History

ST. STANISLAUS PARISH

Calumet, Pennsylvania



In the rolling hills of Western Pennsylvania; in the County of Westmoreland; in Mt. Pleasant Township lies the village of Calumet where the parish of St. Stanislaus is located.

The early records of St. Stanislaus show that the parish began to be organized into a congregation under the leadership of Reverend Neil McNellis, then pastor of St. Joseph's Church, Mt. Pleasant, Pa.

For at least four years Mass was offered in a large house in Mammoth, Pennsylvania. The congregation consisted of Poles, Slovaks, Germans, and Irish. Mr. William Kearns was the first person who went to see Reverend McNellis to build a church.

In 1894 a wooden church was constructed with the help of the parishioners. In the following years, the parish was without a permanent pastor, and hence, the church building began collapsing.

With the help of His Excellency, Bishop Phelan of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, Reverend Joseph Wielgus was appointed the first resident pastor in 1898. Father Wielgus was born in 1862 in Poland; educated in Rome; ordained on December 22, 1895 and located immediately in the Diocese of Pittsburgh. The church structure was reinforced. The people rallied support to their new pastor and began furnishing the church with pews, vestments, an organ and other objects needed for liturgical functions.

The present picture of St. Stanislaus in the sanctuary is an oil painting executed by Mr. John Grondalczyk of Krakow, Poland. The picture measures 2-½ cubits in height and 1-½ cubits in width. The picture was purchased for \$150.00 and was imported from Poland.

On the 18th of September 1898, the church was solemnly dedicated under the patronage of St. Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr. With the permission of Bishop Phelan, Reverend J. Rychtarezy, pastor of Visitation Parish, Mt. Pleasant, Pennsylvania performed the liturgical rite of dedication. The homily in the Polish and English languages was delivered by Reverend Cesar Tomaszewski, C. S. SP., pastor of St. Stanislaus Kostka Parish, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. The parish consisted of 300 families at the time of dedication.

A strong and lively faith of the people was demonstrated in the fact that in a short time the parish was able to accumulate several hundred of dollars for household furniture and the liquidation of the parish debt.

December 14, 1900 – Father Wielgus requested permission to buy four acres of ground adjacent to the church for a parish cemetery.

August 29, 1903 – Father Wielgus requested permission to build a school for \$2,000. Classes began on September 1, 1904 in a spacious building. The staff included two lay teachers and Father Wielgus, who taught catechism to 150 children in the Polish and Slovak languages. Mr. Kupkowski, the parish organist, also assisted.

November 5, 1904 – Almighty God calls to His eternal kingdom our beloved and zealous pastor, Father Joseph Wielgus, at the age of 42.

June 3, 1910 – In accordance with notices already sent you, the congregation at Mammoth has been divided and Reverend Father Matejscik has been appointed to organize a parish and build a church for the Slovaks at United, Pennsylvania.

YEAR 1911 – during the administration of Reverend L. Stec the parish school was closed.

September 4, 1912 – writings of Reverend F. Baczewski – “The school, which was carried for a number of years with some profit for the children, would be a pity to discontinue it at this time especially that in the vicinity we have no other school and the children are deprived of learning and religion. There are 96 children in the parish – $\frac{3}{4}$ of whom are not able to read or write in any language up to the age of 15.

After investigating the matter, we are in such shape that St. Stanislaus parish can safely re-open the school and is able to pay the salary of two teachers”.

July 26, 1919 – At the request of Reverend James Wrobel, the diocese grants permission to the Sisters of the Holy Ghost at Donora, Pennsylvania to staff St. Stanislaus school. The school was a two-story wooden structure with a slate roof. The initial enrollment was 90 pupils. During the next six years the enrollment increased to 165 pupils.

June 19, 1925 – the school was discontinued because the slacking work in this mining district induced people to abandon their homes. At the time of the closing of the school, there were 130 pupils enrolled in eight grades. For a number of years the Sisters continued to teach Confraternity of Christian Doctrine classes every summer. The Sisters traveled from Everson, Pa.

October 1927 – the church steeple is destroyed by a tornado.

March 2, 1940 – Reverend John Misiaszek requested permission to repair the school building as it was damaged severely by a storm. “Where there is no parish school, there is no future for the parish”.

May 2, 1953 – Reverend Misiaszek requested permission to build a two-room school house. The building was used for C. C. D. classes.

YEAR 1962 – the present rectory was built by Reverend Francis Lesniak.

July 17, 1968 – permission is granted to Reverend John Conway to demolish the old parish hall.

August 5, 1973 – although St. Stanislaus Parish does not conduct its own parochial school, the parents and children are still interested in Catholic education. During the past year 12 students attended St. Florian’s School, United, Pa., and 2 students attended St. Pius X School, Mt. Pleasant, Pa. A consolidated Confraternity of Christian Doctrine Program is conducted with St. Florian’s Parish. It is our hope that the number of children will increase, who will continue their education in the parish schools and even attend our diocesan high school, Greensburg Central Catholic, Greensburg, Pa.

Repairs are scheduled to be made in the church. The plans include re-plastering the sanctuary and replacing the interior and exterior doors. The side entrance will be renovated.

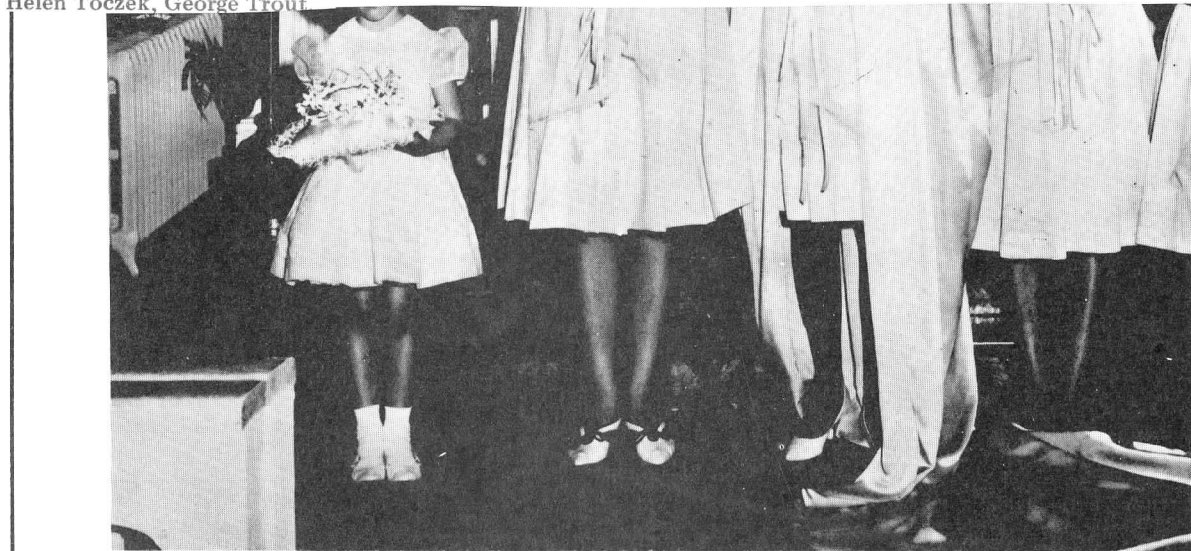
