



Wielkie Swieto Polonji w Dickson City, Pa.

Między imponującymi zabudowaniami w miesteczku Dickson City, Pennsylvania, wznosi sie majestatycznie ku niebu wieża Kościoła Nawiedzenia Najśw. Marji Panny, jakby ostrzegając wszelkie siły postępowe, że nie pozwoli wykreślić się z istnienia. Ten Dom Boży, ogólnie szanowany w miasteczku Dickson City, Pennsylvania, to skarb Parafji Naw. Najśw. Marji Panny, której twórcza i zaszczytna praca, sięgająca wstecz pięćdziesiąt lat, jest niezatarcie wpisana w dziejach Polonji, jakoteż w księgach wieczności.

Początki tej polskiej parafji, to istotnie historja polskiego ludu, który przybył do Stanów Zjednoczonych szukając pracy i lepszego jutra, osiedlił się w tej okolicy i rozpoczął wielką, chlubną i owocną pracę tak na polu religijnym jak i narodowym.

W roku 1890 małe miasteczko Dickson City, pięknie położone pomiędzy górami, było tylko cichą wioską znaną jako Priceburg. Te śliczne otaczające go góry, szerokie, zielone łany i doliny, zakrywały jego bogatą przemysłową przyszłość, ale były jakby zaproszeniem dla Polaków, którzy przeważnie wychowani na roli, z upodobaniem spoglądali na rozszerzającą się ziemię, w której przewidywali hojne plony. W tym roku, już około 40 rodzin polskich osiedliło się w Priceburgu; tego polskiego ludu rozproszonego w powiecie Lackawanna od Priceburg do Forest City było z górą najwyżej sto rodzin. Robota dla tutejszych mieszkańców była zapewniona przez Hudson Coal Company i zachęciło to więcej ludności do założenia swych gniazdek rodzinnych w tych stronach, między nimi więcej polskich rodzin.

W tej okolicy zorganizowano pierwsze towarzystwo polskie pod nazwą Św. Józefa i w tem towarzystwie zakorzeniło się ziarno, z którego wyrosła dzisiejsza Parafja Naw. Najśw. Marji Panny. Członkowie tego towarzystwa jeździli konno lub chodzili pieszo odwiedzając każdy dom polski od Priceburga do Forest City, zbierając ciężko zapracowany grosz, ażeby mieć fundusz początkowy na budowę własnego kościółka na chwałę Boża, i gdzie mogliby podziękować Stwórcy za Jego łaski i usłyczeć słowo Boże w ojczystym języku i usłyszeć pieśni polskie, które echem leciałyby prosto do nieba, do stóp Przenajświętszej Panienki, a których tak rzewnych i pięknych żaden naród nie posiada. Dotychczas uczęszczali na Mszę Św. do Kościoła Najsł. Serc Jezusa i Marji, w South Scranton, idąc nawet pieszą tych kilka mil ażeby usłyczeć Słowo Boże.

Wola polskiego ludu, dokonać może cudu; nie wahali się, lecz zebrali się i postanowili pobudować świątynię panską, i przy wielkiej gorliwości i zapale przystąpili do zakupna własności przy Carmalt Ulicy od William Throop z Scranton za pietnaście set dolarów. Przy pomocy ś.p. Ks. Gramlewicza, z Nanticoke, otrzymając aprobatę Najprzew. Kś. Biskupa W. O'Hara, ordynarjusza djecezji Scranton, przystąpiono do budowy kościoła, kosztem \$4,000.00. Był to mały, skromny budynek, lecz był odpowiednim na wszystkie katolickie obrządki i wierni cieszyli się z tego, co dokonali. Z początkiem roku 1892, kościół został poświęcony przez Najprzew. Kś. Biskupa O'Hara. Pierwszym proboszczem wyznaczony przez Najprzew. Biskupa O'Hara był Kś. Bronisław Iwanowski. Parafja wzrastała liczebnie i kościół był przebudowany na większy, kosztem około cztery tysięcy dolarów.

W roku 1899 drugim proboszczem Parafji został ś.p. Kś. Józef Dudkiewicz i za nie długi czas wykryła się potrzeba większego kościoła i przystąpiono do dziela; postarano się o plany architektoniczne i podano do oszacowania koszty budowy. Budowanie trwało prawie cały rok kosztem \$48,000.00, a dnia 26-go listopada 1911 odbyło się uroczyste poświęcenie przez Najprzew. Kś. Biskupa Michała Hoban; zaś stary kościołek obrócono w szkołę parafjalną. Lecz Kś. Dudkiewicz uległ na zdrowiu i po przedłużonej chorobie, wskutek czego nastąpił chwilowy zastój w Parafji, pożegnał się z tym światem drugi Ksiądz Proboszcz naszej Parafji w lutym, 1917.

Ordynarjusz djecezjalny naznaczył na trzeciego proboszcza, Kś. Stanisława Szpotańskiego, z Parafji Św. Józefa w Hudson, Pa., miesiąc po zgonie ś.p. Kś. Dudkiewicza. Uważając olbrzymią odpowiedzialność swego naznaczenia, ś.p. Kś. Szpotański, udzielił się w każdym przedsiewzięciu które domagało jego poparcia, i pier-wszym krokiem jego dozorności było odnowić kościół na wewnątrz. Zbierano na tą rzecz fundusz a w roku 1920 odmalowano wnętrze olbrzymiego kościoła kosztem siedmiu tysięcy dolarów. Śliczne obrazy, niezwy-kłych rozmiar, przedstawiają główne zajścia Pana Jezusa i Najśw. Marji, i artystyczne wykonanie tej pracy znajduje podziw u zwiedzających. W tym samym roku, Kś. Szpotański zakupił kawał gruntu licząc 20 akrów na nowy cmentarz. Rok później, rozpoczął budować wspaniałą szkołę elementarna, która do dziś dnia stoi jako jedna z najpiękniejszych budynków parafialnych. Podczas jego probostwa w Dickson City, Kś. Szpotański przewidził konieczność zabezpieczenia własności parafialne od osiadanie kopalne i względem tego, zakupił prawa mineralne. Za wielką pracę położoną parafji naszej, został Kś. Szpotański wyróżniony i w dniu 21-go lutego, 1930, po trzynastu latach pracy, Najprzew. Kś. Biskup O'Reilly, w uznaniu zasług Kś. Proboszcza Szpotańskiego, wyjednał mu u Ojca Świętego, godność Prałata Domowego Jego Świątobliwości.

1-go czerwca, 1941 roku, parafjanie Parafji Naw. Najśw. Marji Panny w Dickson City obchodzili wielką i doniosłą uroczystość, którą niewątpliwie jeszcze po dziś dzień zachowała się żywo w ich pamięci. Była to uroczystość Złotego Jubileuszu istnienia tej twierdzy polskości i wiary praojców naszych, która swe wielkie zadanie godnie w ciągu pół wieku spełniła i nadal je spełnia.

Podobna uroczystość odbyła się w niedzielę, dnia 15-go marca, 1942, będąc to Srebrny Jubileusz proboszczowania Wiel. Kś. Prałata Szpotańskiego w tej parafji.

Po zgonie śp. Ks. Prałata Szpotańskiego, podczas straszliwej Drugiej Wojny Światowej, smutnej i ciężkiej dla prawie każdej rodziny w parafji, Najprzew. Kś. Biskup William J. Hafej zamianował na proboszcza czwartego Wiel. Kś. Franciszka Dominiaka, dnia 20-go marca, 1943, przybyłego tu z West Hazleton. Na stanowisku proboszcza Parafji Naw. Najśw. Marji Panny w Dickson City, nastał on długu parafjalnego w sumie \$176,000.00, lecz Kś. Dominiak odznaczył się jako wielki kapłan, działacz, patrjota, organizator i finansista, i zaledwie trzy lata później, 15-go kwietnia 1946, Kś. Dominiak spłacił dług jaki ciążył na parafji i odbyła się wielka ceremonja spalenia hipoteki.

Następny projekt parafjalny rozpoczęty przez Wiel. Kś. Dominiaka, wybudowanie nowego Klasztoru dla Sióstr Nauczycielek w marcu, 1948, zakończono 20-go lipca 1949; zaś w marcu, 1950, Wiel. Kś. Dominiak rozpoczął pracę przy wybudowaniu nowej plebanji, a skończono budowę 4-go maja 1951. Zalety te, razem z gorliwością o dobro, zarówno duchowne jak i doczesne, swych parafjan, wyrzeżbiły mu w sercach pamięć, którą nie prędko czas zetrze. Pożegnał się z tym światem 1-szego września, 1957.

W październiku, 1957, Najprzew. Kś. Biskup Hannan wyznaczył nam nowego duszpasterza, piątego z rzędu Kś. Proboszcza, w osobie Kś. P. P. Niebrzydowskiego, z Duryea, którego pamiętaliśmy z jego pracy w naszej Parafji jako Wikarjusza od roku 1921 do 1924. Ufając Opatrzności Bożej, oraz swym zdolnościom i długoletniemu już doświadczeniu, zabrał się z wielką energją do nowej pracy, i dobroczynne skutki tego kroku wkrótce się okazały.

Dnia 3-go czerwca, 1960, Parafja nasza drugi raz została wyróżniona gdy Wiel. Kś. Proboszcz Niebrzydowski został wywyższony na godność Prałata Domowego i parafja uroczyście uczciła swojego ukochanego Proboszcza. Była to jedna z najmilszych i najpamiętniejszych chwil w historji parafji, gdyż wszystkie towarzystwa i organizacje łącznie pracowały, ażeby godnie ocenić i uczcić pracę swojego zasłużonego Proboszcza. Przewiel. Kś. Prałat P. P. Niebrzydowski do dziś dnia piastuje te odpowiedzialność, ciesząc się współpracą powierzonych mu parafjan, miłością i szacunkiem - co zasłużył sobie, odkąd przyszedł do tej parafji.

Parafja Naw. Najśw. Marji Panny kończy pięćdziesiąt lat pracy dla Boga i Ojczyzny w nowym budynku kościelnym. Rozpoczynając drugie pół wieku na niwie religijnej w nowym Kościele, Parafja nasza spogląda jasno i ufnie w przyszłość. Przepełniona zapałem, jaki tlił się w sercach jej przodków, wzmocniona na duchu przez przykład i kierownictwo swych duchownych liderów, zachęcana przez powiększające się liczby nowych młodych rodzin, które wstępują w szeregi parafjalne, utrzymana przez bezgraniczną współpracę swoich wiernych - Parafja Naw. Najśw. Marji Panny dopisywać będzie nowe rozdziały do swej już bogatej w czynyn historji; ciągle pracując na Chwałę Bożą przez Matkę Jego Najświetszą.



St. Mary's Visitation Church

1911 - 1961

St. Mary's Visitation Church, majestic in appearance, stands as a symbol of the Faith of the people of Dickson City, and a monument to the pioneers and founders of St. Mary's Parish. How likened can this Church be to the words of the Master when He said, "The Kingdom of Heaven is likened to a mustard seed, the least indeed of all the seeds; but when it is grown up, it is greater than all the herbs, and becomes a tree." (Matthew, 13:31) The beauty and the grandeur of the Church which we see today depends in great part upon the determination of the pioneers - a determination which was founded and based upon their great Faith in God. At the time of the founding of St. Mary's Visitation Parish by Fr. Bruno Gramlewicz, in 1890, there were numbered in the Parish archives, 40 families residing in the territory of Priceburg, later changed to Dickson City. The confines of the Parish extended from the boundary of Scranton to the town of Forest City. Most of the inhabitants were Polish immigrants and their one desire was to build a Church wherein they could give worship and adoration to God. A small and humble Church, costing \$4,000.00, with a seating capacity for 200 people, was constructed on Carmalt Street and occupied the present site of the Rectory Garage. The original Church was built by Fr. Bronislaus Iwanowski in 1892 and while the main body of the Church was used for Church Services, the basement was utilized as a Parish School.

The advent of Fr. Joseph Dudkiewicz in 1899, marked the beginning of the formulation of plans for a new Church. As the immigrants continued to pour into the area, the Church became inadequate and it was the desire of Fr. Dudkiewicz to build a Church, six times as large as the existing Church. The major obstacle was money but this impediment was reduced in great part by a Fraternal Society of St. Joseph. It is related by the pioneers and recorded in the Parish archives that these devoted and energetic men and women walked as far as Forest City to subscribe funds for the new Church.

In 1909, the firm of Hancock, Registered Architects, was engaged and the sketch and specifications of the proposed St. Mary's Visitation Church were submitted to the Parish Committee for approval and acceptance. After much wrangling and substitution of building materials, the specifications were advertised and bids were received for the construction of the new Church. The Construction firm of Sykes submitted the lowest bid and built the present Church for \$47,000.00. The Church was dedicated by the Most Reverend Bishop, Michael Hoban, Bishop of Scranton, on November 26, 1911.

The problems confronting the pastor at that time were not only of a material nature but a spiritual one as well. As the surrounding communities grew in population, there was an increasing demand for local Churches. It was amusing to read in the minutes of one of the Parish meetings, a delegation, representing the parishioners from the Ridge (Eynon), requested that twenty-five cents of the fifty cents which they

were paying in Church Dues be allocated toward the building of a Parish Church in Eynon. Thus it was, that St. Mary's Visitation Church became the mother Church of St. Mary's Czestochowa Church in Eynon, St. Anthony's Church in Throop, St. Michael's Church in Olyphant, Sacred Heart Church in Mayfield and St. Stanislaus Church in Jessup.

With the death of Fr. Dudkiewicz on February 17, 1917, the Ordinary of the Diocese appointed Fr. Stanislaus Szpotanski to the pastorate of St. Mary's Visitation Church. The groundwork had been laid but due to economic pressures, many cheaper avenues of construction were taken. The Parish Debt, at the death of Fr. Dudkiewicz, amounted to \$25,000.00. The roof of the Church, though recently constructed, leaked terribly and threatened the interior of the Church. The original roof was covered with tin and during the pastorate of Fr. Szpotanski, a new slate roof was installed which according to the minutes, at that time, "would last forever." The interior of the Church was then decorated and painted in 1920 at a cost of \$7,000.00. Paintings of the Visitation, the Immaculate Conception, the Assumption, the Resurrection and the Ascension enhanced the beauty of the Church. It is estimated that during the tenure of Fr. Szpotanski, over \$125,000.00 was expended upon the Church.

Even though the Parish was burdened with the establishment of a new Cemetery, the apparent need of a new School was ever evident. Classes were being held in the old Church building which was converted into classrooms. But as the population increased, it was necessary to build a new School. In 1924, construction was begun and the School became a reality in 1925. Since the mining of coal was at its height, during this period, the time had come when the coal under St. Mary's property was to be removed. The farsightedness of Fr. Szpotanski is to be commended when discussions were begun with the Hudson Coal Company to halt the mining of coal under St. Mary's. Agreement was finally attained and St. Mary's purchased the coal under its properties. The venture was a costly one but at the same time a wise one since the Church, the School, the Convent and the Rectory are free from any danger of mine subsidances.

During the pastorate of Fr. Szpotanski, requests were made for a Church at Clemo. A Church was duly erected and a priest from St. Mary's Parish attended this Mission Church every second Sunday. Moreover, the Home for the Aged and the Indigent, located in Blakely, was in need of spiritual care. Through the pastoral zeal of Fr. Szpotanski, a priest from St. Mary's Parish satisfied the spiritual needs of the faithful.

In recognition of his priestly contribution to the Diocese and in recognition of the great strides of St. Mary's Parish, Fr. Szpotanski was elevated to the rank of Papal Chamberlain, on February 21, 1930.

Upon the death of Msgr. Szpotanski on March 10, 1943, the Most Rev. William J. Hafey assigned Rev. Francis X. Dominiak to the pastorate of St. Mary's Visitation Parish. Again the words of the Master are recalled, "A wise man builds his house upon a rock. The rain fell, and the floods came and the winds blew and they beat upon that house and it fell not for it was founded on a rock." (Matthew, 7:26)

The depression of 1929 and the unemployment in the region had left St. Mary's in a dire financial stress. The Parish Debt amounted to \$176,000.00 and it was difficult at that time to meet the payment of the interest let alone to reduce the principal. Immediately after taking charge of the Parish, Fr. Dominiak so enthused the members of the congregation that a new era of spiritual and material expansion was started. Fr. Dominiak realized it was fundamentally essential that his parishioners gain a deep spiritual love for their Church and Our Lord before they could secure the many material things necessary for the adequate expansion of the church properties. Through his superb administrative ability, and the cooperation of all of the members of the Parish, the parish indebtedness was reduced to ashes on April 15, 1946 at a ceremony held in the Parish School.

Immediately thereafter, necessary alterations were made in the Church. New Confessionals were installed, the pews were refinished and tile flooring was installed throughout the aisles. The School interior was painted, linoleum and tile were placed in several classrooms, an intercommunication system was placed throughout the school building and new secretarial type desks were introduced into several Classrooms.

But demands were pressing and the needs were great. The Bernardine Sisters who staff St. Mary's School, and who numbered nineteen at that time, were living in a very small, dormintory type, family building. Living quarters were cramped and the construction of a new Convent was imperative. Through the concerted efforts of the Pastor and his flock, a new home for the Sisters, costing \$135,000.00, became a reality.

If the plight of the Nuns was dire, the condition of the Priest's living quarters was disastrous. The original Rectory, located at 604 Dundaff Street, was removed quiet a distance from the Church. Four Priests were stationed in the Parish and due to the tightness of living accommodations, the administrative office of the Parish was located in the School building. Plans for a new Rectory were designed and the building was occupied on May 4, 1951.

In the meantime, many other items had to be taken care of: Polonia Park was acquired, Stainless steel towers replaced the galvanized tin-covered towers of the Church, two School Buses were inaugurated into the school system, the Sanctuary was enlarged, the interior of the Church was washed and paintings were retouched. A public address system was installed and weatherproof glass was installed throughout the Church. The exterior of the Church was repointed and water proofed. Granite steps replaced the outworn cement steps in the entrances to the Church. A new side exit was installed in the Church. Stained Glass windows were placed in the clearstory. Additional land was purchased and a playground

with parking facilities was installed behind the School. Finally, a new heating plant was installed in the Church.

The death of Fr. Dominiak on September 1, 1957 ended the career of a great priest of God but it did not stint or hinder the progress of St. Mary's Visitation Parish.

Rev. Peter P. Niebrzydowski, Assistant Pastor of St. Mary's Visitation Parish from 1921 to 1924, was appointed Pastor of St. Mary's by the Most Rev. Jerome D. Hannan, Bishop of Scranton, on October 9, 1957, and was elevated to the rank of Domestic Prelate by His Holiness, Pope John XXIII, on June 3, 1960. Msgr. Niebrzydowski paid off the remainder of the Parish Debt of \$22,500.00 and satisfied the arrears of the Diocesan Budget Plan. The School Auditorium was renovated and decorated, new tile placed in the school-corridor and modern kitchen appliances were introduced into the School. The Cemetery was beautified and placed on a perpetual care basis and the white marble Crucifixion Group which centers the Cemetery and overlooks Dickson City, repeats the words of Christ, "I am the Resurrection and the Life." (John 11:25)

With the advent of the Golden Jubilee Year of the Church, plans were formulated to strengthen the structure of the Church and to remodel and renovate the interior of the Church. In preparation for this great work, a new asbestos roof and a stainless steel drainage system were installed. The area walk-way covering the creek at the side of the Church was covered with reinforced concrete. The wooden sanctuary floor was torn out and replaced with reinforced concrete. The boiler room was completely fireproofed and adequate storage rooms were constructed in the basement of the Church. The Sanctuary was enlarged and finally the Church was ready to take on a new appearance. Victor Zucchi & Son, Church Decorators and Artists, were engaged to carry out the work. A new marble Communion Rail was installed. The Main Altar was designed to encompass a marble Altar and Tabernacle. New paintings were introduced. Tile was set throughout the Church. Weldwood and marble wainscoating were placed along the walls. New carpeting in the Sanctuary, new pews, a new design of elevated seating arrangement in the choir loft, a new organ, in brief, the entire Church took on an appearance of newness and beauty becoming to the house of God. The total cost of all this work exceeded \$170,000.00. It is noteworthy, that no special assessments or drives were conducted to accomplish this work. Through the benevolent and ever-guiding Grace of God and the administrative ability of the Pastor, Msgr. Niebrzydowski, the financial status of the Parish is solvent.

History can record the material accomplishments of St. Mary's Visitation Church during the past fifty years and records can show, too, the Sacraments that have been administered in St. Mary's Visitation Church during the past fifty years: 9,639 Baptisms; 2,884 Weddings; 3,649 Burials; 9,784 Confirmations. But while we can rejoice with all the deeds that are known to us, Heaven alone knows of the great consolation, the Grace that has been received through the instrumentality of St. Mary's Visitation Church. God, indeed, has visited His people when, through His Guidance, He placed St. Mary's Visitation Church in Dickson City. Ad multos annos.



Chird Order of St. Francis This Society, composed mostly of the elderly women of the parish, adopt the Rule of St. Francis into their private lives. One of the oldest organizations of St. Mary's Visitation Church, these women, in great part, attend Mass daily. Their life is centered around the Church and their example is an edification to everyone in the parish. Many of the graces that have been showered upon St. Mary's Parish were merited, without doubt, by the prayers and sacrifices of these pious women.




Saint, Hedwig's Society This group of women has banded together to give honor to St. Hedwig. Their spirit of cooperation at the present signifies clearly the great influence these women have had in the past in the progress of St. Mary's Visitation Parish.



Saint Cheresa's Society The Little Flower of Jesus is the patroness of this august body of women. Year after year, their fervor of Faith is exhibited in their Annual Novena in honor of the Little Flower. Their work and their devotion has added much to the progress of St. Mary's Visitation Parish and their cooperation can always be presumed in any parochial affair. Like their Patron Saint, St. Theresa, their labors and their sacrifices, their dedication and their devotion is expressed through their love for their church.



Saint Ann's Society A Society of recent origin, these faithful women banded together in 1943. St. Stanislaus Kostka Society A fraternal order of Men, still this organization is very close to their Parish Church, coming to its aid in the time of need and helping in whatever task assigned. A large organization in the early days of the Church, St. Stanislaus Kostka Society has paid many death benefits and faithfully receive Holy Communion in a group for their deceased members. Many of the pioneers of the Parish belonged to this Organization.




The Blessed Virgin Mary Sodality An Organization that has been in existance from the early days of the Church. Their contributions to the Parish are numberless but among their highlights are the restoration of Polonia Park, the purchase of a New School Bus and a substantial donation to the Church every year. Ghe H. N. S. Observes Holy Name Day The above picture is a segment of the Holy Name Society attending the 8:00 O'Clock Mass and receiving Holy Communion on Holy Name Sunday. On January 8, 1961, the Society was privileged with the presence of His Excellency the Most Reverend Jerome D. Hannan, Bishop of Scranton. The Communion Breakfast which followed the Mass officially opened the Golden Jubilee Year. Besides the customary Sundays for Holy Communion the Holy Name Society attends the annual Mass celebrated in August for deceased members. Then, too, the Society recites the Rosary for deceased members and their immediate families.



Saint. Mary's Ushers A very prominent and popular organization at St. Mary's Visitation Church. Membership is limited and highly sought after. Attired in their formal wear, these men assist at all Sunday Masses, evening devotions and special functions of the parish. While a cell of the Holy Name Society, the Ushers are governed by their own constitution and by-laws. Well-disciplined and thoroughly cooperative, these men donate hours of their time weekly and sometimes daily to parochial work. Their pledge, "To fulfill my duties to My God and our Parishioners in a fervent and cheerful manner. By My conduct and frequent reception of the sacraments, to be a faithful servant of Christ."



St. Mary's Retreat League The Retreat League, organized in 1959, makes an Annual closed Retreat at St. Alphonsus Retreat House in Tobyhanna. The purpose of this organization is to encourage the men of the Parish to spend a weekend of Prayer at St. Alphonsus Retreat House. Comprised mostly of St. Mary's Ushers, the movement is achieving gradual progress and each succeeding year finds new and interested men joining the Retreat Movement. The aim of the League is to occupy the entire Retreat House with St. Mary's Men.



St. Mary's Christian Mothers One of the most active of the women's organizations at St. Mary's Visitation is the Confraternity of Christian Mothers. While their main activity centers around the School, they give heart and soul to matters parochial. Led by their efficient and diligent executive officers, the Classroom, District and Rural Mothers, the Christian Mothers are ever alert and responsive to the needs of the Parish. Their spiritual exercises and Sunday Communions merit many of the Graces that have been showered upon the School and the Parish.





The Eucharistic League These parishioners, organized in 1960 have consecrated themselves in union with the Congregation of the Most Blessed Sacrament to honor the Divine Person of Our Lord Jesus Christ present in the Holy Eucharist, by forming a royal court of adorers and apostles zealous for His glory, and who sanctify themselves through the graces of the Eucharist. They contribute a prominent role in the Forty Hours, Corpus Christi, and Holy Week processions.



St. Mary's Visitation School A very distinguished looking building, facing the triangle of Dundaff and Scott Streets, St. Mary's Visitation School is the pride of the Parish. Built in 1925, but renovated several times and highly maintenanced, the School has surpassed the educational, safety and health standards of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. 


The Junior Choir Girls at St. Mary's

The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, organized at St. Mary's Visitation Parish in 1957, is the official parish Society of the Church for the instruction of those either not in Catholic Schools, or those who have already completed their education. Through this Confraternity, the laity, under the direction of the Bishop, unite with their parish Clergy to bring religious knowledge to those who do not have the means to secure this knowledge.



C. C. D. High School Students

The religious instructions of Catholics attending a secular High School poses a problem national in scope. Its solution, as far as the church is concerned, rests with the Ordinary of each diocese. It is for this reason that the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, canonically erected by the Bishop, is recognized as the best agency operation to provide religious instruction for those Catholics of the parish who are outside a Catholic School.



C. C. D. Elementary School

Children in the elementary grades who do not attend a Catholic School for some grave reason are afforded the opportunity of a Catholic Education through the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine. Lay teachers, skillfully trained, impart the necessary Religious Education to these Children every week during the School Year. School Bus transportation is afforded those children residing a distance from the School.



Boy Scouts At St. Mary's

The code of Scouting and training in Character is imparted to the Boy Scout Troop and Cub Pack at every weekly meeting. Doing their best, toward God and country, these young men assist annually at the Scout Mass and donate their services often to the Parish functions. Monthly swimming parties, weekly hikes and far distanced trips are all a part of their Scouting program.
