
Drodzy parafianie i przyjaciele z parafii Św. Szczepana:



Strony książki z tej rocznicy niech nadal ukazują wasze dobre serca, z współpracą która była zaczęta 60 lat temu.







The Blessed Virgin of Czestochowa

The picture of the Blessed Virgin of Czestochowa is attributed by tradition to the brush of St. Luke. Painted on a tableplate of cypress wood, it was supposedly, done at the home of St. John, shortly before our Lady's Assumption.

Safely preserved until the year 326, it was found by St. Helena, Mother of Constantine the Great. St. Helena gave it to her son, who promptly built a church to house the treasured relic. Numerous miracles were attributed to the picture. It was concealed safely through the years by the wife and daughters of Emperor III, passed on to Nicephorus I, given as a gift to Charlemagne, and during war retrieved by Prince Leo. Then, it was taken to Ruthenia in the Royal Palace of Belz, where the clergy of the Greek rite kept a guard of honor over it. Here it remained until the 14th century. People tried to move the picture but it couldn't be moved and in a dream to Prince Ladislaus it was revealed that the picture should be moved to Jasna Gora (Light Mountain) where at once it was conveyed.

Prince Ladislaus entrusted the care of the painting to the Pauline Fathers who came to Poland upon his request. A church and monastery were built on the high hill. Many calamities befell the shrine at Czestochowa but the picture stayed intact. In 1430 Prince Frederick and a band of people tried to move the picture but the wagon would not move. In anger one of the bandits hurled it to the ground, broke it into three pieces leaving only the face of the madonna and child intact. After striking the madonna with his sabre twice and trying the third time was struck dead. The marauders fled in terror.

Before Polish kings went to battle, they first journeyed to the shrine to pray for blessing and help. Czestochowa is a national sanctuary and "the Heart of the Heart of Poland." In 1925 by permission of His Holiness Pope Pius XI the Polish nation crowned the Blessed Virgin of Czestochowa the "Queen of the Crown of Poland." Her feast is observed on the third day of May.

Historia Parafii Św. Szczepana, Męczennika

W roku 1915 skromna garść Polaków w pobliżu ceglarni Clippert Brickyards, powzięła myśl starania się o założenie parafii polskiej. Spragnieni bowiem byli opieki duszpasterskiej w języku ojczystym. Ponadto chcieli zapewnić swym dzieciom wychowanie na tradycjach katolickich i polskich. Po dwóch latach starań i zabiegów udało się im ten upragniony zamiar urzeczywistnić. Biskup Detroicki, Jan S. Foley, pozwolił na otwarcie nowej parafii pod wezwaniem św. Szczepana, Męczennika, i dnia 17 Marca 1917 roku wyznaczył ks. Wilhelma Maruszczyka na pierwszego proboszcza.

W porozumieniu z parafianami ks. Maruszczyk zakupił grunt pod budynki parafialne przy zbiegu ulic Central, 52 i St. Stephen. Naprzód postawił połowę obecnego kościoła i pierwsze piętro szkoły. Budowa pod kierownictwem Władysława Kosińskiego poszła tak szybkim pędem, że już w jesieni tegoż roku dzieci mogły rozpocząć naukę pod dozorem Sióstr Felicjanek. Dwa lata później budowniczy Jan Łukasiewicz nadbudował drugie piętro szkoły aby pomieścić zdwojoną liczbę dzieci.

Zanim wybudowany był kościół, nabożeństwa dla parafian odbywały się w piekarni p. Władysława Wyderko, 4300 Central ulica. Ale gdy już zaledwie sklep kościoła był ukończony, na Wielkanoc w roku 1917, odprawiono w nim pierwszą Mszę św., mimo że nie było jeszcze nad nim dachu. Na nieszczęście deszcz tak ulewny wtedy lał, że parafianie zmuszeni byli słuchać Mszy św. pod parasolami. Potem z uśmiechem mówili, że sam Pan Bóg raczył rzecie poświęcić nowy kościół.

W roku 1920 bogaty fabrykant W. Wolf wystawił na sprzedaż swoją obszerną kamienicę, zwaną "Castle," znajdującą się naprzeciw gruntów parafialnych. Wybudowana była ona między dobranymi drzewami w dobrze utrzymanym ogrodzie. Ks. Maruszczyk zakupił ten dom na plebanię za \$15,000.

Najlepszym oparciem dla parafii są silne organizacje parafialne. Więc do istniejącego Tow. św. Szczepana Gr. 1650 Z.N.P. ks. Maruszczyk zorganizował Bractwo Różańca św., Bractwo Panien, Tow. Najsłod. Serca Jezusa Gr. 1017 ZPRK, Tow. św. Anny, Gr. 277 Z.P.W.A., i Tow. Ołtarza pod opieką św. Tereski od Dzieciątka Jezus.

W pierwszych latach parafii ks. Maruszczykowi dopomagali ks. H. J. Kaufmann, kapelan szpitala Najśw. Maryi Panny i ks. Władysław Stasz, były profesor przy Seminarium Polskim w Orchard Lake, Michigan. W roku 1922 ks. biskup Michał Gallagher naznaczył do pomocy pierwszego stałego asystenta, ks. Piotra Walkowiaka, byłego proboszcza parafii św. Floriana w Hamtramck, Michigan. Niestety, po niespełna sześciu latach gorliwej i mozolnej pracy nad rozwojem nowej parafii ks. Maruszczyk pożegnał się z tym światem dnia 22 lutego, 1923 roku. W jego miejsce ks. Biskup Gallagher naznaczył ks. Józefa Wilemskiego. Ten za poradą ks. biskupa i za zgodą parafian dobudował drugą połowę szkoły i kościoła w roku 1924. Rozbudowany kościół miał siedzeń dla 1200 osób, a dokończona szkoła mogła wygodnie pomieścić 1500 dzieci.

Wkrótce po wykończeniu nowej budowy ks. biskup Gallagher założył w sąsiedztwie dwie nowe parafie: św. Wawrzyńca i św. Kungundy. Szkoła teraz okazała się za obszerną dla pozostałych dzieci, więc za porozumieniem parafian ks. Wilemski obrócił proźne sale szkolne na wygodne pomieszczenie dla Sióstr nauczycielek i na miejsce posiedzeń i zabaw dla towarzystw i młodzieży.

Na prośbę wielu parafian ks. Wilemski także zbudował prześliczną kapliczkę ku czci Matki Boskiej Nieustającej Pomocy. Nad ołtarzem umieszczono obraz Matki Boskiej Nieustającej Pomocy, uprzywilejowany wielorakimi odpustami przez Ojca św. Piusa XI. Poświęcenia dokonał ks. biskup Józef Plagens dnia 14 listopada, 1934 roku.

Za staraniem ks. Wilemskiego powołano do życia następujące organizacje: Tow. Strzelców Pułaskiego, oddz. 143; Klub Ministrantów; Tow. św. Józefa Gr. 2859 Z.N.P.; Klub Młodzieńców; Trzeci Zakon św. Franciszka; Tow. św. Stanisława Kostki; dzieci Maryi; Klub Marszałków i Arcybractwo Matki Boskiej Nieustającej Pomocy.

W tej ciężkiej, jednak zbożnej pracy pomagali mu śp. ks. Piotr Walkowiak, śp. ks. Jan Bartkowiak, śp. Ignacy Czapski i śp. ks. Bolesław Parzych. Sterany mozolną pracą dla parafii i po części z braku zdrowia ks. prob. J. Wilemski usunął się z pracy czynnej parafialnej i przeszedł na emeryturę dnia 7 lipca

1938 roku. Tegoż samego dnia ks. Bolesław Milinkiewicz, długoletni profesor przy Seminarium Polskim w Orchard Lake, był mianowany nowym proboszczem przez ks. arcybiskupa Edwarda Mooney. Do pomocy stanęli nowowyswięceni ks. Leonard Makulski i śp. ks. Leon Dempz, który wkrótce pożegnał się z tym światem dnia 9 listopada, 1942 roku. Potem po kolej dopomagali ks. Franciszek Zdrodowski, śp. ks. Edward Bujak, ks. Józef Matlenga, ks. Tadeusz Wypijewski i ks. Karol Sonnenfeld.

Przez następne prawie ćwierć wieku ks. Milinkiewicz okazał się gorliwym i energicznym gospodarzem.

- 1942 przebudował i ulepszył salę parafialną.
- 1943 zamienił system ogrzewania szkoły i kościoła z węgla na olej.
- 1944 postawił nowy płot żelazny naokoło gruntów parafialnych.
- 1945 powiększył garaż parafialny.
- 1946 odmalował całą plebanię.
- 1947 odnowił kościół, szkołę i dom sióstr.
- 1948 zreperował i wyczyścił organy kościelne, oraz zakupił nowe piece do ogrzewania szkoły i kościoła.
- 1949 włożył nową podłogę do kościoła, dobudował nowe biuro do plebanii, a także zakupił grunt i dom stojący przy kościele.
- 1950 dom był przeniesiony, a ziemia wyrównana została na boisko dla dzieci szkolnych.
- 1952 odnowił kościół i salę parafialną. W tym roku także ukazał się pierwszy numer gazetki parafialnej, St. Stephen's Bulletin.
- 1953 zakupił dom i ziemie stające naprzeciw kościoła na przyszłe mieszkanie dla Sióstr nauczycielek za \$30,000.
- 1954 wybrukował oisko parafialne dla wygodniejszego stawiania samochodów i razem rozpoczął budowę domu Sióstr.
- 1955 ukończenie domu Sióstr i rozpoczęcie całoroczne reperacje w szkole i kościele.
- 1960 dał nową podłogę do kościoła, nowe konfesjonały i nowe kolorowe okna.

Ks. Milinkiewicz zmarł 6 marca 1962 roku, a jego miejsce dnia 4 kwietnia tegoż roku zajął ks. Władysław Jasionowicz, którego naznaczył ks. arcybiskup Jan Dearden. Ks. prob. Jasionowicz natychmiast zabrał się energicznie do pracy.

1962 założono nowy dach na plebanii i wewnętrz szkoły przybrał nowy wygląd po odmalowaniu.

1963 Piekarnia Wyderko na rogu ulicy St. John była wykupiona za \$12,500. Po-

siadłość parafii rozszerzyła się od St. Stephen ulicy do St. John.

- 1964 Odmalowano kościół i szkolne korytarze Dom Sióstr także był odmalowany i nowe okna zimowe umieszczone.
 - 1965 Poraz pierwszy odbył się festywal na gruntach parafialnych dla dochodu dodatkowego i na pokrycie pomnażających się wydatków.
 - 1967 Parafia zakupiła nowy samochód dla użytku Sióstr. W maju rozpoczęto budowę nowego kościoła, a w październiku poświęcenie kamienia węgielnego. Tego samego roku parafia obchodziła złoty jubileusz swego istnienia.
 - 1968 Listopada 26-go odbyła się dedykacja nowego kościoła przez Arcybiskupa Jana Dearden.
 - 1969 Tak zwany festywal świąteczny (Christmas festival) poraz pierwszy rozpoczął się na sali parafialnej by opłacić koszta szkolne. Wszystkie klasy i korytarze były odnowione.
 - 1970 Nowo utworzona Rada Parafialna (Parish Council) miała swoje pierwsze posiedzenie.
 - 1971 Plebania na wewnętrz była odmalowana.
 - 1973 Cieknący dach szkolny był zreperowany. Piece (furnaces) ogrzewające kościół i szkołę podjęły poważne reperacje i były zmienione na opalanie gazowe.
- Z powodu ciężkiej operacji i dwóch silnych ataków serca i za poradą lekarza ks. W. Jasionowicz po długiej naradzie musiał ustąpić z probostwa, lecz pozostał na plebanii do pomocy.
- 1974 Października 11-go ks. Józef Sito został ogłoszony jako nowy proboszcz Św. Szczepana. Ceremonialna installacja nowego proboszcza odbyła się 16 listopada przez ks. biskupa Krawczyka. Młody energiczny proboszcz pełen entuzjazmu i nowych ideałów rozpoczął swą pracę przy parafii Św. Szczepana.
 - 1974 Dach cieknący był zreperowany.
 - 1975 W kwietniu szkolne biuro i klinika zostały taflenowane (panelled) i nowe meble do biura zakupione. Sufity zostały obniżone i nowe sufity akustyczne umieszczone.
 - 1975 Tygodniowe Bingo parafialne rozpoczęte. Tego samego roku rozpoczęto się pracę na sali parafialnej. Zbudowano kuchnię, założono ustępy, scenę, a ściany pokryto dywanem dla uśmierzenia hałasu. Pracę tę ukończono we wrześniu i Festywal parafialny, który odbywał się na gruntach parafii odbył się na odnowionej sali.

MACO — Michigan Avenue Community Organization przeniosło swe biuro byznesu do szkoły św. Szczepana. Organizacja ta wynajęła klasy niezajęte. W grudniu ks proboszcz podpisał kontrakt na zaprowadzenie (air conditioner i smoke machine). Prace rozpoczęto w roku 1976.


1976 Dach w domu Sióstr został zreperowany. Pokoje rekreacyjne były odnowione, szafy i krzesła były zakupione. W szkole, dwie nowe szafy były zbudowane dla potrzeby. Pokoje używane do zebrań były odnowione i tablice pokryte. Więcej stołów i stołków zakupiono do użytku na Bingo i także zakupiono nowe meble na plebanii.

1977 Sufity w domu Sióstr odmalowano a ściany pokryto (vinyl) i schody, korytarze i pokoje rekreacyjne pokryte dywanami.

Plebanię na zewnątrz odnowiono (sand blasted).

Sanktuarium pokryte nowym dywanem. Nowa ambona zakupiona i marmurowa ściana włożona aby przyzadobić tabernakulum.

Towarzystwa istniejące w teraźniejszym czasie przy parafii są: Bractwo Różańca Ołtarza, Tow. Św. Anny Gr. 277, Tow. Św. Szczepana Gr. 2859, Towarzystwo Imienia Jezus, Stow. Rodziców i Nauczycieli, Klub Emerytów Oddział 14, Tow. Serca Jezus Gr. 1017, Trzeci Zakon, Klub Marszałków, i Tow. Kręgelników.





St. Stephen, First Martyr

The name Stephen is Greek and signifies "crown". The circumstances of his conversion to Christianity are not known. We are told of St. Stephen in the Acts of the Apostles when, there being numerous converts, the Hellenists murmured against the Hebrews, complaining that their widows were neglected in the daily ministration. The Apostles assembled the faithful and told them that they could not relinquish the duties of preaching and prayer to attend to the care of tables; and recommended them to choose seven men of good character, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, who might superintend that business. The suggestion was approved, and the people chose Stephen, "a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit," along with six others. These seven were presented to the Apostles who praying, imposed

hands upon them, and so ordained these seven the first deacons.

St. Stephen was "full of grace and fortitude and was working great wonders and signs among the people". Many rose up against him, but they were not able to withstand the wisdom and the spirit that spoke. Accused of blasphemy against Moses and against God, he brought before the Sanhedrin and condemned to be cast out of the city and stoned to death. Kneeling down before his murderers he cried out with a loud voice, saying: "Lord, do not lay this sin against them." And when he had said this he fell asleep in the Lord, 34 A.D.

St. Stephen is the patron of our Parish and we celebrate the Feast of St. Stephen on December 26.

HISTORY OF ST. STEPHEN CHURCH

St. Stephen Parish owes its origin to a small group of Poles who settled near the Clippert Brickyards on the west side of Detroit. Determined to assure their children of a Catholic Education and wishing to preserve the traditions of their forefathers, they decided to seek pastoral care in their own native language. However, it was not until March 17, 1917, that Bishop Foley in Detroit gave permission to organize a Polish parish under the patronage of St. Stephen, Proto-Martyr. Fr. Wilhelm Maruszczyk was appointed the first pastor.

After consulting with parishioners, Fr. Maruszczyk purchased property along Central Avenue, St. Stephen, and 52nd Street. Walter Kosinski was hired to construct the front part of the church and the first floor of the school, and by the Fall of that same year the school was ready for occupancy under the care of the Felician Sisters. The number of school children doubled within the next two years, so builder John Lukasiewicz added the second floor of the school to accommodate them.

Prior to the construction of the church, Holy Mass was offered in the Wyderko Bakery at the corner of Central and St. John. As soon as the walls of the new church were up, Fr. Maruszczyk decided to offer Mass in the church on Easter Sunday, 1917. It was a day, long to be remembered by the parishioners, as they heard Mass under open umbrellas in a heavy rainfall. Later they observed, with many a pleasant smile, that God Himself had given the first blessing to their new church.

The rectory located across the street from the church property, was purchased in 1920 from W. Wolf for \$15,000. Surrounded by choice trees, in a well kept garden, it was popularly referred to as the "Castle".



The first parish Mass was offered in this building on March 17, 1917


The first organization within the parish was the St. Stephen Society. Somewhat later Fr. Maruszczyk organized the Rosary Society, Young Ladies Sodality, Sacred Heart Society, St. Anne Society, and Altar Society.

In the early years of the Parish, Fr. Maruszczyk received pastoral help from Rev. H. J. Kaufman, chaplain of St. Mary's Hospital in Detroit, and Rev. Ladislaus Stasz, professor at the Polish Seminary in Orchard Lake, Michigan. In 1922 Bishop M. Gallagher assigned Fr. Peter Walkowiak as the first permanent assistant. Fr. Maruszczyk's dedicated work however, was soon to end, for after barely six years of zealous effort toward the growth of the parish, he died February 22, 1923. The bishop then appointed Fr. Joseph Wilemski as the new pastor.

Under Fr. Wilemski the second half of the church and school were added in 1924. The enlarged Church could now seat 1,200 people and the school could comfortably accommodate 1,500 children. A few years later, two new parishes sprung up in the neighborhood: St. Lawrence and St. Cunegunda. With the departure of many children to the new schools, Fr. Wilemski converted the empty classrooms into comfortable living quarters for the teaching sisters and into social halls for the societies and the parish youth.

Yielding to the earnest pleas of many devoted followers of our Blessed Mother, Fr. Wilemski constructed a beautiful chapel in her honor. A true copy of the portrait of Our Mother of Perpetual Help, privileged with many indulgences by Pope Pius XI, was enshrined above the chapel altar. The chapel itself was dedicated by Bishop Plagens, Auxiliary Bishop of Detroit, on November 14, 1934.

Under Fr. Wilemski's guidance the following societies were organized: Pulaski Legion, Altar Boys, St. Joseph Society, Young Men's Club, Third Order of St. Francis, St. Stanislaus Kostka Society, Children of Mary, Usher's Club, and Society of Our Mother of Perpetual Help.

Assistants to Fr. Wilemski during this time were Fr. Peter Walkowiak (dec.), Fr. John Bartkowiak (dec.), Fr. Ignatius Czapski (dec.), and Fr. George Parzych (dec.). Fr. Wilemski himself retired from active parish work on July 7, 1938. That same day Archbishop Edward Mooney appointed Fr. Boleslaus Milinkiewicz, long-time professor at the Polish Seminary in Orchard Lake, as the new pastor. He was assisted by Fr. Leonard Makulski, Fr. Loe Dempz (dec.), Fr. Francis Zdrodowski, Fr. Edward Bujak (dec.), Fr. Joseph Matlenga, Fr. Thaddeus Wypijewski, and Fr. Charles Sonnenfeld.

Under the zealous and energetic administration of Fr. Milinkiewicz for almost a quarter of a century, many changes occurred at St. Stephen:


- 1942 Parish hall was remodeled and enlarged
- 1943 School and church heating system was converted from coal to oil.
- 1944 New chain link fence was erected around the church property.
- 1945 Parish garage was enlarged.
- 1946 Entire rectory was repainted.
- 1947 Church, school, and sister's living quarters were repainted.
- 1948 Church organ was cleaned, repaired, and adjusted.
New furnace was purchased for the church and school.
- 1949 New floor was laid in church.
New office was added to the rectory facilities.
House and adjacent land to the church were purchased.
- 1950 House was moved and ground leveled for school children's recreation.




St. Stephen Church Bell which called us to worship since 1917

- 1952 School and parish hall were repainted.
St. Stephen Bulletin made its first appearance.
- 1953 House and land facing the church were purchased for \$30,000 as a future site for the permanent Sister's Convent.
- 1954 Entire playground was resurfaced to make a huge parking area for the cars of the parishioners.
- 1955 Remodeling of the Sister's Convent was completed.
Repair work in both the church and school was started.
- 1960 Church was equipped with a new floor, confessionals, and new colored windows.

Fr. Milinkiewicz died March 6, 1962 and was succeeded by Fr. Walter Jasionowicz on April 4, 1962. Fr. Jasionowicz set out to meet the new task as pastor quickly and energetically.

- 1962 Roof was repaired, school was repainted, new blackboards were installed, and new windows replaced the old in the classrooms.
- 1963 Wyderko Bakery was purchased for \$12,500. Church property now extended from St. Stephen to St. John.
- 1964 Church and school hallways were repainted.
Sister's Convent was painted and had new storm windows installed.
- 1965 Parish festival was introduced as an added income to the parish.
- 1967 New car was purchased for the sisters of the parish.
In May groundbreaking for the new church was started.
In October the cornerstone for the church was blessed.
St. Stephen celebrated 50th Year Anniversary.
- 1968 Dedication of the New Church by Archbishop John Dearden took place in November.
- 1969 Pre Christmas Festival was introduced to help defray school cost.
School was repainted.
- 1970 Parish Council held its first meeting.
- 1971 Rectory was repainted.
- 1973 School roof and furnaces had major repair work done.

Due to the major surgery and two serious heart attacks and following the advice of his physician as well as much deliberation on his own part, Father Walter Jasionowicz decided to retire as pastor but to remain at St. Stephen as pastor emeritus. Father Walter Jasionowicz retired in September of 1974.

On October 11, 1974, Father Joseph Sito was announced as the new pastor of St. Stephen parish and assumed his duties as pastor on November 4. He was officially

installed by Bishop Krawczak on November 16, 1974. Young and filled with many new ideas, Father Sito set out to begin the many tasks that lay ahead.

1974 School roof was redone.

1975 In April the office in the school building and the clinic were paneled and new furniture was purchased for the office.

First floor hallway in school had accoustical tile put on the ceiling.

Parish Bingo was started in the lower hall.

In April, remodeling began in the lower hall for kitchenette, bathrooms, and carpeting on the wall.

Stage was built.

Hall was completed in September in time for the festival to be held in the parish hall instead of the outside tent.

MACO moved into the unused part of the front of the school.

In December, air conditioning and smoke machine contract was drawn and signed.

1976 Work began on the air conditioning.

Roof on Sister's sunporch needed to be replaced and new roofing was installed.

Convent recreational rooms were repainted and new furniture was purchased for the rooms. New chest of drawers were purchased in each sister's bedroom. Principal's office and sleeping quarters in the convent were paneled and new furniture purchased for the office.

New cabinets were built in the clinic and reading rooms for storage.

Two meeting rooms were painted in the old section of the school.

Blackboards were papered.

New tables and chairs were purchased to be used for Bingos.

New bedroom furniture, dining room furniture, and chairs were purchased for the rectory.

Marble wall behind the altar of reposition was installed.

In 1977 the following societies are in existence at our parish: Usher Club, Rosary and Altar Society, St. Ann's Society Gr. 277, St. Stephen Society Gr. 2859, Holy Name Society, Parent-Teacher Guild, Senior Citizens' Club Gr. 14, Sacred Heart Society, Third Order and Mixed Bowling League.

bearing.


