia has always been and always will be inspiration to the church choir, therefore she was placed above them for further inspiration.

The recent decree declaring St. Joseph - the Patron of the working men - brought forth the realization of the holiness of true and honest labor. The Holy Family, although most royal, did not consider it beneath its dignity to perform works of labor as depicted in this church.

Facing this is a picture representing the great love and concern of Christ for children. "Let the little children come to me, an do not hinder them, for of such is the kingdom of God." (Luke 18:16-17). Our Divine Savior is never too tired to receive all who are humble. "Unless you turn and become like little children, you will not enter into the kingdom of heaven." (Matt. 18:3).

Above each of the confessionals are murals representing contrition, sorrow for sins, penance and perseverance in good unto the end. On the epistle side, at the front, are represented Adam and Eve, cast out from paradise. The promised Messias is the hope of salvation given unto them after due penance for their sin. The confessional on the same side, shows St. Mary Magdalen doing penance for sins of luxury, by wiping the feet of Jesus with her beautiful hair, and thus receiving forgiveness from Christ and becoming one of the greatest saints of God.

The mural over the confession at the rear of the gospel shows the rich father leaving his home and stooping to lift up his kneeling penitent, prodigal son. The Eternal Father is, eagerly awaiting the return of his errant son, even as the good shepherd goes forth to seek his straying sheep. On the gospel side, at front of the church, is the sorrowful picture of Christ leaving the Court Room and St. Peter, mindful of his denial of the Master, weeps over his sins. Even those nearest to Christ have the misfortune of falling into sin, but the grace of God is never wanting for those, who are truly penitent.

These murals are indeed a work of love and sacrifice, not only on the part of the artist, but of all contributors. They become a monumental, most eloquent sermon on the teaching of Our Divine Saviour, Jesus Christ.

"Holy Father, keep in thy name those thou hast given me, that they may be one even as we are." (John 17:11) — "Yet not for these only do I pray, but for those also who through their word are to believe in me, that all may be one, even as thou, Father, in me and I in thee: that they also may be one in us, that the world may believe that thou hast sent me. And the glory that thou hast given me, I gave to them, that they may be one, even as we are one: I in them and thou in me: that they may be perfected in unity, and that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and that thou hast loved them even as thou hast loved me."

(John 17:20-23).



HISTORIA PARAFII ŚW. JÓZEFATA

Naród polski jako rdrzennie katolicki, trzymał się zawsze blisko swego kościoła. To okazało się zwłaszcza na emigracji. Gdzie osiedliła się chociażby mała grupka ludzi, tam zaraz organizowano parafię i budowano kościół, nieraz z wielkim poświęceniem. Tak też było i w Detroit. Już w roku 1870 powstaje pierwsza polska parafia św. Wojciecha. Gdy jej kościół nie mógł pomieścić wszystkich Polakcw zgrupowanych na wschodniej stronie miasta, postanowiono wybudować nowy kościół.

Ks. biskup detroicki Jan Foley polecił ks. Rochowskiemu w r. 1889 zorganizować nową parafię i wybudować kościół. Grunt pod budowę kościoła podarował Tomasz Żółtowski przy ulicach Hastings i Fremont (obecnie Canfield). Do pracy zabrano się natychmiast. Dnia 6 października 1889 roku został poświęcony kamień węgielny, a już 2 lutego 1890 r. poświęcono nowy budynek, którego pierwsze piętro miało służyć za szkołę a drugie przeznaczono na kościół.

Pierwszym proboszczem mianowany został ks. Antoni Leks. Nowy proboszcz po roku zrezygnował z parafii a na jego miejsce został mianowany ks. Martyniusz Możejewski, który po kilku miesiącach pracy również ustąpił spowodu wątłego zdrowia.

W maju 1891 r. proboszczem parafii św. Józefata zostaje ks. Jan Rzadkowolski, który rozbudowuje Józefatowo nie tylko jako placówkę kościelna ale i ostoją narodu polskiego. Po kilku latach parafia liczyła przeszło tysiąc rodzin a w jej obrębie powstawały liczne polskie przedsiębiorstwa i interesy, tak, że Józefatowo nazywano drugim wśródmieściem.

Po dziesięciu latach istnienia parafii kościół ten okazał się za mały, dlatego też postanowiono wybudować nowy kościół, nową plebanię oraz dom dla kościelnego, pod którym miały się mieścić kotły do ogrzewania. Dzięki szlachetnej ofiarności parafian dzieł tych dokonano. W roku 1907 wybudowano dom dla sióstr nauczycielek. Księdzu Rzadkowolskiemu pomagali w pracy parafialnej księża: Apolinary Tyszka, Sylwester Kolkiewicz, Jan Miller, Mikolaj Wybraniec i Władysław Więcek.

Po dwudziestu czterech latach znojnej pracy zmarł proboszcz ks. Jan Rzadkowolski a na jego miejsce został zamianowany ks. Józef Lempke - wielki Polak i patriota. Włodarzył on na Józefatowie w czasie pierwszej wojny światowej. Wiele przyczynił się do rekrutowania armii polskiej, która wlaśnie z tego kościoła wyjeżdżała na front do Francji. Zbierał on fundusze dla Polski a na plebanii gościł wielkich i wpływowych ludzi. Dzielem jego było również wybudowanie i zorganizowanie wyższej szkoły (high school).

W roku 1926 ks. Lempke został przeniesiony do innej parafii, a jego miejsce zajął ks. Maksymilian Gannas. Nowy proboszcz postarał się, aby wyższa szkoła została uznana przez władze stanowe. Uczelnia ta stanęła na wysokim poziomie naukowym, który zachowała aż do końca swego istnienia. Już w tym czasie dało się zauważyć odpływ ludności poza dzielnice miejskie gdy okolice Józefatowa zaczęły się coraz bardziej zaludniać przez nowych przybyszów innej rasy i narodowości. Księdzu proboszczowi Gannasowi pomagali w jego znojnej pracy księdza: Józef Górski, Piotr Borkowicz, Edmunt Berendt i ks. Zygmunt Ośmiałowski.

W roku 1939 parafia św. Józefata obchodziła złoty Jubileusz swego istnienia, w tymże roku ks. Gannas przeniesiony został do parafii św. Franciszka a na jego miejsce proboszczem parafii św. Józefata został jej wychowanek ks. Edmunt Łukasiewicz. Oprócz ks. Łukasiewicza parafia św. Józefata dala Kościołowi następujących kapłanów: Ks. Józefa Utasia, ks. Edwarda Wolschona, ks. Maksymiliana Kamienieckiego i ks. Franciszka Szaniawskiego. Ks. Łukasiewicz zmarł po roku urzędowania a po nim administratorem był Zygmunt Ośmiałowski przez kilka miesięcy. We wrześniu 1940 roku J. E. Ks. Arcybiskup Edward Mooney zamianował proboszczem parafii św. Józefata ks. Aleksandra Jarzembowskiego, który pasterzował na Józefatowie prawie 20 lat. Jego zasługą było wymalowanie kościoła wewnątrz i utrzymanie budynków w należytym porządku. Niestety, tak się okoliczności złożyły, że liczba parafian zmniejszała się coraz bardziej a spowodu braku uczniów szkoły elementornej i wyższej władze kościelne poleciły ks. Jarzembowskiemu szkoły zamknąć. Ciężkie warunki finansowe a przy tym i zamkniecie szkół podziałaly ujemnie na słabe już zdrowie ks. Jarzembowskiego, tak że umarł on dnia 28 września 1959 roku.

Po jego śmierci zarządzał parafią przez dwa lata ks. Józef Karasiewicz, asystent wicekanclerza kurii biskupiej. W czasie swego krótkiego urzędowania usunął stary budynek szkolny, na którym dzisiaj mamy parkowisko. Przerobił i unowocześnił kuchnie plebańską i konwent sióstr, który stał się dzisiejszą parafialną halą. W styczniu 1962 r. ks. Karasiewicz został naznaczony do parafii św. Kazimierza a na jego miejsce obecny ks. Arcybiskup Dearden mianował proboszczem parafii św. Józefata pełnego zapalu i poświęcenia ks. Franciszka Dolota. Ks. Dolot zwrócił uwagę przede wszystkim na piękno domu Bożego i jego otoczenia. Za jego krótkiego urzędowania został odnowiony cały kościół na zewnątrz kosztem 24 tysięcy trzysta dolarów (sandblasting), nowy dach na kościele kosztem \$28,800. W ten sam sposób zostały odnowione wszystkie budynki kościelne: plebania, hala parafialna i dom kościelnego. Unowcześniony również został system ogrzewania

kościoła i budynków parafialnych. W trosce o wygodę dla swych kochanych parafian zainstalował nowe gumowe klęczniki jak również wprowadził nowoczesny i trwały system głośnikowy. W pracy tej pomagają ks. Proboszczowi chętni parafianie, którzy nie tylko nie żałują pieniędzy na utrzymanie i ozdobę domu Bożego ale chętnie przychodzą z pomocą fizyczną dla kościola i parafii. Wystarczy wymienić chociażby trzy nazwiska spośród tak wielu, którzy pomagali przy sądzeniu drzew i zakladaniu trawników, przy pokrywaniu dachów, przy malowaniu artysznym przedmiotów i figur kościelnych, jak: Czerniakowski, Max Dembinski i Józef Hebel. Czystością Kościoła i ozdabianiem oltarzy zajmują się bezinteresownie już od przeszło dwuch lat Tom Ba-


lawender i Elaine Nowodworski.
